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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Rajasthan Secondary Towns Development Sector Project (RSTDSP), is the fourth phase of investment projects financed by Asian Development Bank (ADB) and implemented by the Rajasthan Urban Drinking Water Sewerage and Infrastructure Corporation Limited-Externally Aided Projects (RUDSICO-EAP), previously known as Rajasthan Urban Infrastructure Development Project (RUIDP). RSTDSP aims to improve water supply sewerage and other infrastructure services in secondary towns of Rajasthan with populations ranging from 20,000-1,15,000 through a sector loan modality. The project is aligned with the following impact(s): (i) improvement in access to potable, affordable, reliable, equitable, and environmentally sustainable drinking water supply in all urban areas of Rajasthan (ii) improvement in health status of urban population, especially the poor and under-privileged through improvements in sewerage systems of subproject towns (iii) enhancement in productivity, livability and prosperity for citizens in Rajasthan cities and towns.

Under RSTDSP, work is in progress in 14 project towns. From the savings under the ongoing project of RSTDSP, the Government of Rajasthan (GoR) has decided to implement Faecal Sludge and Septage Management (FSSM) through the construction of FSTPs in selected 13 towns which do not have a central sewer network. The project is expected to increase operational efficiency, improve service delivery, and positively impact health and quality of life for the residents of project towns in the state. The Government of Rajasthan has also decided to take up implementation of Water Supply, Sewerage, Drainage, Faecal Sludge and Septage Management (FSSM) and other city improvement works including city beautification works through implementation of about 23 subprojects in 16 towns .under the additional financing of \$200 million from Asian Development Bank (ADB). The Department of Economic Affairs (DEA), Government of India has agreed for additional financing of these new projects.

Rajasthan Urban Drinking Water Sewerage and Infrastructure Corporation Limited (RUDSICO) is the Implementing Agency (IA) for the project. The Project Management Unit (PMU) is headed by Project Director. Project Officer –Social at PMU assisted by Safeguard Specialist-Resettlement of Project Management Capacity Building Consultant (PMCBC) to ensure that all subprojects meet safeguard requirements as agreed in the loan covenant and in line with this social safeguards planning frameworks. Project implementation Units (PIUs) headed by Superintending Engineer/Executive Engineer for implementation of the project. One Engineer in each PIUs has been designated as Safety and Safeguard Officer who is responsible for safeguard and health and safety requirements, monitoring and compliance. PIU is assisted by Social Safeguard cum Gender Professional and support staff of Construction Management Supervision Consultant (CMSC) for implementation of resettlement plan and safeguard monitoring and compliance.

This is the 3rd Semi-annual Social Monitoring Report (SSMR) prepared for the Tranche-II towns (Additional Financing) for the period of October 2024 to March 2025. The general objective of this SSMR is to assess and review the progress on safeguards-resettlement measures taken during the reporting period for the subprojects under additional financing.

Draft resettlement plans (RPs) for 15 subprojects¹ and draft Resettlement and Indigenous Peoples Plans (RIPPs) for 03 subproject² were prepared for the proposed 18 subprojects. Additionally, 04 subprojects³, where no involuntary resettlement (IR) impacts were envisaged

during Draft assessment and due diligence reports (DDRs) were prepared as per SPS, 2009. Out of the 04 DDRs, in case of Jaisalmer City Beautification subproject the DDR (was approved by ADB) has been converted to a resettlement plan as involuntary resettlement impacts were identified during detailed measurement survey (DMS)/ final design. After DMS/ final design, 100% census and socio-economic survey of potential affected persons was conducted and the status of the document changed to a resettlement plan. Further, for 01 City Beautification subproject of Nathdwara town is also the part of this additional financing and the detailed project report (DPR) for subproject has been approved, bidding is under process, accordingly draft RP prepared and submitted to ADB for approval on 10.10.2024, comments received addressed and submitted back to ADB for approval on 18.11.2024. All Resettlement Plans (RPs) and Resettlement and Indigenous Peoples Plans (RIPPs) were prepared based on Draft scope and preliminary design, and are being revised/ updated to account for the approved detailed design, detailed measurement survey (DMS) and 100% census/ socioeconomic survey of potentially affected persons (APs) by CMSC and PMCBC during the implementation phase. A Resettlement Framework (RF) has also been prepared to guide RSTDSP on Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impacts during project implementation.

It is confirmed that all subprojects do not cause (i) any significant involuntary resettlement (IR) impacts and/or (ii) negative impact on indigenous people (IP). The construction of the subproject does not require any acquisition of land or cause permanent displacement. The primary nature of identified resettlement impacts are potential temporary loss of income of vendors/hawkers operating in the right of way (RoW) and minor structure loss (access ramp, stair case) of some residential and commercial structures. Based on 100% survey of potential affected persons, a total 3888 people have been identified as potential affected persons (APs) across 22 subprojects (subproject city beautification of Nathdwara town is under bidding process and hence, not considered). Out of the total 3888 affected persons, 3872 are roadside vendors/hawkers, facing temporarily income loss (due to loss of access during pipe laying), 08 are farmers, facing crop loss under Jodhpur storm water drainage subproject and 08 families may be impacted from minor loss of residential and commercial structures under Bharatpur wastewater subproject. Among the total 3888 affected persons, 1602 fall under vulnerable category⁴. As per entitlement matrix, disbursement of compensation against the livelihood losses, shifting assistance, vulnerability assistance, and escalation against delay in payment as defined in resettlement framework (RF) with respect to cut off date shall be made prior to the impact and prior to start of any civil work in the affected areas. The subprojects under Loan 4325-IND has been categorized as B for involuntary resettlement (IR) and for Indigenous Peoples (IP)⁵ in accordance with the ADB's SPS 2009.

