# Report on Rajasthan State Biodiversity Board's International Day for Biological Diversity, 2022 Celebration Event.

Rajasthan State Biodiversity Board sponsored and facilitated one state level and eighteen district level events to mark the International Day for Biological Diversity, on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2022. The theme of this year's IDB was "Building a shared future for all life".



For the State Level event, RSBB and Central Sheep and Wool Research Institute, Avikanagar collaboratively oversaw many programs including skits and speeches to convey the essence of the Convention on Biodiversity, 1992 to an audience of over 200 people at CSWRI's campus in Tonk district of Rajasthan. The attendees represented



various sections of the society such as farmers, cattle owners, officials from various

governmental departments and students. The event was inaugurated under the aegis of the Members Secretary of the Board by lighting a lamp and offering prayers to Devi Saraswati.

The presenters talked about the various facets of Biodiversity, its conservation and ensuring fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of its sustainable use. The Biodiversity Act, 2002 and Rajasthan Biodiversity Rules, 2010. The three-tier structure of Biodiversity governance was discussed with a focus on Biodiversity Management Committees and their importance in giving the BD Act a footing on the ground. The urgent need to attend to the severe issue of biodiversity loss due to anthropogenic activities was emphasized along with the provisions of the legislature that enable the community to manage their bioresources prosperously.



## **Performing Arts**

A skit and two musical performances were conducted by various artists. A group of students danced to a song called "मुझे मत काटो (पेड़ का महत्त्व)" to express their concern for other life forms and a local group performed to the tunes of "देख तमाशा लकड़ी का" showcasing the importance of wood, a common bioresource, from one's birth to their eventual coalesce with the environment in various forms such as an infant's cradle, etc.

A skit was performed by a local drama company drawing people's attention to the possibilities of human-wildlife conflicts and maintaining a healthy respect for other organisms' right to enjoy the Earth, as we do while managing such conflicts.
