EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. GoR have received a loan from ADB for implementation of water supply and sewerage systems in select district towns in the state under Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP). RUSDP will complement the past and ongoing efforts of the government of Rajasthan (GOR) to improve water supply and waste water services to the residents of the state of Rajasthan. It comprises (i) a program, financed by a policy-based loan of US \$250 million, to support policy reforms, including institutional development and governance improvement in the urban sector in the state, and (ii) a project, financed by a project loan of US\$ 250 million (project cost 360 million including state share of US\$ 110 million), to invest in water distribution network and sewerage systems in the six project cities in the state.¹ The six project cities were selected based on consideration of the cities' lack of basic services at present and their willingness to undertake reforms and institutional restructuring.

2. The Local Self Government Department (LSGD), Government of Rajasthan (GoR) will be the Executing Agency (EA) of the Project and will be responsible for overall strategic approvals, guidance, monitoring the execution of the project. Program Management Unit (PMU) headed by Project Director is assisted by experienced engineer and finance officers, is responsible for project execution, implementation and management cum supervision of subprojects. To take care of all responsibilities and compliance of social safeguards (including involuntary resettlement and indigenous people), PO-Social has been placed at PMU and assisted by Resettlement Expert of Project Management, Design and Supervision consultants (PMDSC). The Resettlement Plans (RPs) have been prepared according to the Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS) of the ADB. In addition to above, an Assistant Safeguard Officer (additional post sanctioned)² has been mobilized in each town on PMDSC side, for over all monitoring of implementation of RP.

3. The current report is the 4th Semi-Annual Social Safeguard Monitoring Report prepared to comply with the loan covenants covering the period from **26th May 2017 to 25th Nov, 2017**³ in a cumulative process. This report covered the resettlement and social safeguard monitoring results to comply with the spirit of ADB policy to “enhance stakeholder’s trust and ability to engage with ADB, and thereby increase the development impact” in which disclosure of safeguard monitoring is a prominent aspect.

4. As indicated in previous SMRs, out of total 07 subproject identified, the Draft Resettlement Plans (RPs) for 6 subprojects were prepared by PPTA⁴. These RPs were based on transect walks data in key representative areas with visual screening of 60-70 percent of the roads/areas and by extrapolations of results. Out 06 RPs (sample RPs), 4 nos of RPs were updated by PMDSC after conducting detailed impact assessment and detailed Socio Economic Survey. In addition to this 1 nos of RP (RUSDP/PALI/02) was also prepared by PMDSC for new package. The RP of remaining 02 Packages (Bhilwara & Hanumangarh) will be prepared by PMDSC before start of civil work based on the final design of contractor. Details of approved RPs are as below:-

5. It is to confirm that, above, subprojects do not have any significant involuntary resettlement (IR) impacts and impacts on indigenous people. All IR impacts are temporary in nature and mainly resulting in temporary disruption of livelihood (only during construction period) for which DPs are entitled for compensation as per the Entitlement Matrix.

6. All these impacts will be majorly confined to squatters and mobile vendors operating in RoW. Minor/ temporary inconvenience to road side shops in busy market areas could be also there. APs will be provided advance information regarding the upcoming construction activities to ensure no or minimal disruption in their livelihood. There is no need for permanent relocation due to nature of work being executed., if required, APs will be assisted to temporarily shift for continued economic and livelihood activities. For example APs will be assisted to shift to the other side of the road where no civil work is proposed.

7. It is further intimated that up to this reporting period, contracts for all identified packages (07 packages) i.e. RUSDP/TONK/01, RUSDP/PALI/01, RUSDP/PALI/02, RUSDP/SGN/01, RUSDP/JJN/01, RUSDP/BHL/01 and RUSDP/HNM/01 have been awarded and works of 5 packages (except RUSDP/BHL 01 and RUSDP/HNM/ 01) has started and are at different stages of implementation. NTP for RUSDP/BHL/01 and RUSDP/HNM/ 01 package has been issued and works has not started yet.

8. For RP implementation, 06 Posts of Additional Safeguard Support were sanctioned by EA (one support staff at each town) under PMDSC Contract and Safeguard Support staff/ Assistant Safeguard Officer (ASO) for monitoring of IR/RP implementation have been mobilized in Tonk, Pali, Jhunjhunu, Ganganagar and Bhilwara.

9. Contractors of Package no RUSDP/PALI/01, RUSDP/PALI/02 and RUSDP/JJN/01 have started works in some of the DP areas after required implementation of RP. During current reporting period, assistance was paid to 98 DPs and impacts on 108 DPs were avoided (due to alignment change/ night work).

10. Under Tonk package (RUSDP/TONK/01), trenchless Sewer work has started in few DP areas. Joint Site Visit to all these areas were conducted and required monitoring is being done by ASO. Based on the monitoring/records, till date no DP has been adversely affected by trenchless work. However, RP implementation is pending in above areas due to non availability of final alignment of water supply line.

11. During implementation, no impact on CPRs in the working areas is reported and access to identified CPRs was not blocked.

12. During this reporting period, various Orientation program with Project Contractors, PIUs and PMDSC site staff were held in all the project towns (except Hanumangarh) and Safeguard issues were deliberated in detail. Contractor is directed by PIU, to avoid the impact on livelihood and maintain access to commercial as well as residential houses and establishment. Strengthening of outreach team and their role and responsibility with respect to RP implementation and information dissemination were also discussed in detail.

13. M/s IPE Global Pvt Ltd in association with Cogent Training Research Development consultant has been appointed as Community Awareness and Participation Consultants to oversee the entire information dissemination, required for creating public awareness. CAPC has been mobilized (in RUIDP PH III) from 1.12.2015 and 01 no. of Social Expert cum Gender Specialist has been deputed by CAPC at each project towns. Social Expert of CAPC is acting as town in charge for all community awareness and participation programs and is overseeing the performance of Social outreach team (SOT)⁶ of contractor.

14. The City Level Committee (CLC), acting as a grievance redress committee (GRC) has been established for each towns, chaired by the District Collector. CLC has representatives from the ULB, state government agencies, PIU, community-based organizations (CBOs) and NGOs. As GRC, CLC meets at regular intervals based on the availability of the CLC /GRC members and also as per requirement or pending issues. GRC registers are in place at the towns. PIUs with support of CAPC & Contractor is entrusted with the responsibility to maintain a proper grievance register and ensure that the grievances received during execution should be addressed as per the methodology prescribed in RP and RF. The grievance register is endorsed by all agencies involved in implementation.

15. In this reporting period, minor complaints of the people were received which were resolved satisfactorily (*Refer annexure 9*). No complaints/grievances of identified DPs were received.

16. Executing Agency (EA) is highly involved in project implementation and past learning's / lessons related to execution are well incorporated in project and civil works and it is also expected that a positive impact will occur due to commitment/preparedness show by the Implementing Agency (IA). However, due to frequent changes in project administration at town level and limited understanding of contractor, it will be important for PMU to conduct rigorous monitoring to ensure tandem between implementation progress and compliance to ADB Policies.

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IMPLEMENTATION OF RESETTLEMENT PLANS
Duration (26th May 2017 to 25th Nov, 2017)

A. PROJECT BACKGROUND AND DESCRIPTION

1. GoR have received a loan from ADB for implementation of water supply and sewerage systems in selected district towns in the state under Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP). RUSDP will complement the past and ongoing efforts of the government of Rajasthan (GOR) to improve water supply and waste water services to the residents of the state of Rajasthan. It comprises (i) a program, financed by a policy-based loan of US \$250 million, to support policy reforms, including institutional development and governance improvement in the urban sector in the state, and (ii) a project, financed by a project loan of US\$ 250 million (project cost 360 million including state share of US\$ 110 million), to invest in water distribution network and sewerage systems in the six project cities in the state.⁷ The six project cities were selected based on consideration of the cities' lack of basic services at present and their willingness to undertake reforms and institutional restructuring.

A.1 Project Components

2. The primary objective of Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP) is to promote sustainable growth and poverty reduction in the six selected cities of Rajasthan. The Project is financing infrastructural development, in the form of construction and rehabilitation, related to water supply and wastewater inclusive of capacity building of existing Municipal Corporations. Social and community development is forming an important component of the Project, involving community mobilization; under well-organized proactive public awareness campaigns. The works proposed for 6 selected towns under RUSDP are described in Table 1.

B. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

3. The purpose of Biannual Social Monitoring Report is to analyze periodical (over the total implementation period of the project) compliance with the approved Involuntary Resettlement (IR) documents such as Resettlement Plan (RP)/ Due Diligence Report (DDR).

4. RUIDP has the responsibility to oversee the implementation and monitoring of social safeguards issues of each subproject in the project towns. This report covers resettlement and social safeguard monitoring results to comply with the spirit of ADB policy to 'enhance stakeholders trust' and ability to engage with ADB, and thereby increase the development impact (of projects) in which disclosure of safeguard monitoring is a prominent aspect. This report covers Social Monitoring, addressing all the issues related with social safeguards, with reference to the progress achieved and current status of reporting period.

5. This consolidated report outlines monitoring implementation of social safeguard activities, during **26th May 2017 to 25th Nov, 2017** in accordance with the ADB Safeguard Policies.

C. SOCIAL SAFEGUARD CATEGORIZATION

6. ADB's classification system as per ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS) 2009 is as below:-

Category A: Subprojects proposed for construction or development, will fall under this category, if, it caused a significant involuntary resettlement impacts with a physical displacement of 200 or more persons from their residences, or 200 or more persons lose 10% or more of their productive or income generating

assets, or more persons or 200 or more persons experience a combination of both.

Category B: Any proposed subproject that includes involuntary resettlement impacts but are not deemed significant considering loss of shelter/houses or productive or income generating assets will be considered for category B.

Category C: A proposed subproject that has no involuntary resettlement impact.

7. Prior to civil works implementation, all the subprojects selected for construction or developments are screened through SIA and classified using ADB's classification system.

C.1 Subprojects Categorization under RUIDP- Phase III

8. After SIA and initial transect walk conducted to all the six town, It has been confirmed (already confirmed by PPTA study also) that there is no significant impact and all the sub-projects identified in RUIDP, Phase III are under **Category B as defined in SPS 2009**.

9. Further it is also confirmed that there are no Indigenous People (IP), no private land acquisition issues and most impacts are temporary in nature, where the livelihood of the people would get impacted (only during the construction period). Necessary compensation as per the agreed Resettlement Framework (RF) will be ensured for temporary losses.

10. The resettlement impacts/ temporary impacts will be mainly due to laying of water supply and sewerage pipe networks. However, the Pipes will be laid within road rights-of-way (RoW), and will not require land acquisition or cause permanent displacement, but may cause temporary access disruptions and possible temporary losses in income during construction on non-titled movable /transitory structure (push carts etc.) owners/business operating in the ROW.

D. STATUS OF PREPARATION/ UPDATING OF RP

11. As per PPTA Studies, the social impact identified in towns were generally temporary in nature, affecting mobile/ambulatory vendors, who are earning their livelihood by using public land and considered non-titleholders. Recognizing the adverse impacts (in advance) of the project and the need to address the involuntary resettlement and other related adverse social impacts, RUIDP (on behalf of Govt. of Rajasthan) & ADB jointly prepared the resettlement and rehabilitation framework consistent with applicable laws, notifications and policies that are relevant in the context of the implementation of the project activities.

12. Provision of livelihood assistance for mobile/ambulatory vendors were also made in the RF, in view of disruption likely to be caused due to implementation of project activities. It was agreed that compensation would be paid/given to the DPs for the entire period of disruption due to implementation of different infrastructure works. The general period of impact (Water Supply/Waste Water) of 14 days shall be considered while preparing RP.

However, if the actual dislocation exceeds the period taken, the RP may be revised and additional compensation for the extended period will also be proposed/ disbursed. The RF sets out the requirements for payment, compensation, income restoration and relocation, consultation, participation and disclosure and the grievance redress mechanism.

13. As per RF, RUSDP has to ensure that any physically or economically displaced persons should be compensated prior to commencement of civil works of subprojects where applicable, following the approved RP. For which, It has been agreed that the draft RPs prepared by the PPTA⁸, consultant will be updated before start of civil works. The entitlement matrix included in the RF prepared and approved by ADB will form the basis for estimation of compensation and payment for the affected properties and income loss to the APs/DPs and RF will be followed during revision/ preparation of new RP for the subprojects involving temporary impact, land acquisition, resettlement and rehabilitations of the affected households.

14. Upto this reporting period 5 nos of RP were revised/updated/prepared and submitted to ADB and all RP are approved⁹. Summary of approved RPs are attached in *Annexure 1*.

15. The Program objective is to improve the economic development by providing the infrastructure and service in the water supply and sewerage sector. The improvement of quality of life and thereby effective contribution of beneficiary people in the economic activity is expected. The Program therefore focuses on service delivery along with the creation of quality assets and service delivery monitoring systems. For achieving this operations & management perspective, a DMA/Zone based approach for design, construction and operation is adopted and Design Build and Operate (DBO) contract with single contractor for water supply and sewerage work with 10 years O&M provision are being awarded.

16. Being a DBO contract, even though the DPRs are prepared by consultants (PPTA/PMDS), the final design/alignment is to be provided/ re-confirmed by Contractor. Presently the alignment is being provided/ finalized by contractor DMA/Zone wise hence the vendors on both the side of the road were considered in the RP. Adequate provision for Compensation, Additional assistance for vulnerable DPs and shifting assistance are kept in the RP as per the Resettlement Framework. Further in order to facilitate RP implementation, a Zone/DMA wise list of DPs identified during SIA (with 100% socio economic details) are being provided to contractors for freezing of alignment and for avoiding/ confirming impacts on DPs.

17. As of Nov 2017, all sub-projects under implementation stage have updated IR documents, in accordance with the RF. Provisions are made for DPs in the Resettlement Budget for livelihood assistance, shifting assistance and assistance for vulnerable DP as applicable. RP are now under implementation, Compensation, Additional assistance to vulnerable DPs and shifting assistance wherever applicable are being provided to DPs.

E. STRATEGY FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF RP

18. For implementation of RP and to comply with the ADB requirement, every DMA is being visited jointly with PIU and PMDSC representatives well in advance in light of the alignment finalized by the contractor. At first juncture, mitigation/minimization of impacts are prioritized through planning of civil work and if applicable mitigation plan is prepared and provided to contractor. It is important to understand that the mitigation plan prepared by the Social Expert of PMDSC, are forwarded to contractor after due verification by the concerned PIU but to implement the mitigation plan in true spirit will be contractual responsibility of contractor and PIU and due-diligence of the same will be done by the social expert of PMDSC at reasonable duration and reported in revised RPs from time to time.

19. However, if the mitigation of impact on livelihood is not possible, all the DPs are to be re-validated and verified by the implementing officer (ASO, PMDSC) at their respective towns which include field verification (both signature, photos & proof of identification like voter ID etc along with bank account details are taken) and Subproject ID Cards disbursement.

20. After every joint site visit, Micro Plans/Mitigation plans are being prepared road wise (as applicable) and submitted. During preparation of Micro Plan the real impact on DPs are considered and it is ensured that all the DPs are compensated for time over run and entire period of disturbance. These Micro Plans facilitate in identifying the DPs which are below minimum wage rate at the time of disbursement to ensure additional compensation to these DPs. Micro plan also takes care of the time lags (7% inflation in survey income is provided per year) of implementation and survey.

21. As per past learning from the ADB project, it would be ensured that DPs are at least paid amount equivalent to prevailing minimum wage as compensation at the time of disbursement. It will be ensured that the compensations amount thus calculated (recorded livelihood compensation + additional compensation due to time lag) per day to DP, will not be less than minimum wage rate prevailing at the time of disbursement otherwise the minimum wages applicable at time of disbursement will be paid and apply in all subprojects RP. The final payment made as per applicable minimum wages will be sent to ADB separately for approval and will be made an integral part of approved/ revised RPs.

E.1 Orientation Program with Project Contractors and Mitigation Action

22. As a part of Implementation Strategy, during this reporting period, Orientation program with Project Contractors, were held in all the project town and Safeguard issues were deliberated in detail. Strategy deliberated by PMDSC Safeguard Expert, to avoid the impact on livelihood and maintain access to commercial as well as residential houses and establishment, include :- (i) Proper advance information to be provided/ circulated in the area. (ii) work to be executed in planned/ phased manner so that temporary inconvenience is avoided (iii) Access to CPRs to be maintained.(iv) Natural Drains should not be disturbed (as

far as possible) (v) Since, there are plenty of permanent shops on the proposed alignment and since the road width is sufficient, contractor is advised not to close the road or divert the traffic and the work should be executed on convenient hours / non-peak hours after required consultations with the shop owners/ vendors. All, the work is assured to be carried out in patches and the same strategy would be adopted in all areas so that even if the work is executed on one side of the road, the indirect impact on the other side is also avoided. It was also suggested that alignment should be finalized timely and should be communicated well in advance so that internal monitoring / implementation of RP are possible.