Out of 23 subprojects, three subproject towns Mount Abu, Sagwara and Dungarpur are part of scheduled areas as declared by the Government of India. Whilst many Scheduled Tribe (ST) households residing in these three towns, they no longer maintain their cultural traditions and have settled amongst the non-tribal populations. The subprojects are expected to have beneficial impacts on scheduled tribe community in these three towns- 100% of the scheduled tribe community in coverage areas will be provided with water supply, sewerage connections and other infrastructure services. In compliance to the specific action plans, consumer survey has been completed by the project contractors in all the three towns and number of scheduled tribe households in each town has been captured for providing 100% water supply, sewerage and other infrastructure facilities. Under special action plan (SPA), consultations are being conducted with scheduled tribe households in Dungarpur and Sagwara towns. In addition to that detailed information about the project scope and advantages are being disseminated to them through meetings and IEC materials. Community awareness activities under GESI

(gender equality and social inclusion)-action plan is being implemented through CAPP consultant. Gender Action Plan involves- developing IEC materials, providing skill training, formation of groups, linkage with livelihood scheme, women internship program etc. to promote gender equality and women's empowerment and increase women's access to and use of relevant services under the project.

By the end of this reporting period (October 2024 to March 2025), out of 23 subprojects, contracts for 19 subprojects⁶ have been awarded and pipe laying work under wastewater, water supply, and storm water drainage and rejuvenation and conservation of work sites/monuments under city beautification have commenced and progressed considerably. Contracts for 03 City Beautification subprojects⁷ are yet to be awarded till this reporting period. Additionally, Nathdwara City Beautification subproject is also the part of this additional financing and the detailed project report (DPR) for subproject has been approved, bidding is under process, accordingly draft RP prepared and submitted to ADB for approval on 10.10.2024, comments received addressed and submitted back to ADB for approval on 18.11.2024. Till the end of this reporting period (October 2024 to March 2025), the resettlement assistance of ₹ 1,624,020 has been paid to total 172 project affected persons (Jodhpur wastewater - 19 APs), Jodhpur Drainage - 01 AP), Dungarpur water supply and wastewater - 13 APs), Sagwara water supply and wastewater - 10 APs), Nimbahera water supply and wastewater - 24 APs) and Bharatpur wastewater - 84 APs) under the additional financing.

Social safeguard cum gender specialists and support staff are posted at their concerned CMSCs and towns, and are conducting regular meetings/consultations with the potential affected persons. Some impact on common property resources (CPRs) in the working areas were identified under Jodhpur Drainage subproject after DMS and approved design. Updated resettlement plan of Jodhpur Drainage subproject proposes reconstruction of the affected CPRs (Public Drinking Water Post, water trough for animals, small temple and small religious platform-2 numbers, and boundary wall Ashapurna Enclave Colony) and includes budgets for reconstruction of the CPRs. The budget also includes replacement cost of wire fencing likely to be impacted; with prior consultation and agreement of all stakeholders. Under Bhairav Nalla (drain) section between chainage 3.730 - 6.350 impact on one CPR (public drinking water post locally called *Piau*) has been avoided.

Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) has already been established. PIUs with support of Construction Management Supervision Consultant (CMSC) and contractors are entrusted with the responsibility to maintain a proper grievance register and ensure that the grievances received during execution are recorded and resolved within the specified timeframe. Contractor have also procured and shared toll free numbers/ contact number of concerned person for grievance redress with the households/ affected persons through their social outreach team. During this reporting period, minor complaints from the people like damage of existing pipeline, leakages in a new connection, etc. were received and resolved satisfactorily. No complaints/ grievances related to social safeguards or resettlement plan implementation aspects were received during the reporting period. A series of regular meetings, consultations, and discussions are being conducted with the potential affected persons and other stakeholders regarding scope of the project, entitlement options, impacts etc. during resettlement plan preparation and implementation at different stretches. Leaflets with information about the respective subprojects, its benefits, grievance redress mechanism are also being distributed to the households. The main findings of the consultations are: (i) the participants expressed satisfaction and expressed that they were demanding improved water supply and sewerage facilities for years and the subprojects would meet their needs; (ii) they

raised concerns that the trenches for pipelaying should be covered immediately after laying is complete to ensure smooth flow of traffic and pedestrian movement, (iii) proper road restoration should be done immediately. It was appraised that trenches will be covered within the day of excavation and road restoration to the previous condition may take a bit of time. It was also appraised that road restoration is part of the subproject component.

The safeguard specialist- resettlement of PMCBC and social safeguard and gender specialist of both CMSCs have been mobilized, and are monitoring project activities, taking care of overall safeguards-resettlement activities, and coordinating with all stakeholders i.e. PMU, PIUs, Contractor, allied department and community members. Social safeguard and gender specialists and their support staff are regularly visiting subproject towns/ sites in order to investigate possible involuntary resettlement impacts, implementation of resettlement plan and related social safeguards issues including update of specific action plans. Social safeguard specialist of PMCBC, and social safeguard and gender specialist are providing training and other sensitization initiatives to the PIU/CMSC and contractors' engineers/ staff on ADB's safeguard policies and guidelines.

The project is aligned with the following impact(s): (i) improvement in access to potable, affordable, reliable, equitable, and environmentally sustainable drinking water supply in all urban areas of Rajasthan (ii) improvement in health status of urban population, especially the poor and under-privileged through improvements in sewerage systems of subproject towns (iii) improvements in other infrastructure services of some towns. Under RSTDSP, in tranche-I; contracts has been awarded for 14 project towns and works are being executed at a rapid pace. Additionally, from the savings under the ongoing project of Tranche-I under RSTDSP, the Government of Rajasthan (GoR) has decided to implement Faecal Sludge and Septage Management (FSSM) through the construction of FSTPs in selected 13 towns which do not have a central sewer network. The project is expected to increase operational efficiency, improve service delivery, and positively impact health and quality of life for the residents of project towns in the state. The Government of Rajasthan has also decided to take up implementation of Water Supply, Sewerage, Drainage, Faecal Sludge and Septage Management (FSSM) and other heritage conservation and rehabilitation works including other city beautification works by about 23 subprojects in 16 towns under the Tranche-II, additional financing of \$200 million from Asian Development Bank (ADB). The Department of Economic Affairs (DEA), Government of India has agreed for additional financing of these new subprojects.
- 2. Project Components: RSTDSP under Tranche-II (Additional Financing) includes 23 subprojects in 16 project towns⁸. Under the additional financing, there are 05 subproject of Storm Water Drainage, 02 subproject of water supply, 03 subproject of wastewater, 05 subproject for both water supply and wastewater and 08 subproject of Heritage Conservation and City Beautification (Refer to **Table 1 and Figure 1**). The project is financing infrastructural development, in the form of construction and resettlement, related to water supply and wastewater, storm water drainage and heritage conservation and city beautification inclusive of capacity building of existing Municipal bodies. The town-wise detail of awarded 19 subprojects with their concerned town is depicted in **Table 1(A)**. Mostly awarded contract packages are design built operate (DBO) contracts and some are design built (DB) packages (refer Table 1(A).
- 3. **Impact of the Project:** The water supply improvements are expected to benefit all, including the urban poor, by reducing water collection time from other sources, which may be costly or unhygienic; and by minimizing earning losses from wasted working days due to waterborne diseases. The project also aims for wastewater reuse and a city-wide, inclusive sanitation as well as drainage approach to improve sanitation and drainage services for all, including below poverty line households. The city beautification works aim to improve the state of heritage buildings and monuments, and contributing to reduce the unhygienic conditions in the respective towns. This will attract and stimulate other sources of livelihood. Social and community development is an important component of the project, involving and mobilizing community under well-organized proactive public awareness campaigns.

