By the above cited circulars, Administrative Secretaries and Heads of Departments were directed to ensure that replies were filed on behalf of the State within 3 months of the appointment of the Officer Incharge. It was also directed that a register be maintained and the progress of each case be monitored.

Despite this, several cases have come to my notice in the recent past where the Rajasthan High Court has taken adverse note of the failure of the State Government to file such replies despite lapse of several months and even years.

The position with respect to appeals preferred by the State is no better and the High Court has dismissed a large number of cases for non-prosecution.

The court has further taken adverse note of frivolous litigation entered into by the State by filing of unnecessary appeals.

Secretaries and Heads of Departments are required to personally apply their minds to Government litigation and ensure that needless appeals are not filed. If appeals are to be filed, they must be pursuded with due deligence and vigor. Similarly, when the State is respondent, it must be ensured that the replies are filed in time and the case contested. It should also be ensured that cases do not go by default against the State.

I want it amply impressed on all concerned that such lapses in the future would attract dire consequences for all concerned.