23. Joint site visit by Social Safeguard Team (ASO) along with Planning Engineer of Contractors of Pali, Ganganagar and Jhunjhunu were also undertaken along with this orientation. During field visit, it was deliberated to the contractor's representatives that presently both side vendors has been taken up in the draft Resettlement Plan and as per the recent directions of ADB, RP has to be updated after freezing the exact alignment from contractor side. It was also recommended to the contractor that the impact in DP areas should be minimized through careful planning (ensuring access to every commercial and residential establishment) and the work should be adjusted to non-peak hours/non-working days as per the convenience of public, the work should be carried out in small patches so that the required access to all the vendors is maintained. Contractor informed that provision for night works are taken in the contract and in submitted SIP and work in most of the busy areas and crowded area will be taken up at night to avoid the impact and inconvenience to the public.

24. Detailed discussions and deliberation about the safeguard policy were done and Social team visited the impacted areas and demonstrated the possible ways of providing access (through on site visit to few areas). Further, it was also informed to contractor that as per ADB safeguard policy, no civil works should be started in any DP areas prior to the disbursement of compensation. Safeguard team also suggested that alignment of entire areas should be freeze as early as possible so that final RP could be submitted to ADB. **(Photographs are attached in annexure 3).**

E.2 Orientation Program of Site Engineer (PMDSC), PIU officials:

25. Orientation Program of Site Engineer (PMDSC), PIU officials were also held at Ganganagar, Pali and Bhilwara and all the engineers were requested for their active involvement in Social Safeguard Activity, so that desired implementation of R&R Plan/ RP can be done. The Role of Social Safeguard Support and role of outreach team in R&R implementation, desired documentation for Safeguard Compliance, Important issues like how to minimize or mitigate the impacts or in-case the impacts are unavoidable how the Resettlement Plan is to be implemented etc were discussed in detail. **(Photographs are attached in annexure 3)**

E.3 Joint Orientation Program with Site Engineers (PMDSC), Contractor's Social Outreach Team & Safety Engineer:

26. Joint Orientation Program of all Site Engineer (PMDSC) and Contractors Social Outreach Team & Safety Engineer was held on 18.11.2017 at Jaipur to orient both teams jointly, towards quality requirements and towards compliances of Safeguard issues at site. PMDSC Expert briefed all the participants (contractors representatives from all town attended) about the safeguard requirement and informed that implementation of Resettlement Plan (RP) and Environmental Management Plan (EMP) is a contractual obligation under this project. One to one issues of site were discussed and required advice was provided to the involved agencies i.e. Contractors and PMDSC field staff. **(Photographs are attached in annexure 3)**

E.4 Common Issues Expected and Methodology Adopted

a. Missing and Unwilling DPs

27. A major issue generally faced during RP implementation is of missing DPs under temporary impacts. Generally, DPs which are surveyed and distributed with identity cards are not traceable during construction for payment of compensation. This is mainly due to migrant and mobile nature of businesses. To overcome this situation of missing DPs under RF of RUSDP it is agreed that missing DPs under temporary impacts not traceable for more than 18 months after the start of compensation disbursement, or do not claim their entitlement within 36 months, will bear no impacts of the project and hence will not be considered for compensation.

28. Issues like DPs showing their unwillingness to accept assistance or unwillingness to participate or are minor (may not be disclosed during survey but get revealed at the time of opening of bank account) may also arise during implementation. In support of Missing DP and other related issues, implementation officer (ASO) will collect records of written information from surrounding vendors or shopkeepers or public representatives. For documentation of this problem, it is decided that a certificate may be taken from Ward Parshad ¹⁰ with witnesses of nearby vendors/residents about Missing or DP/DP shown their unwillingness to accept R&R assistance. For these DPs especially DP shown unwillingness, along with this certificate, audio recording of specific reasons as stated by the DP will be recorded (if possible) and documented. For deceased DP it is decided to make payment to dependents of the deceased DP. Similarly payment will be made to guardians of Minor DPs.

b. Impact on CPRs

29. Impact on CPRs is a very critical issue for the point of view of community. The community feeling is attached with the common properties especially with the religious structures. It is perceived that impact on large number of CPRs will be reduced because of realignment at the time of planning by the contractor (the possible list of CPRs already circulated to contractor) as necessary understanding of mitigation has been provided to contractor from time to time. However issues related to CPRs arising during implementation will be resolved through community/stakeholders consultation and providing engineering solution by avoiding impact on common property in the subproject.

c. Change of Scope or alignment – Revision of RP

30. Revision/updating of RP will be mandatory whenever there is change in scope, further, periodic revision in RP would be done in order to address issues of missing DPs/ voluntary refusal for compensation or any other minor issues identified during implementation of RP or validation and verification of DPs like difference in actual spelling in the name of DPs in comparison to names written in RPs or any other minor issues like typographical errors etc. It is important to mention that as per Resettlement Framework, revised RP of towns prepared and submitted to ADB considering APs on both side of the roads, however in case impact is mitigated on these identified APs (in the RP) the same will be also incorporated in the revised RP as detailed above.

F. CURRENT STATUS OF RP –IMPLEMENTATION

31. Up to this reporting period, total 7 nos of contracts have been signed and work is under progress in 5 packages. NTP for package no- RUSDP/BHL/01 and RUSDP/HNM/01 has been issued on dated 11.9.2017 & 20.11.2017 respectively and no physical work has started. Table- 5 provides the status of works and detail description of current Implementation status of the projects are provided in Table- 6 to Table- 8.

F.1 Project Impacts Minimization

32. Upto last reporting period 28 DPs under package no- RUSDP/Tonk /01 and 63 DPs under package no- RUSDP/Pali /01¹¹ were reported mitigated. 63 nos of DPs (Under package no- RUSDP/Pali /01), were reported mitigated in 2 stretches i.e. Surajpole Circle to Ahinsa Dwar (night work with no sewer work required) & Purana Bus Stand to Mandia Road upto STP (out of total 68 DPs, 32 DPs reported mitigated as per joint site visit report and alignment details).

33. However, later, the work of pipe laying in DP area of Puran Bus Stand to Mandiya Road was re-planned and was executed/ being executed in very small patches (namely Purana Bus stand upto Nehru Garden, Nehru garden to anuwat dwar and Anuwat Dwar to STP) to facilitate impact mitigation on DPs. Further, the contractor revised alignment and has conducted night work. Written confirmation of change of alignment, Night work etc was received and work is being executed after revised joint site visit. Accordingly, at present out of total 68 DPs coming under stretch named Purana Bus Stand to Mandia Road upto STP, 58 DPs are mitigated and reported in this Report.

34. During this reporting period, impact were also minimized on 50 nos of DPs (coming under Over Bridge to Kheteshwar area, Subhash Circle to Mill Gate area and Mill Gate to Over Bridge area) under package no- RUSDP/Pali /01. In this patches Water supply and sewer pipeline works were laid by contractor on the right side of the road, due to which impact on left side vendors was totally avoided. Joint site visit of PIU/PMDSC and Contractor was held and accordingly work was executed.

35. Due Diligence Report of work execution / mitigation of DPs under current reporting period and upto Nov 2017 is presented in table 9 & 10 :

F. 2 Entitlements, Assistance and Benefits

36. All DPs who are identified in the subproject areas on the cut-off date will be entitled to compensation for their affected assets (if any), and rehabilitation measures (as outlined in the entitlement matrix attached in Table 11) sufficient to assist them to improve or at least maintain their pre project living standards, income-earning capacity and production levels. Vulnerable DPs will be given priority in project construction employment and provided with additional special assistance for income restoration support. Compensation and assistance to DPs will be made prior to possession of land/assets (if any) and prior to the start of civil works in particular stretch.