The purpose of the semi-annual social monitoring report (SSMR) is to provide periodic status updates in the implementation of the project to ensure compliance with the approved involuntary resettlement and indigenous peoples planning documents such as resettlement plans (RP)/ Resettlement and Indigenous Peoples Plans (RIPPs) and Due Diligence Reports (DDRs). RSTDSP has the responsibility to oversee the implementation and monitoring of social safeguards issues of each subproject in the project towns. This report covers social safeguard - Resettlement social safeguard monitoring results to comply with the spirit of ADB policy to 'Enhance Stakeholders Trust' and ability to engage with ADB and thereby increase the development impact (of projects) in which disclosure of social safeguard—resettlement monitoring is a prominent aspect. This report covers social monitoring, addressing all the issues related to social safeguards - resettlement, with reference to the progress achieved and

the current status of the reporting period. The PMU is scheduled to provide the monitoring report on social safeguards activities at semi-annual basis. The current Semi-annual Social Monitoring Report (SSMR) is the 3rd SSMR prepared for the Tranche-II towns (Additional Financing) for the period of October 2024 to March 2025, in accordance with the ADB Safeguard Policy (SPS), 2009.

C. Social Safeguard Categorization

5. The construction of the subprojects does not require any acquisition of land or cause permanent displacement. The locations for the permanent sites of the subproject components such as the sewerage treatment plant (STP), sewerage pumping stations (SPS) clear water reservoir (CWR), water treatment plant (WTP), consumer relation management center (CRMC), center control center (CCC) and master control center (MCC) have been carefully identified and proposed in the vacant encumbrance free government land while the pipeline for water supply, water and drainage will be laid within road right of way (RoW). All rejuvenation and conservation works under city beatification will also be executed on government owned land, structures and monuments. The main resettlement impact is the potential reduction in the income/ livelihood of vendors/hawkers operating in the RoW. During pipeline laying, presence of trenches, excavated soil and machinery, may make it difficult for customers to reach the place where vendors/hawkers are operating their petty business. Draft safeguard documents (RPs/RIPPs/DDRs) were prepared and need to be updated and submitted to ADB for additional financing subprojects as per SPS 2009. Till this reporting period, out of 23

subprojects, draft safeguard documents (RP/RIPP/DDR) of 22 subprojects⁹ have been submitted to ADB. Among these, 21 subprojects (incorporating Draft draft, updated draft and 03 documents cleared for bidding), have been approved by ADB. The physical progress along with details of the contractor of the subprojects are provided in **Appendix 1**. Additionally, updated draft RP based on Detailed Measurement Survey (DMS), final design, 100% census/socio-economic survey of one subproject concerning storm water drainage in Bhawani Mandi has also been submitted to ADB. For the Nokha Water Supply and Wastewater Subproject, land for STP 7 MLD has not been finalized by the end of this reporting period. This has also been mentioned in the updated Resettlement Plan of Nokha. Sectional approval obtained from ADB in the 1st week of February 2025. In addition to that, Nathdwara City Beautification subproject's Detail Project Report (DPR) has been approved, and Draft draft Resettlement Plan has been prepared and submitted to ADB. All along, observations also received and compliance of the ADB observations has also been done and submitted to ADB for approval.

- 6. As impacts are not significant, hence the subprojects under Loan 4325-IND has been categorized as 'B' for involuntary resettlement (IR) and 'B'¹⁰ for Indigenous People (IP) in accordance with the ADB's SPS 2009, which applies to this project.
- Impacts on Indigenous Peoples: Out of 23 subprojects, three subproject towns (Mount Abu, Sagwara and Dungarpur) have been declared as a scheduled area by the Government of India. Whilst many Scheduled Tribe (ST) households residing in these three towns; no longer maintain their cultural traditions and have settled amongst the non-tribal populations. No negative impact is expected to the dignity, human rights, livelihood systems, culture, communal assets, and territorial, natural, and cultural resources of indigenous people. The subprojects are expected to have beneficial impacts on scheduled tribe community in these three towns. 100% of the scheduled tribe community in coverage areas will be provided with water supply, sewerage connections and other infrastructure services. In compliance to the action plan, consumer survey has been completed by the project contractors in Sagwara and Dungarpur towns and number of scheduled tribe's households in these towns have been captured for providing 100% water supply, sewerage and other infrastructure facilities. The Mount Abu subproject is under bidding process and have not been awarded during this reporting period. Public consultations are being with scheduled tribe (ST) households and community members in these towns. The project scope and its advantages are being disseminated to them. The project is designed to provide benefit 100% Scheduled Tribe (ST) households in the project coverage area. Additionally, to address any potential safeguards issues and ensure maximum benefits reach the ST families, a specific action plan for the indigenous people has been drawn up for these three subprojects. The work plan covers the following specific activities: (i) a baseline survey will be conducted for identification and inclusion of indigenous peoples households within the project coverage area; (ii) proposed benefits (e.g.) to indigenous peoples households will be shared and monitored; (iii) IEC materials, information sharing, consultations and other activities stated in the CAPPC will be culturally sensitive and appropriate when implemented in the scheduled area; (iv) in case of any indigenous peoples impacts in subproject, the chief of the tribe or a member of the tribal council as traditional arbitrator (to ensure that traditional grievance redress systems are integrated) and an NGO working with indigenous peoples, will be included. GRC will also ensure that grievance redress established is gender inclusive in receiving and facilitating resolution of the Indigenous Peoples (IPs) concerns; (v) consultations with Indigenous

Mount Abu, Sagwara and Dungarpur has been declared as a scheduled area by the Government of India.

Peoples (IPs) households will be conducted in all subproject stages which shall help in identifying any culture-specific requirements and traditions like avoidance of any specific festival days, and/or other activities with cultural significance to the Indigenous Peoples communities during civil work; and any other Indigenous Peoples related issues and concerns that may be of importance to the community. An end-line sample survey will be conducted to document the views of Indigenous Peoples households about subproject benefits. Such survey is in line with subproject internal monitoring.

- 8. **Implementation of Specific Action Plan (SAP)**: The key aspects and progress of the specific action plan implementation in Sagwara and Dungarpur Towns are provided below. Implementation of a specific action plan for Mount Abu subproject is yet to start as the contract is yet to be awarded. The details of the SAP implementation status and Glimpses of Activities for both Sagwara and Dungarpur Towns are provided as **Appendix 2** and **Appendix 3**.
 - Community meetings were conducted with 313 households from Sagwara Town and 329 households in Dungarpur Town;
 - School Level Activities like awareness generation on safe water usage, utilities of water conservation, good hygiene and sanitation practices etc were conducted in Sagwara (24 School activities 1798 Participants) and Dungarpur (36 School Activities 2430 Participants);
 - Information education and communication (IEC) materials on project scope, training facilities, work schedule etc were distributed among scheduled tribe community in both towns:
 - Plumber Training was organized in both towns and in case of (i) Sagwara All 05 trainees belong to ST community and are females; (ii) Dungarpur Out of 6 trainees, 3 belongs to ST community;
 - Masson training was organized in Dungarpur town, All 6 trainees belongs to ST community
 - Two Exposure visit of 75 students organized at Sagwara;
 - Training on computer application was organized at Dungarpur Town and out of total
 17 trainees, 3 were from scheduled tribe community.

D. Status of Preparation/ Updating of RPs/RIPPs/DDRs

9. Under additional financing, safeguard documents (RP/RIPP/DDR) of 21¹¹ subprojects out of 23 have been submitted to ADB and approved. Draft resettlement plans (RPs) for 16 subprojects¹² and Resettlement and Indigenous Peoples Plans (RIPPs) for 03 subproject¹³ were prepared and need to be updated as per changed scope and 100% census and socioeconomic survey of potential APs. Additionally, 03 subprojects¹⁴, where no involuntary resettlement (IR) impacts were envisaged, due diligence reports (DDRs) were prepared as per SPS, 2009. The status of social safeguard documents submission and approval is provided in **Table 1(B).** The physical progress along with details of the contractor of the subprojects are provided in **Appendix 1**. The RPs/RIPPs revised during the reporting period are based on 100% census, socio-economic survey of potential affected persons during implementation by

During the implementation of subprojects, if any change will be reported in project scope, work site location as well as pipeline alignment, due diligence of changed location or alignment will be done by the concerned officers and will be reported to ADB through Semi- Annual Social Monitoring Report (SSMR) accordingly.

10. Draft Safeguard documents (RPs) for the following 02 towns- Bhawani Mandi (Drainage) and Nokha (WS&WW) subprojects - were updated (based on the final DMS and 100% census / socio-economic survey of potential APs) and submitted to ADB for approval during this reporting period. An updated safeguard document of Nokha (WS&WW) subproject has been approved by ADB. Apart from this, Nathdwara City Beautification subproject's Detail Project Report (DPR) has been approved, and draft Resettlement Plan has been prepared and submitted to ADB. All along, observations were also received and compliance of the ADB observations has also been done and submitted.

- 11. The details of the changed scope/alignment and their due diligence report status for the subprojects -Jodhpur (Drainage) and Bhawani Mandi (Drainage) are as follows:
- 12. Under the **Jodhpur Drainage** subproject, RP has been updated based on final design, detailed measurement survey (DMS), 100% census and socio-economic survey of affected persons (APs). All works are being executed in sections with no involuntary resettlement impacts. The primary outcome of the detailed design and measurement survey are (i) due to slight change in the alignment under Bhairav Nalla drainage length has been increased from 13.100 km to 13.200 km, and in RTO Nalla section, from 7.010 km to 7.043 km. (ii) the number of potential-affected persons (APs) identified along the proposed alignment has increased, (iv) from chainage 7.170 to 7.370 under Bhairav Nalla section a small portion of private land measuring 145 meter in length will be purchased from 1 person. Due diligence of drainage network under Bhairav Nallah and RTO Nallah sections has also been completed and included in the updated rehabilitation plan of Jodhpur Drainage Sub-project.

During survey, respondents were inquired about their officially recognized poverty status (BPL or APL). This information is reflected in the table 8, above.

Government of Rajasthan has in recent times been using indicators of National Food Security Act (NFSA, 2013) for estimation of poverty in the state. State has set criteria for inclusion and exclusion in BPL list. For urban areas, BPL inclusion criteria requires a family to qualify under any of these- BPL families already identified under 2003 urban BPL census, all state BPL families, Antyodaya and Annapurna beneficiaries, families not included in preceding category but are beneficiary under schemes (7 schemes are mentioned) such as chief minister senior citizen yojana, Indira Gandhi national old age pension scheme, Indira Gandhi widow pension schemes and other listed national/state social assistance schemes or if they are surveyed families from slums, rag pickers, registered construction labour, rickshaw pullers, vendors and others (13 such groups are identified). A family is excluded if it fails under any of the 7 exclusion parameters that include- income tax payee in the family, family member in government/semi government employment, other asset-based parameters such as four-wheeler ownership (unless it constitutes source of livelihood), house ownership (of specified built and size).

Under the Bhawani Mandi subproject, RP has been updated based on final design, 13. detailed measurement survey (DMS), 100% census and socio-economic survey of affected persons (APs) to incorporate (i) temporary loss of livelihoods and (ii) impact on minor structures (ramps/stairs and cement concrete flooring). Ramps/ stairs /cement concrete flooring belonging to 30 permanent shops cum residence and 310 permanent shops may be impacted (total 30+310= 340 ramps, stairs, cement concrete flooring may be impacted). The impacted ramps/stair cases are within the ROW of drains/roads. In addition, 30 roadside vendors/ push carts may be impacted (temporary loss of income during upgradation of drains) due to temporary access disruption. Measures to avoid and minimize private land acquisition and involuntary resettlement impacts include proposing all storm water drains along the road margin in land belonging to the Municipal Council, Bhawani Mandi and Government of Rajasthan (GOR). During excavation of open-cut trenches for construction of storm water drains and reconstruction of existing drains, access to shops and businesses will be ensured by providing pedestrian access through metal/wooden planks with preferably with handrails. In case impacts are unavoidable, compensation will be paid as per provisions of the agreed entitlement matrix. All work executed in sections without any involuntary resettlement impacts.