F. 3 Compensation and Rehabilitation

37. DPs are provided 30 days advance notice to ensure no or minimal disruption in livelihood. In accordance with the RF, provisions are made for DPs in the Resettlement Budget for livelihood assistance, shifting assistance and assistance for vulnerable DP wherever applicable. If DP's daily income is less than Minimum Wages (at the time of disbursement) as per Government of Rajasthan Minimum Wages Act, then Compensation rate has to be calculated on the basis of minimum wage (unskilled labor), issued from time to time. As a good practice/ past learning of RUIDP, an inflation of 7% (Flat) will be paid to DPs (after a delay of 1 Year) to cover the time lag of survey and final implementation. Vulnerable DPs will be given priority in project construction employment. Micro Plan is prepared by the Resettlement Expert of PMDSC. The prepared Micro Plan will be duly verified by the concerned PIU.

38. Of the total 3429 DPs, 1064 DPs belong to the vulnerable groups (BPL, ST, WHH, disabled persons etc). All the DPs will be compensated and/or are being compensated in accordance with the agreed entitlement matrix of RPs. DPs would be compensated for 14 days disturbance as per RF however, if the duration of impact is more they will be compensated for the entire period of disturbance after due verification from PIU. The shifting assistance would also be provided to kiosks and those DPs who are vulnerable and are entitled for additional assistance. If any structure gets temporarily affected, then also the contractor would re-establish that particular structure after the project is over. Besides this assistance, for access, ramps would be provided in front of residences and shops to provide required access to people and also the mobile vendors would be assisted in shifting to nearby area or to the opposite side of the road when construction in that particular stretch would take place. The loss of frontage/ structures if any would be borne by the contractor and this has been included in the contractor's TOR.

39. Ensuring there is no income or access loss during sub-project construction is the responsibility of contractors. Consistent with the initial environmental examination, contractors will ensure: leaving spaces for access between mounds of soil, providing walkways and metal sheets to maintain access across trenches for people and vehicles where required, increased workforces to finish work in areas with impacts on access, timing of works to reduce disruption during business hours, phased construction schedule and working one segment at a time and one side of the road at a time.

G. STATUS OF LABOUR AT SITE:

40. Regular Site visit to project towns are being conducted by the Safeguard team of PMDSC to observe the site conditions, availability of labour, engagement of female workers and basic facilities (Lodging, drinking water, Sanitation etc) available for them in the site, health and safety management at site. Till date, there is no case of child labourer found at the construction site. Interaction with labour during site inspection is carried out to understand their health and safety measures, no such issues have been encountered so far. As a good initiative contractor has constructed a recreation centre in Pali, Ganganagar and Jhunjhunu for labour and has started crèche for the children (if parents are working on site). All Contractors are maintaining Attendance Register, Grievance Register, Wage register etc as per applicable laws.

41. Dissemination of information and orientation on HIV/AIDS and other STDs are being provided to the labor residing on the various labor camps as a part of the health and hygiene

awareness program conducted by the Contractor in program towns. Periodic visits of Safeguard Expert of PMDSC were conducted as a part of the program to ensure healthy living conditions at the labor camps. Contractor representatives and labor are also oriented by the PMDSC Safeguard Team on the importance of equal wages for men and women involved in the construction activities. H. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION AND CONSULTATION

42. A series of meetings and consultations with DPs and other stakeholders were done by the ASO of PMDSC regarding scope of the project, entitlement options, impacts etc. at different stretches during RP implementation (**Attached in annexure 8**). During Implementation, PMDSC is conducting Public Consultation meetings focussing on R&R Implementation Activities/ Procedures which includes discussion on opening of Bank A/c and modalities of disbursement of Assistance. PIU/ contractor has been informed that 30 days advance notice is to be provided to DPs before Civil Works are initiated (in that section) and disbursement should be completed prior to the start of Civil Work by Contractor. Information also continues to be disseminated to DPs and beneficiaries through various media.

43. To oversee the entire information dissemination and for creating required public awareness, CAPC consultant has been mobilized (in RUIDP PH III) and a separate Social Expert cum Gender Specialist has been deputed in all project town by CAPC. List of

activities performed by CAPC Expert with support from Outreach team is attached in **annexure 6**). Summarized information of awareness activities are presented in the report.

44. In the month of July an orientation program been organised in Jhunjhunu and Tonk for ward councillor and project officials. The primary objective of the Orientation Workshops is to discuss Sectorial Urban Reforms being undertaken in the III Phase of RUIDP and seek coordination of Elected Representatives and ULBs in successful implementation of various development interventions of RUIDP.

45. Orientation training programme on Municipal Solid Waste Management for the Ward Councillors and Officials and Functionaries from Nagarpalika and line departments held at Sri Ganganagar on 27 Sep 2017. This event was planned upon request from the Commissioner, Sri Ganganagar. It was an interactive event where Ward Councillors and Officials and other representatives from PIU, Sri Ganganagar Nagar Parishad, PDMC, Contractor and media participated. Municipal SWM Expert from IPE, Dr Bharat Bhusan Nagar discussed various aspects of MSWM such as Swacch Bharat mission, Swacch Sarvekshan 2018, status of Rajasthan and Sri Ganganagar in the overall ranking of swacch Sarvekshan 2017, various rules and Acts of MSWM, various technology options for waste to energy.



I. COMMUNITY & WOMEN PARTICIPATION IN RUIDP PROJECT

46. A component of Community Awareness & Participation Consultants (CAPC) has been introduced in RUIDP Phase III so as to ensure coordinated efforts between executing and implementing agencies as well as public, private and community stakeholders. Delhi based international consultancy agency IPE Global Limited, along with Jaipur based Cogent has been identified as the Community Awareness & Participation Consultants (CAPC) for Phase III.

47. Throughout each phase of subproject and especially during RP implementation, women's participation is being ensured through a gender participation to determine the project's possible impacts on women. It is found that majority of women in the project area are involved in household work. During discussion, women pointed out that each urban infrastructure development project mainly water supply, waste water etc. will provide better health and hygiene, access to health services, higher levels of education, economic opportunities, and social interactions. A good number of women participants attended the public consultation in each project town as during door to door campaigns the housewives were encouraged for participating in the project.



48. Staffs involved in CAPC are trained and various issues such as awareness on HIV Aids, health & hygiene, safe drinking water, sanitation, increasing decision making capacity among women, providing equal wages, ending their exploitation, improving the political participation of women, increasing the security of women engaged as wagedworkers, providing affordable healthcare and HIV infections etc are addressed through public consultation meetings.

49. Town-wise gender participation is an on-going activity and status of CAPC activities (till date) is provided in annexure 6.

50. Contractors are also giving employment opportunity for women in the project works and provision of Health and Safety, Sanitary Facility, Personal Protective Equipment are also provided for them. Time to time Health and Safety Training are being organized by the contractor to create awareness about use of PPEs. In addition to this, Contractors are

providing crèche facilities, so that women workers can leave behind their children in crèche and work in construction sites. This initiative is facilitating women workers and ensures required safety for children.