14. In case of design-build operate (DBO) contract, even if the project though consultants prepare the detailed project reports (DPRs), the final design/alignment has to be provided/ reconfirmed by the contractor. During the preparation of revised RPs/RIPPs, the vendors on both sides of the road were considered as affected persons (APs) to avoid complications. Further, to facilitate RPs/RIPPs implementation, a list of affected persons identified during social impact assessment (SIA) with 100% census socio-economic details are being provided to the

contractors during finalization of alignment and for avoiding/ confirming the impacts on potential affected persons.

15. The details of social safeguard documents and their category is provided in **Table 2**.

E. Implementation of Resettlement Plan

- 16. The project adopted methodology for implementation of RPs/RIPPs is as follows: (i) prior to the start of work, contractor will have to provide the advance work plan to PIU and CMSC along with the final alignment; (ii) after such intimation by the contractors, the joint reconfirmatory survey is conducted by the officials of PIU, CMSC, and contractor to finalize the list of affected persons likely to be impacted due to civil works. Since at the time of preparation of the RP/RIPP, the exact alignment was not known, details of all business establishments likely to be affected were included in the RP/RIPP. During finalizing the alignment, efforts were be made to avoid the impacts, and accordingly, the affected persons present in the sections with no impact will be documented and reported as part of impacts avoided.
- 17. The areas where the mitigation of impacts on livelihood is not possible, all the affected persons will be re-validated/ verified through site visit by social safeguard support staff of CMSC, and identity cards (ID) will be disbursed to potential affected persons. During the re-validation, if the affected persons listed in the RPs/RIPPs were not available at the site during

all the phases (i) Re-verification; (ii) distribution of compensation; and (iii) construction phase, they will be treated as "missing," and confirmation of their absence is being obtained from the other affected persons situated in the vicinity/adjacent. If affected persons voluntarily decline the compensation despite being offered, they will be treated as "Unwilling to receive compensation" and their consent to forego such compensation will be taken in writing, and third-party certification will be conducted.¹⁷

- 18. Once the list of affected persons is finalized, safeguard support staff collects the details required from affected persons, which include the bank details and other necessary documentation required for the transfer of compensation. Based on findings, the safeguard support staff (in consultation with the CMSC safeguard expert) prepares the micro plans, and after approval/sanction by PIU, these micro plans are submitted to the treasury with required bank details for direct transfer of the compensation in the bank account of affected persons through electronic clearance service/National Electronic Fund Transfer (NEFT) payment.
- 19. Affected persons are being compensated in accordance with the agreed entitlement matrix of resettlement framework (RF). Affected persons are being compensated for minimum of 14 days' or the actual period of disruption, whichever is higher as per resettlement framework (RF). Micro plans prepared for the respective project areas, takes care of the real impacts on affected persons and it is ensured that all the affected persons are compensated for the actual period of disturbance. If the duration of impact is more than 14 days, they will be compensated for the actual period of disturbance after due verification from PIU. The compensation that will be recommended in the micro plan is based on the entitlements prescribed in the resettlement plan (livelihood assistance, shifting assistance, and vulnerability assistance), the time lags (7% inflation in survey income is provided per year) of implementation and survey along with additional compensation with respect to minimum wage rates.

F. Current Status of Resettlement Plan – Implementation

- 20. During this reporting period (October 2024 to March 2025), out of 23 subprojects, contracts for 19 subprojects¹⁸ have been awarded, and project execution including topography survey, excavation, pipeline laying for wastewater and water supply networks, and rejuvenation and conservation of heritage building and monuments have been progressed considerably. Contracts for 03 city beautification subprojects (Mount Abu, Nawalgarh, and Bundi) have not been awarded during this reporting period. Notice to Proceed has been issued for Pushkar City Beautification subproject on 07.01.2025. Additionally, DPR of one city beautification subproject of Nathdwara town has been approved. The physical progress along with details of the contractor of the subprojects are provided in **Appendix 1**.
- 21. Based on 100% survey of potential affected persons of 22 subprojects, **3888** vendors/hawkers¹⁹ were identified. The details are as follows: Jodhpur Storm Water Drainage 68 (including 60 vendors/hawkers and 08 farmer for crop loss), Jodhpur Wastewater 603, Nimbahera Water Supply 642, Nokha Water Supply and Wastewater 604, Nathdwara Water

22. By the end of the reporting period, the resettlement assistance of ₹ 1,624,020 has been paid to 172 project affected persons. Details of payment disbursement to APs, and information of unwilling, missing affected persons and impacts avoided in case of affected persons) are provided in Table 4 (A), 4 (B) and Table 5. The compensation was paid to affected persons as per approved micro plan which includes, livelihood assistance, shifting assistance, vulnerability assistance, and additional assistance (for the time lag - 7% inflation in survey income is provided per year and to maintain minimum wage level).²¹ For missing and unwilling affected persons, records of written information from surrounding vendors or shopkeepers have been collected. All the details of missing and unwilling affected persons are available at the respective project implementation units. Details of compensation disbursed (including office order, treasury report and payment receipt) during this reporting period is attached in Appendix 6 (A) to 6 (C) and the photograph of identity card distribution to affected persons is attached in Appendix 7.

Missing: In case the surveyed APs were absent during execution of works, they will be treated as "missing," and confirmation of their absence were obtained from the other affected persons or nearby habitation.

Impact Avoided: In case the negative impact on APs were avoided through planning of civil work (night work/scheduling of work at convenient hours/non-peak hours/weekly off), they were treated under *Impact Avoided/Mitigated*.