J. GRIEVANCE REDRESS MECHANISM (GRM)

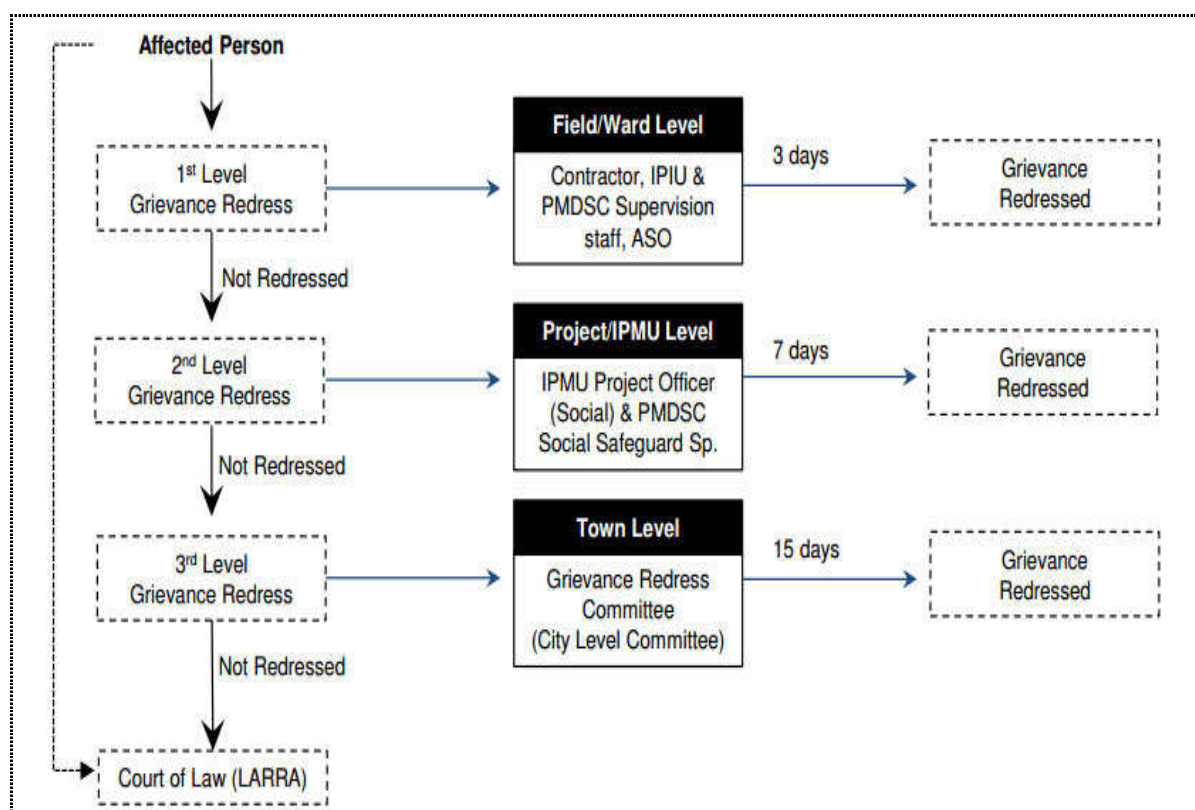
51. A Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) has been established following the Resettlement Frameworks (RF) of the project with the objective of receiving and facilitating the resolution of complaints & grievances by DPs. The GRM is scaled to the risks and adverse impacts of the project. It should address DPs concerns and complaints promptly, using an understandable and transparent process that is gender responsive, culturally appropriate, and readily accessible to all segments of the DPs at no cost and without retribution.

52. In this regard the City Level Committee (CLC) is acting as a grievance redress committee (GRC) under the chairmanship of District Collector with representatives from the ULB, state government agencies, PIU, community-based organizations (CBOs) and NGOs. As a GRC, the CLC meets at regular intervals based on the availability of the CLC /GRC members and also as per requirement or pending issues. Failing the redressal of grievance at any stage, DPs may take the case to Court of Law. The grievance redress mechanism is provided at Figure 1.

53. PIUs, Contractor and CAPC have been entrusted with the responsibility to maintain a proper register of the grievance (if any) which will be endorsed by the all agencies involved in implementation. GRC registers are in place at the towns.

54. In this quarter, some complaints of the people were received and they were resolved satisfactorily (**Refer annexure 9**). No complaints/grievances from affected households received although work has started in DP areas.

K. INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENT

55. The Local Self Government Department (LSGD) is the executing agency responsible for overall technical supervision and execution of all subprojects funded under the Program. The Implementing Agency is the Program Management Unit (PMU) of the on-going Rajasthan Urban Infrastructure Development Project (RUIDP), to coordinate construction of subprojects and ensure consistency across the towns Project Implementation Unit (PIU) has been established.

56. PMU Social Project Officer (SPO) will be assisted by a PMDSC Resettlement Expert. The Resettlement Expert will (i) update the existing resettlement plans based on the detailed design; (ii) assist in the monitoring and supervision of ongoing subprojects and RP and IPP implementation; (iii) prepare resettlement plan and/or IPPs for new subprojects, where required to comply with national law and/or ADB procedure; (iv) ensure all subprojects meet safeguard requirements as agreed in the loan covenant and in line with this resettlement framework; (v) review and finalize all reports in consultation with the PMU SPO (RP updating and preparation, preparation of semi-annual social safeguard monitoring report for PMU submission to ADB, and support GRM implementation).

57. At each PIU, one Engineer will be designated as Nodal Officer and one Engineer from PMDSC Site Office will be appointed as a Coordinator, will be responsible for day to

day monitoring of EMP and Implementation of RP. Nodal Officer of PIU will assist PMU SPO in implementation of the social safeguards at the PIU level. The PIUs will be responsible for implementation of the resettlement plan. PIUs will undertake internal monitoring and supervision and record observations throughout the project period to ensure that the safeguards and mitigation measures are provided as intended.

58. For monitoring of implementation of Resettlement Plan, an additional Safeguard Staff / Assistant Safeguard Officer (ASO) for each project town is being appointed by PMDSC, who will be working under the supervision and Guidance of PMDSC Resettlement Expert. The task of ASO will be as follows:

- 1 Develop rapport between the potential displaced persons (DPs)/ project affected persons (APs) and the project authorities by regular meeting with the project staff and consultation with the DPs/APs. All meetings and decisions taken are to be documented.
- 2 The RP implementing agency (NGO)/Support Staff will work as a link between the PIU/PMU, the community leaders and the DPs/APs. The agency will be responsible for assisting the DPs/APs during physical resettlement, if any and rehabilitation process and shall ensure that all of the provisions laid down in the RP are implemented appropriately and effectively. The agency's task will be as follows but not restricted to these alone.
- 3 To communicate closely with identified (identified through census survey conducted for Resettlement Plan¹⁶) potential displaced persons (DPs)/ project affected persons (APs) and provide them timely information of construction schedule, distribute identification cards, educate them on their entitlements under the Resettlement Plan and Resettlement Frame Work, shifting DPs/APs during civil work execution in appropriate manner without hampering their income or assets;
- 4 Assist displaced persons (DPs)/ project affected persons (APs) in ;
 - In opening bank accounts (if not already available with APs/DPs), disbursement of compensation livelihood losses and resettlement assistance (as per provisions of RF) and ensure that DPs/APs obtain their full entitlements under the Resettlement Plan.
 - Assist DPs/APs in getting the compensation for their land and properties acquired for the project and in receiving resettlement assistances as per RP.
 - Organize consultation and discussion meetings with the DPs/APs, the community leaders and other stakeholders throughout RP preparation and implementation phases.

- To organize consultation and discussion meetings with the DPs/APs, the community and other stakeholders throughout RP implementation phases with proper documentation.
 - Ensure disbursement of compensation against livelihood losses, resettlement assistance (vulnerable assistance, shifting assistance, structure losses assistance, crops/trees losses assistance) as per entitlement matrix.
- 5 Assist the SPOs of PIU / Social Development Expert PMDSC / PMU in following works ;
- Disclosure of RP, Cut of Date in vernacular language at public places & project affected persons and preparation of internal RP implementation monitoring reports.
 - Distribution of one month advance notice, to in affected areas that on following date the civil works will be started in following areas and timely shifting of Squatters and Encroachers from temporary impact zone during construction if required. ;
 - Registering grievances of DPs/APs (the grievance redress mechanism (GRM) already established) and assist to PIU in resolving grievances at PIU level or GRM level.
 - Preparation and update DPs/APs database, with reference to changed design/ alignment with respect to census cut-off-date, preparation of internal monitoring report.
 - Accompanied with PIU / PMU during ADB mission visit in their project town.
 - Third Party validation of voluntary refusal of compensation by DPs/APs / voluntary donation land by land lord without any cost and assess need of land acquired;
 - Conduct market survey for income restoration program and link the DPs/APs to the respective vocational trainings as well as Govt. welfare schemes (Project Director Development at district level) for income restoration and assist in relocation to identified sites, if applicable;
 - Assist in the identification of sites for the relocation of cultural properties and community assets, especially for the affected Indigenous Peoples' community, if affected due to project. This is to be done in consultation with the affected IP community and the ULB.
- 6 To support PIU with grass-root skills and capacity for field activity in the implementation of the Resettlement Plan by coordinating DPs/APS with city level Social development Expert cum Gender Specialist of CAPC¹⁷.

- A separate Community Awareness and Participation Consultants (CAPC) have already been appointed in the project. CAPC is entrusted with the responsibility to orient and link the DPs/APS to the respective vocational trainings for income restoration. RP implementation Agency will coordinate with CAPC in linking APs/DPs, who have lost permanently income assets or major downfall in monthly income due to project intervention, to income generating schemes of Government of Rajasthan. CAPC and Implementing Agency will also assist DPs/APS through skill development department (RSLDC) to create alternative source of income generation. CAPC team will conduct DPs/APS related activities as indicated (including but not limited to) below:
- Orient and link the DPs/APS to the respective vocational trainings for income restoration.
- Assist the DPs/APS in the redress of grievances through the Grievance Redress mechanism established as part of the Resettlement Plan; and make the DPs/APS aware of GRM at several levels. Sort out grievances and assist the DPs/APS to have access to the several tiers of grievance redress mechanism, including the contractors at site and to the SPO at PIU, and finally town level GRC. If necessary will accompany the aggrieved DPs/APS, especially the vulnerable ones, to appropriate GRC members and see through the grievance redress mechanism till the DPs/APS get redressed.
- Orientation for optimum utilization of the compensation money by the DPs/APS, particularly the vulnerable DPs/APS under the economic rehabilitation program.
- Assist APs/DPs in getting benefits from various government development programs particularly for income restoration/ generation, if desirable by the DPs/APS. The CAPC will co-ordinate the training programs for sustainable livelihood and assist in identifying the required skills for livelihood rehabilitation and the training institutes to impart skills. The CAPC shall coordinate with other government departments and other NGOs working in the area to ensure that all the skill development trainings are known to the DPs to select from the list the appropriate training.

Figure 2: Institutional Arrangement

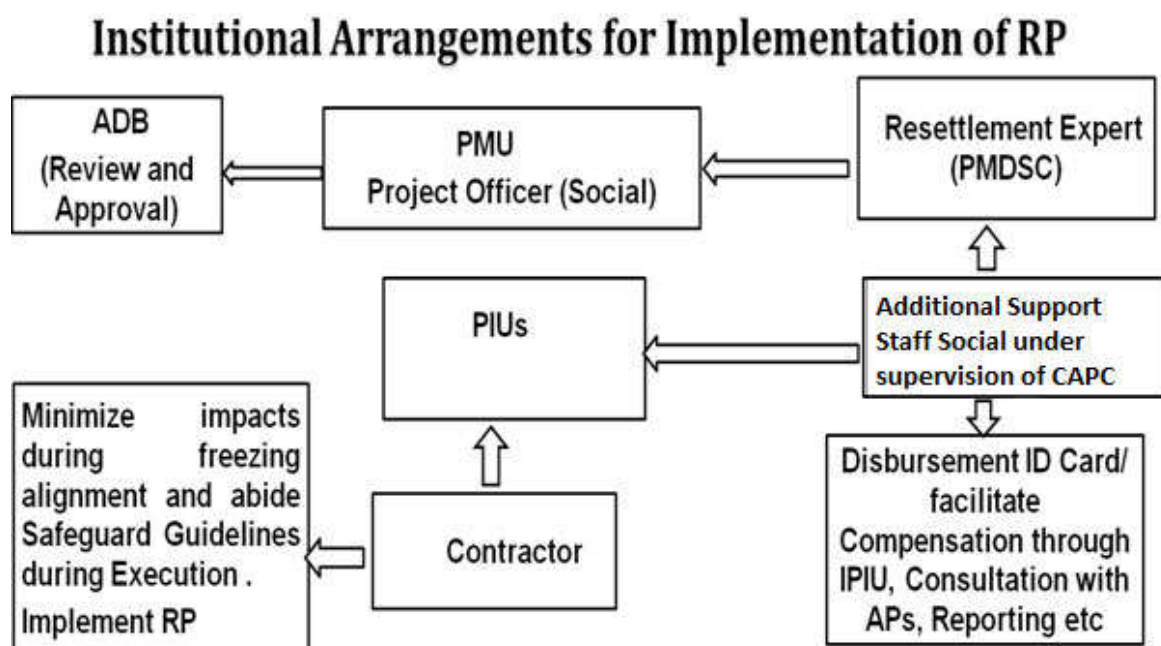

L. MONITORING RESULTS – FINDINGS

59. Up to this reporting period, total 7 nos of contracts have been signed and works are going for 5 packages, which are under different stages of implementation. Drafts RPs for all these contracts which are under execution were updated and approved by ADB. Approach and access are made available for the movement of the public. In some areas impact is envisaged on the road side vendors during laying of water supply and Sewer networks as confirmed by contractor and implementation of RP (Distributed of ID Cards, Collection of account details, Micro plan etc) is being done by the Town Safeguard Officer/ ASO and compensation was disbursed to the DPs through treasury.

60. Contractor of Package no- RUSDP/PALI/01 has started works in some of the DP areas (as per SIA) as per agreed strategy and methodology. As agreed Joint Site Visits of Contractor /PMDSC/PIU were/are being conducted in all the areas (as per SIA) for confirmation of impact and work is being allowed after implementation of RP including disbursement of compensation (if any). During this reporting period, assistance was paid to 57 DPs. IR impacts were also mitigated on 76 road side vendors in the different patches due to minor changes in alignment and night works.

61. Under RUSDP/PALI/02, Physical works executed in one of the DP areas and assistance was paid to 3 DP.

62. Contractor of Package no- RUSDP/ JJJ/01 has started works in some of the DP areas (as per SIA) and as per agreed strategy and methodology, Joint Site Visits of Contractor /PMDSC/PIU were/ conducted and payment was disbursed to 38 DPs before start of civil works.

63. In Tonk under package no-RUSDP/Tonk/01, most of the works is being taken up in core residential areas; however, in few DPs areas trenchless Sewer work was done. Water supply pipeline alignment are still not finalized in these areas and once the water supply alignment is finalized, a Joint site visit will be held and if impact will be envisaged, RP implementation will be started.

64. Civil works at Sri Ganagnagar RUSDP/SGN/01 has also started and presently works being taken up in residential areas, where no DPs were identified during SIA. Work plan for some of the DP areas has received during reporting period. Joint site visit of Contractor /PMDSC/PIU are conducted and RP implementation will be done shortly.

65. No impact on CPRs like Garden, hand pumps; public water tanks in the working areas were reported and access to none of the identified CPRs was blocked.

66. Draft, RPs for the Bhilwara and Hanumangarh town prepared by PPTA will be updated, prior to the start of civil works. Survey agency for conducting Socio-Economic survey of Bhilwara town has been engaged and works will be stated shortly. Visual screening and Transect walk has already been done and it is confirmed that for all the sub-project, no land acquisition is required and all the impact will be non-significant.

67. SOT team has been mobilized in each town except Bhilwara but it is strongly felt that the team is not adequate. Contractors have been instructed through PMU to mobilize 2-5 members (subjected to targets of CAPP & RP activities) in SOT per DMA at the earliest. SOT team.

N. GOOD PRACTICES AND LESSON LEARNT

69. Good Practices adopted at RUSDP Project (including but not limited to) are as below:-

- PIU in each town is monitoring implementation and Resettlement experts and Support Social Staff of PMDSC are visiting PIUs at regular intervals for regular monitoring. At each PIU, one Engineer is designated as Nodal Officer and one Engineer from PMDSC Site Office is appointed as a Coordinator. The appointed officials are responsible for day to day monitoring of EMP and Implementation of RP
- Additional Safeguard Officer has been mobilized in Tonk, Pali, Jhunjhunu, Ganganagar and Bhilwara to assist Nodal officer, PIU for monitoring implementation of the RP.
- CLC/ GRCs have been established at all 6 towns and meeting is being held regularly in all the towns.
- Contractor is mobilizing local residents/ female workers for construction works/ activities as desired under ADB Policy.
- Regular workshops are being organized at the nodal headquarters at Jaipur to discuss all cross cutting issues like standardization, tendering, social and environmental safeguards etc.
- Orientation program with Project Contractors/PIU/PMDSC are being conducted by PMDSC safeguard Expert Regularly for facilitate the contractor for compliance of safeguard issues.
- Contractors at Pali, Tonk, Jhunjhunu & Sri Gangangar Town have a separate Corporate Social Responsibilities (CSR) program and various activities are being organized by the contractors with due consultation of CAPC team. The goal of CSR activities is to encourage a positive impact through its activities on the environment, consumers, employees, communities, stakeholders and all other members of the public sphere.