Unwilling: If any APs show their unwillingness to received compensation, they will be treated as "Unwilling to receive compensation" and their consent taken in writing, together with third party certification of the waiver of compensation.²²

G. Project Impacts Minimization

- 23. Meticulous planning by PIU and project consultants and good practices adopted by the contractor have resulted in mitigation of impact on affected persons. The good practices adopted by the contractor are as below (including but not limited to the following:
 - Sewer pipelines are being laid in the middle of the road and the work is being carried out at night with proper safety measures.
 - Worked is being executed on a stretch on one side of the road, and access is being provided for small roadside businesses and footpaths have been provided for access to avoid loss of livelihood.
- 24. During the preparation of the resettlement plans, the people carrying on business activities on both sides of the road have been considered as affected persons. During implementation, works are being executed in some areas (high density) in nighttime or trenchless method and access was ensured to affected persons in a few patches, accordingly no impact was sustained by vendors operating. All these affected persons have been considered under the list of impacts avoided and reported in the SSMR.
- 25. Up to this reporting period, impacts on **135** affected persons were avoided/ mitigated as work was executed on one segment at the time on one side of the road, and access was made available for the roadside petty businesses. Safeguard support staff posted at towns conduct regular due diligence of work execution and documenting the confirmation taken from the mitigated affected persons. The consent of the affected persons substantiating that all impacts were avoided is presented as **Appendix 9**.
- 26. Impacts avoided on 122 affected persons under Jodhpur Wastewater subproject: As per the approved resettlement plan (RP) for the Jodhpur wastewater subproject, temporary relocation impact was anticipated for 122 affected persons who were vending their commercial activities during execution of work. At Shastri Nagar and Shastri Circle (impact mitigated on 110 APs as laying was done inside the residential colony and APs reported on the main road/circle of Shastri Nagar, Jodhpur. At Nagori Gate, impact mitigated on 4 APs. At Pratap Nagar Road impact mitigated on 8 APs. During the pipe laying work at these locations, relocation impact was avoided/ mitigated as worked was executed on one segment at the time on one side of the road, and access was made available for the roadside petty businesses. Hence, 122 potentially affected persons were not relocated from their current location and continued with their commercial activities without any disruption. Therefore, the relocation impact on these 122 affected persons in Jodhpur Wastewater subproject was avoided. If any affected person falls under the proposed alignment and the impact cannot be avoided, these individuals will also be compensated according to the agreed entitlement matrix of the resettlement plan.
- 27. **Impacts avoided on 8 farmers under Jodhpur Drainage subproject**: At Bhairav Nalla Section in between Chainage 2.300 to 6.000, 8 farmers have been mitigated from loss of crop. Jodhpur comes under Arid zone of the Rajasthan State. Traditional farming system in western Rajasthan is rainfed and being cultivated in rainy season only. Efforts are made to

execute the works in encroached sections in non-cropping season to avoid loss of standing crops, if any. All these 8 farmers have certified that there was no impact to their crops during the work.

28. Impacts avoided on 5 affected persons under Bharatpur wastewater subproject: As per the approved resettlement plan (RP) for the Bharatpur wastewater subproject, temporary relocation impact was anticipated for 05 affected persons who were vending their commercial activities at Anand Nagar and Nai (New) Mandi Bharatpur, out of 05 mitigated APs, in case of 03 APs impacts were mitigated at Anand Nagar and 02 APs were avoided/mitigated at Nai (New Mandi),Bharatpur. During the pipe laying work at these locations, relocation impact was avoided/ mitigated as worked was executed on one segment at the time on one side of the road, and access was made available for the roadside small businesses. During the execution, the 05 potentially affected persons were not relocated from their current location and continued running their commercial activities without any disruption.

29. **Impacts on Indigenous People**: Based on census and socio-economic survey of Mount Abu, Sagwara and Dungarpur which are declared as a scheduled area by the Government of India, 168 in Sagwara, 203 in Dungarpur and 05 in Mount Abu among the potential affected persons facing involuntary resettlement impacts (temporary income loss), belong to scheduled tribe (ST) community. These persons are using the RoW for running their livelihood through selling of fruits, garments, flowers etc. and will be impacted for temporary period of work. During freezing final alignment, efforts will be made by the implementing agency to provide access for continuation for their livelihood. In case of temporary livelihood impacts persists, additional compensation and assistances as per agreed resettlement framework and indigenous peoples planning framework will be disbursed to them. Till the end of this reporting period no APs from ST community has been provided resettlement assistance in Dungarpur and Sagwara since they were yet to be impacted. In order to mitigate negative

impacts on scheduled tribe persons, before and during the subproject design, implementation, as well as monitoring process, the project staff will enhance the dissemination of project information and conducting meaningful consultation especially with scheduled tribe persons to ensure that they get the maximum benefit from the advantage conditions brought by the subproject and fully understand their entitlements under this RIPP. No civil works will be allowed in sections of impact and compensation payment will be completed prior to start of civil works.

30. In compliance to the Indigenous action plan, consumer survey has been completed by the project contractors in Sagwara and Dungarpur towns and number of scheduled tribe's households in these towns have been captured for providing 100% water supply, sewerage and other infrastructure facilities. Consultations are being done with scheduled tribe households in these towns. The project scope and advantages are being disseminated to them. The Mount Abu city conservation of heritage sites/ monuments under city beautification subproject is in bidding process and have not been awarded during this reporting period. It has been conveyed that 100% house service connections for sewerage and potable water will be provided to the Scheduled Tribe families. CAPP consultants are distributing IEC material amid schedule tribe community, and organizing programs/ activities related to skill training, formation of groups, linkage to livelihood scheme etc. are being organized. The photographs and attendance sheets of the consultation with the scheduled tribe households is presented as **Appendix 10**