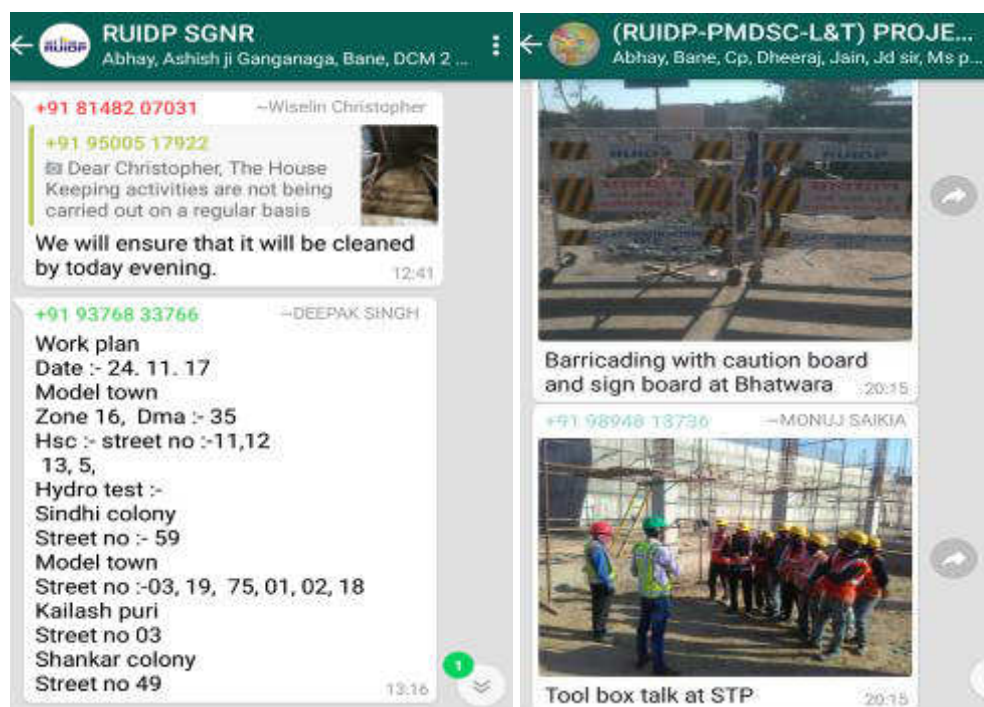

- IT Based Project Monitoring and Grievance Redress Approach has been adopted by RUIDP and IT based supervision software i.e. "Smart Check" has been deployed. The Software is operational and direct monitoring of project is being done by higher officials of RUIDP.
- Along with progress information & work schedules, on site Quality, Social and Safety issues are being brought on common platforms (like Whatapp close groups), for

getting desired advice from PMDSC Quality Team and Safeguard Team. Frequent advice and prompt corrective actions provided by PMDSC actually facilitate the desired output as the contractor and support engineers are getting the required understanding during the execution.



N1 Lessons Learnt

70. Implementation of RP in true spirit will require due commitment from both Contractor and PIU and clear understanding of the “NO HARM” approach is mandatory for both the involved agencies. Frequent Orientations provided by PMDSC actually facilitate the desired output as the contractor is provided the required understanding before the civil work execution starts. Visits organized/being organized by PMDSC every month actually motivates the involved agencies along with PIU/PMU and conducting Regular Review Meeting at PIU and PMU level will further facilitate implementation of RP and will actually complement civil works.

71. Employment generation by making mandatory for contractors to employ local labour /female workers for construction works (unskilled works) wherever applicable creates a good vibe for the project.

72. Reputed Contractor like L&T has required understanding of EHS policy which actually complements the ADB labor, health & safety provisions.

73. Petty vendors mostly offer to shift voluntarily if dissemination of information is made in timely manner and transparency in monetary disbursement is ensured to them.

74. Public generally don't resist to pay charges for utilities if proper services are provided to them. They rather support in easy execution of works.

75. Imposing penalty cannot provide a guaranteed solution, sometimes; sincere persuasion gives better results than imposing penalties. Despite of DBO contract, RUIDP Smart Check is a big leap towards smart ownership of the project.

76. Team efforts and igniting the sense of belonging is important for this type of project which needs commitment right from Design stage to Operation stage. Coordinating skills of PIU is a major factor for success of DBO projects due to option of sectional milestone and commissioning which could be utilized for providing early benefit to public.

77. The Program objective is to improve the economic development by providing the infrastructure and service in the water supply and sewerage sector. The improvement of quality of life and thereby effective contribution of beneficiary people in the economic activity is expected. Under RUIDP Project, as per contractual obligation, it is mandatory for every Contractor to have a strong Public Relations and Community Outreach team. RUIDP is regularly issuing instructions with respect to judicious utilization of the Social Outreach team.

78. Frequent GRC/CLC meeting ensure better coordination between the various departments and creates a transparency in operations.

O. ASSESSMENT OF SOCIAL SAFEGUARDS ISSUES, RECOMMENDATION AND CONCLUSIONS:-

O1 Issues

- Non finalization of exact alignment or design even after submission of SIP by contractor resulting in noncompliance to ADB's Conditional approval of RP - Desired compliance to the ADB conditional approval is pending due to delay at contractor's end.
- The methodology of joint site visits (before initiation of any civil work in particular stretch) although being pursued regularly is not being taken up seriously from contractor's side. It is necessary that the alignment for all the identified areas (as per SIA) should be provided to additionally appointed RP implementation officer immediately so that the RP implementation could be done in a time bound manner. It is necessary that contractor should provide schedule of work/ Night work to the mobilized officer so that the required monitoring is carried out.
- ADB R&R requirements are new to all of the contractors and additional Safeguard officers mobilized in town are facing problems due to unavailability of adequately strengthened Outreach team. Despite of regular follow up from PIU/ PMU the Outreach team of contractor's are either not mobilized or are not sufficiently strengthened.
- DBO contract modality is new to the mobilized Safeguard Officer and it is taking time to get adjusted as the desired support from the contractor's team is not been provided. Further, the desired information of work schedule is not reaching from the

contractor/ contractor's outreach team to Safeguard Officer, PMDSC .Communication gap between Contractors, Engineering team and Safeguard Team may result in delay in planning of implementation of RP. Since implementation of RP is also under the scope of contractor.

- As per contract agreement, RP implementation and awareness program are to be conducted by contractor's outreach team but the specific budgetary provisions are not defined in contract document. In absence of which, corrective actions cannot be enforced. Hence, it is felt that deployment of supervisory staff will not be of any use till the contractor realizes the latent obligation of the contract.
- Involvement of various agencies (as per ADB requirement) with different scope of work has created a multidimensional team with varied potentials and strength to be management by PIU. PIU has to manage, RP implementation team, Social Outreach Team and CAPC consultant team jointly and judiciously so that the desired compliance to ADB policies especially ADB SPS 2009 is ensured. Judicial/ independent use of Contractor's Outreach team and CAPC Team for community awareness with proper monitoring of routine and specific activities is required from PIU end.
- Involvement of labour contractors by main contractor creates ambiguity with respects to safety and labour welfare.
- In earlier projects (RUIDP-I and II), compensation was provided through ADB share however in this project it is to be provided from State share.

O2 Recommendations

79. PMU should ensure that the Service Improvement Plan (SIP) which actually comprises study of existing system along with DPR of the package and conducting detailed surveys and designs to analyse the deficiencies and aims at proposing Designs, Estimates and a time bound program for improvement in services to achieve the performance indicators as desired by the Employer should also include a section on RP implementation so that the strategy to be adopted by the contractor for mitigation of adverse impact on DPs/ CPRs (implementation of RP) is disclosed in a timely manner. It will also ensure final alignment freezing in a bona fide manner as desired by ADB SPS (2009). Further Since, at present SIP of Pali, Tonk, Jhunjhun and Sri Ganganagar does not provide clarity on strategy for R&R implementation, PIU/Employers Representatives need to ensure that details of final alignment freezing (being done DMA/Zone wise) should be provided to the Resettlement Expert of PMDSC/Town Implementing Team/ CAPC timely so that implementation of RP is carried out in a time bound manner.

80. Modalities for the compensation of R&R payment should be kept as simple as possible as they were in earlier projects of RUIDP and the mechanism intended should be expedited as the micro plan for payments are already prepared and circulated to the concerned PIU and contractor.

81. It should be ensured that no further delay (especially in Tonk) is done by the contractors in providing the required support for compliance to ADB and countries legal requirements. All the contractors should be made aware that the compliance to Social and Environmental safeguard is a contractual obligations and once a contract has been awarded, it is the prime responsibility (clauses already incorporated in the contract) of the contractor to ensure compliance of not only of applicable law and regulations but he is also responsible for compliance of ADB requirements.