H. Public Participation and Consultation

- Consultations are being conducted with the potential as well as the actual APs and other stakeholders regarding scope of the project, entitlement options, impacts etc. at different stretches during RPs/RIPPs preparation. Key Finding of consultations are: (i) participants expressed satisfaction that the respective subprojects will cater to their service delivery aspirations (water supply, wastewater, city beautification) and needs for which they have waited for a long years; (ii) vendors are not hesitant to move or shift if necessary to accommodate the work; (iii) they are willing to provide labor for the subproject; and (iv) public during consultations requested for proper barricading during pipe laying works; (v) the project should cover up the dug pits properly and restore the roads after subproject construction; (vi) information of the respective cut-off dates. Prior to start of socio-economic survey of potential APs, leaflet with information about the subproject, its benefits, grievance redress mechanism were also distributed to the potential affected persons as well as households. Information and the concept of cut-off date was explained as well. Photographs of public and stakeholder consultations and meetings, leaflet distribution and attendance sheets is attached in Appendix 11. Photographs of orientation to PIU, CMSC and Contractors staff on social safeguard resettlement is attached in Appendix 12.
- 32. Door to door consultation are being held with public and community members, and importance of water metering, property connection, water conservation and issues related to sewerage and drainage connectivity, and conservation of heritage sites/ monuments are being discussed and need for their support is being conversed. Advance intimation about works plan are being conveyed to households.
- 33. The consultation are being held very close to the area where work is currently ongoing or may be commenced soon and are attended by people of the surrounding areas. Social support staff, social outreach team and representatives of contractors are regularly attending these programs and interacting with the local public and community members. Summary of consultation held during this reporting period in subprojects are presented in **Table 7**.
- 34. People are very keen to extend their cooperation as this project will provide much needed drinking water, sewerage and drainage facilities. It is being informed that some relatively adverse issues like quantity of water supply, and proper disposal of drainage water

may be hampered during the physical work after the commencement of civil work. Families are also being informed that temporary access issues may arise during the laying of the pipeline, however, mitigation measures will be taken by the contractors as per the site specific environmental monitoring plan (EMP).

35. M/s IPE Global Pvt Ltd has been appointed as Community Awareness and Participation Consultants (CAPC) to oversee the entire information dissemination required for creating public awareness. Social Development Expert of CAPP along with town level staff of CAPPC with the support of social outreach team (SOT)²³ of the contractor is implementing awareness program in the project towns. The major activities that are being performed by CAPPC are: (i) develop awareness material targeting different sections of society, (ii) **promote gender equality** and social inclusion through water and sewer connection to BPL, (iii) empowerment of schedule caste/schedule tribe households, (iv) capacity building and training for ULB staff and public representatives, (v) mobilize the community with regular field-level activities involving all stakeholders, (vi) keep a stock of Quantitative achievements and targets achieved, (vii) collect feedback from all stakeholders within the town.

36. During this reporting period, CAPPC has organised extensive awareness activities involving residents, public representatives, shopkeepers, women, project laborers, line departments and school children. Development of communication and IEC material for successfully delivering a key message. Capacity building of Social Outreach Team from contractors, public representatives and ULB staff members was conducted in towns. Focus

group discussions with women and women elected representatives of the concerned towns were organised.

- 37. Concerning the GESI action plan, a Total no of 13 trainings were organized on Plumber, Basic Computer and Mason in WSS project towns. The duration of Plumbing & Mason skill training is two weeks and Basic computer skill training is four weeks in the respective towns. Total number of women trained is 102 out of which 20 belongs to scheduled caste, 42 belongs to Scheduled Tribe, 26 belongs to OBC and 14 belongs to General Caste categories. Photographs of women internship program and skill training and news/media coverage of concerned activities is appended in **Appendix 13**. All these activities are part of gender action plan implementation as well.
- 38. MoU Signed for Women Internship Program (WIP), and total 39 MoUs signed with Government and Private Engineering Colleges of Ajmer, Banswara, Baran, Bhilwara, Bikaner, Bharatpur, Dholpur, Jahalawar, Jaipur, Jodhpur, Khetri, Karauli, Kota, Nathdwara, Sikar and Udaipur for implementation of Women Internship Program.

I. Capacity Building Activities of Project Implementing Agencies

39. In order to develop capacity building of the PIUs engineers, contractors' officials and other related stakeholders on compliance of social safeguards, Safeguard Specialist-Resettlement of PMCBC, and Social Safeguard and Gender Professionals are frequently arranging for training/ orientation and consultation activities. In this context, training has been organized for Bharatpur PIU, CMSC and contractor staff by the Safeguard Specialist – Resettlement of PMCBC on 19th December 2024 and total 20 persons attended the training.

J. Grievance Redress Mechanism




Figure 2: Grievance Redress Mechanism-RSTDSP

- 40. To ensure that the grievances of the affected persons are heard and resolved in a timely manner, the grievance redress mechanism (GRM) has been established for the project, which has the following approach and procedure (Figure 2).
 - (i) In case the affected persons have any complaint or grievance, he/she is free to lodge his/her complaint to the site engineers of Contractor/CMSC/PIU, safeguard staff who will make efforts to resolve the complaint on the ground level itself. The project implementation unit will make efforts to redress the grievance within seven days from the receipt of the grievance.
 - (ii) In case the affected persons grievance is not redressed at PIU level, the matter will be put up at the Zonal PIU level who will ensure that grievance is redressed with the time frame of seven days.
 - (iii) In case the affected person's grievance is not redressed at Zonal PIU level, the matter will be put up at the PMU level who will ensure that grievance is redressed with the time frame of fifteen days.
 - (iv) Affected Persons are free to approach the court of law at any time on their own will and expenses.
- 41. Besides the GRM of the project, the state has an online grievance monitoring system known as Rajasthan Sampark Portal. The affected persons can also lodge their complaints online at http://sampark.rajasthan.gov.in/index.aspx.
- 42. A grievance redress / toll-free number has also been displayed by the contractor at different work site locations and PIU office to lodge the grievances/ complaint under the project. The details of toll-free / alternate helpline number is presented in **Table 8**. Additionally, a toll-free number (0141-2720245) has also been displayed on RUIDP official website to lodge the online grievances and complaints accordingly.

- 43. **Record-keeping:** PIUs, Contractor, and CMSC have been entrusted with the responsibility to maintain a proper register of the grievance (if any) which will be endorsed by all agencies involved in implementation. GRC registers are in place at all the towns.
- 44. **Costs**: Contractors are required to be allocated budget for pamphlets and billboards as part of the EMP. Costs involved in resolving the complaints (meetings, consultations, communication and reporting/information dissemination) will be borne by the concerned PIU at town level while costs related to escalated grievances will be met by the PMU. Cost estimates for grievance redress are included in resettlement cost estimates.
- 45. Grievance redress mechanism (GRM) has been established under the project, and PMU has also issued an office order for the same and has been shared with all PIUs/CMSCs to follow the grievance redress mechanism under the project. The copy of office order for GRM is attached in **Appendix 14**.
- 46. During this reporting period, minor complaints from the people (housekeeping, pipeline damaged, leakages in a new connection, etc.) were received, which have been resolved satisfactorily. Complaints/grievances related to social safeguards- resettlement were not received during the reporting period.

K. **Institutional Arrangement**

47. The Local Self Government Department (LSGD), Government of Rajasthan (GOR) is the executing agency (EA) of the Project, responsible for overall strategic approvals, guidance, and monitoring of the project. Rajasthan Urban Drinking Water Sewerage and Infrastructure Corporation Limited (RUDSICO) is the Implementing Agency (IA) for the project. The Project Management Unit (PMU) is housed in the Externally Aided Projects division of RUDSICO (RUDSICO - EAP). PMU is headed by Project Director and assisted by experienced officers from engineer and finance services are responsible for the implementation of the project. Project Officer-Social at PMU assisted by Safeguard Specialist-Resettlement of Project Management Capacity Building Consultant (PMCBC) to ensure that all subprojects meet safeguard requirements as agreed in the loan covenant and in line with this RF. Two Zone office at Jodhpur and Jaipur headed by an Additional Chief Engineer (ACE) has been well established for monitoring of PIUs. Each zonal office has one dedicated safeguard officer responsible for compliance monitoring and reporting on social, gender and environmental safeguard issues. Project implementation Unit (PIU) is well established in each subproject towns headed by Superintending Engineer/Executive Engineer for implementation of the project. One Engineer in each PIU has been designated as safety and safeguard officer (SSO) who will be responsible for safeguard and health and safety requirements, monitoring and compliance. PIU is supported by CMSC in all areas of project implementation; implementation of resettlement plan and safeguard monitoring and compliance. Deployment Status of Social Safequards officials during the reporting period is presented in **Table 9** and details of Nodal officers at PIUs level is presented in Table 10.

48. At each PIU, one engineer has been designated as a nodal officer and is responsible for day to day monitoring of the environmental management plan (EMP) and implementation of resettlement plan. Nodal officers of PIU are assisting PMU Project Officer—Social in the implementation of the social safeguards at the PIU level. The PIUs are responsible for the implementation of the RPs/RIPPS. PIUs will undertake internal monitoring and supervision and record observations throughout the project period to ensure that the safeguards and mitigation measures are provided as intended.

- 49. For monitoring of the implementation of resettlement plans, Social Safeguard staff for project towns are appointed by CMSC, working under the supervision and guidance of CMSC and PMCBC Social Safeguard Professionals. The task of Social Safeguard Support Staff are as follows:
 - To communicate closely with identified (identified through census survey conducted for RPs/RIPPs) potential affected persons and provide them timely information of construction schedule, distribute identification cards, educate them on their entitlements under the RPs/RIPPs and RF, assist in shifting affected persons during civil work execution inappropriate manner without hampering their income or assets;
 - Assist affected persons (APs) in (i) In opening bank accounts (if not already available with APs), disbursement of compensation livelihood losses and resettlement assistance (as per provisions of RF) and ensure that affected persons obtain their full entitlements under the RPs (ii) Organize consultation and discussion meetings with the affected persons, the community leaders and other stakeholders throughout resettlement plan (RP) preparation and implementation phases (iii) To organize consultation and discussion meetings with the APs, the community and other stakeholders throughout RP implementation phases with proper documentation (iv) Ensure disbursement of compensation against livelihood losses, resettlement assistance (vulnerable assistance, shifting assistance, structure losses assistance, crops/trees losses assistance) as per entitlement matrix (v) Disclosure of resettlement plan (RP), Cut of date in vernacular language at public places and project affected persons

and preparation of internal RP implementation monitoring reports (vi) Distribution of one-month advance notice, to in affected areas that on the following date the civil works will be started in following areas and timely shifting of squatters and encroachers from temporary impact zone during construction if required (vii) Registering grievances of affected persons (the grievance redress mechanism (GRM) already established) and assist to PIU in resolving grievances at PIU level or GRM level (viii) Assist the affected persons in the redress of grievances through the Grievance Redress mechanism established as part of the RP/RIPP, and make the affected persons aware of GRM at several levels (ix) Assist affected persons in getting benefits from various government development programs particularly for income restoration/generation.

50. Social Outreach Team (SOT) has been mobilized in most of the project towns for supporting the Social Safeguard Staff of CMSC in the implementation of resettlement plan and community awareness activities. During this reporting period, mobilization status of SOTs in subproject town is presented in **Table 11**.

L. Monitoring Results-Findings

51. The project monitoring using specific indicators e.g. number of days for which compensation paid versus number of actual days of disruption; number of vulnerable households provided vulnerable assistance; number of grievances registered versus resolved and unresolved grievances; compensations cost versus payments made and so on to get overall understanding about the current status. In addition, compensation and payments of all types of impacts and losses; progress of additional compensation to vulnerable persons; types of training and number of participants; employment opportunities available and availed by vulnerable groups; status of consultations and redress of grievances; status of inclusion and participation, particularly affected vulnerable groups; social safeguard concerns in construction sites; status and dates of disclosure of RPs/RIPPs. During the reporting period (October 2024 to March 2025); complaints/grievances related to social safeguards-resettlement were not received. Social safeguards activities have been carried in the phases and are illustrated the following **Table 12**.

N. Follow-Up Actions Recommendation and Disclosure

- 53. During this reporting period (October 2024 to March 2025), out of 23 subprojects, contracts for Nineteen subprojects have been awarded and pipe laying work for wastewater, drainage and water supply networks and heritage conservation and rejuvenation of sites/monuments under city beautification have progressed considerably. Contract for 03 city beautification subprojects (Mount Abu, Nawalgarh CB and Bundi CB) have not been awarded during this reporting period. Notice to Proceed has been issued for Pushkar City Beautification subproject on 07.01.2025. Additionally, Nathdwara City Beautification is also part of this additional financing, and DPR of the subproject has been approved. By the end of this reporting period, the resettlement assistance of ₹1,624,020 have been paid to 172 APs. During this reporting period, minor complaints from the people (housekeeping, pipeline damaged, leakages in a new connection, etc.) were received, which have already been resolved satisfactorily. Complaints and/or grievances related to social safeguard -resettlement were not received during the reporting period.