82. Special attention from PIU will be required towards RP implementation as the total number of APs handled and nature of impact / contract is different from the packages handled by RUIDP in past. In other words the success of the project will depend on the better utilization of resources to be strictly/ timely monitored by PIU. Responsibility of each and every implementation officer should be made clear and activity based monitoring should be carried out. Contractor's Social outreach team with adequate manpower should be mobilized immediately with adequate budgetary sanctions. Contractor should mobilize 2-5 members (subjected to targets of CAPP & RP activities) in SOT per DMA at the earliest, CAPC to provide required guidance and coordination. Women participation in SOT to be ensured.

83. Necessary training to the outreach team/ Implementation officer should be provided by CAPC and they should be regularly monitored to actually evaluate each team.

84. Contractors should lead their own way (although the same will continue to be monitored by CAPC) and CAPC activities should be kept separate to demark the achievement and understanding / compliances of contractors.

85. The project implementation staffs should take active participation in RP implementation and information related to work should be shared upfront to the Coordinator, Nodal officers and RP implementation officer appointed for each town.

86. PIU should organize advance site visit (along with R&R team at site / core) for all the areas planned for pipe laying (at least 2 months in advance) and should allow work only if all the R&R issues identified in RP are addressed.

87. All Nodal officer / Coordinator should organize a monthly meeting (under chairmanship of SE PIU) at their respective town with all the safeguard teams (ACM PMDSC, CAPC & Contractor) between 1-5th of each month.

O3 Conclusions

88. In conclusion, certain characteristics may be mentioned as RUSDP complements the past and ongoing efforts of the government of Rajasthan (GOR) to improve water supply and waste water services to the residents of the state of Rajasthan. They are as below:

- Rapid urbanization created a strong demand for the output of water supply/waste water treatment projects. There will be positive impacts on intended beneficiaries, particularly women as they are the primary users of water which is needed for all household activities including cleaning utensils, washing clothes, cooking etc.

- PIU team has to strictly convey to all contractors (especially in Tonk) that the prime responsibility of overall labour welfare and safety cannot be delegated at all and any noncompliance will be taken up seriously.
- Although the Executing Agencies (EAs) is highly involved in project implementation and there is an ability in EA to learn from past lessons and incorporate the same in project implementation, technical innovation and a positive impact on the environment will occur due to commitment shown by the Executive Agencies but still there is a need to create necessary understating to ADB policies and procedures in a timely manner to the newly established field team and to the contractor as well.
- CAPC team needs to take a lead and bring observable changes in the work culture of contractor and in the awareness level of different stakeholders. To avoid the repetition of work, it is required that CAPC team should give a structure to Contractor's outreach team and a free hand (monitoring will still be with CAPC) and concentrate on the prime objective of CAPC, i.e. benefit realization of public. Necessary training to the outreach team/ Implementation officer should be provided by CAPC and they should be regularly monitored to actually evaluate each SOT team.
- Consultants are trying to perform well and it is expected that regular ADB review missions will proactively help to solve problems (if any) and uplift the performance to higher level. .
- Successful RP implementation will require upfront planning and close monitoring from EA especially PIU team.
- Overall progress of work (including R&R work) at Tonk is very slow and needs intervention of PMU.

Annexure 1: Summary of RP

A Pali Water Supply and Sewerage project

1. **Sub-project Scope.** Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP) will complement the past and ongoing efforts of the government of Rajasthan (GOR) to improve water supply and waste water services to the residents of the state of Rajasthan. It comprises (i) a program, financed by a policy-based loan, to support policy reforms, including institutional development and governance improvement in the urban sector in the state, and (ii) a project, financed by a project loan, to invest in water distribution network and sewerage systems in the six project cities in the state¹.

2. This Resettlement Plan (RP) document is prepared for proposed Water Supply and Sewerage Sub-projects in Pali and is in line with the Resettlement Framework (RF) prepared for the implementation of social safeguards under RUSDP. Currently, Water supply service in Pali is unreliable coupled with quality issues and huge distribution losses. At present, there is no sewerage system and a majority of the population disposes sewage through septic tanks. Effluent from septic tanks and sullage, and sewage from houses without septic tanks is let off into open drains which ultimately collect in low-lying areas in the outskirts of the town.

3. The sub-projects includes: Water Supply: (i) Distribution network improvement (249km new pipelines and 542km replacement); (ii) provision of bulk water meters (iii) provision of house service connections including consumer meters; Sewerage: (iv) laying new sewers (309.87km); (v) provision of sewer connections to houses and (vi) sewage treatment plant (15 MLD, capacity sequential batch reactor based).

4. Summary of Resettlement Impact Consistent with the subproject selection criteria, rehabilitation is prioritized over new construction to avoid / minimize involuntary resettlement impacts. Construction of 1 nos of new sewage treatment plant (STP) will be undertaken in government land which is under Pali Nagar Parishad possession and no new land acquisition is required (**Revenue record are attached in annexure 2**).

5. The main resettlement impacts will be due to laying of water supply and sewerage pipe networks. Pipes will be laid within road rights-of-way (RoW), and will not require land acquisition or cause permanent displacement, but will cause temporary access disruptions and possible temporary losses in income during construction. It has been noted during site inspections that laying of pipe line may cause temporary loss of access/disruption to livelihood during civil works to 645 vendors/traders located at both sides of road. These are majorly non-titled movable /transitory structure (push carts etc.)² owners. As per information from design engineers, maximum number of days the vendors will experience loss of access/disruption of livelihood is 14 days which can be further minimized by scheduling civil works at night time or non-market day and laying of pipeline in phases. Temporarily affected persons (APs/DPs) will be assisted in moving to the other side of the road and returning their structures after construction is completed. Where moving is not required, access will be ensured by the contractor through measures prescribed in bidding documents. List of Aps will be bifurcated /separated after freezing of alignment/finalization of Service Improvement Plan (SIP) by the contractor.

6. To further minimize construction impacts, work will be executed during the early hours of the day in order to avoid inconveniences to the public as well as traders and vendors. All safety norms would strictly be adhered to depending on the magnitude of work and the sensitivity of the location. The Project Implementation Unit (PIU) will also ensure that all the necessary rules related to safety and security of the public and residents are followed by the contractor. The actual dates of construction schedule with respect to rush hour, festival time, and special business days have been discussed with vendors, squatters, market committee members, and residents, and intimated to the contractor for planning construction activities. After laying of pipes the lane/road will be restored to its original condition (including bitumen, cement concrete (CC) and CC interlocking tiles as applicable). Orientation program with Project Contractor and PIU was held on 10.12.2015 and safety issues were deliberated in detail. (See Annexure 10 to 12).

7. **Categorization.** This subproject has been categorized as “B”³ for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. This resettlement plan (RP) is developed as per Detail Project Report (DPR)⁴ and as per agreed Resettlement Framework (RF).

8. **Public Consultations and Disclosure:** Consultations were carried out during RP preparation and will continue throughout the subproject cycle. The social safeguard team carried out preliminary consultations, through focus group discussions (FGDs) and meetings with the affected persons (APs/DPs) as well as the general public from August 2015 to Feb, 2016. FGDs were conducted with the DPs where in policy related issues, i.e., displacements and other issues like compensation and assistance, input to alternative design were discussed. During consultation meetings, participants were of the view that this subproject is important and very much needed. All participants are pleased and committed to support the implementation of the project. There was no opposition for this subproject.

9. Final RPs will be made available near affected area, and PIU and PMU offices. The sub-project RPs will be disclosed in ADB’s website and the PMU websites. Leaflet prepared in local language (Hindi) has been distributed to the Affected Persons in the month of January (2016) for understanding the sub-projects scope, R& R provision and GRC system under this project. Cut-off-date for temporary impacts has been communicated to DPs through NGO and disclosed in the project affected area on dated 24.02.2016.

10. **Policy Framework and Entitlements.** The policy framework and entitlements for the program are based on national laws: the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013⁵, (ii) National Rehabilitation and Resettlement Policy, (NRRP) 2007 (iii) ADB SPS, 2009; and agreed RF.

11. **Compensation and Income Restoration:** The implementing agency will provide compensation in accordance with the entitlement matrix of the updated RF. As a policy, all affected persons will be provided 30 days advance notice to ensure minimal disruption of livelihood. Compensation will be completed prior to start of civil works. If required, they will also be assisted to temporarily shift for continued economic activity. For example they will be assisted to shift to the

other side of the road where there is no construction. Ensuring there is no income or access loss during sub-project construction is the responsibility of contractors.

12. **Grievance Redress Mechanism.** Grievances of DPs/APs will first be brought to the attention of the Contractor, PIU and implementing NGO. They can immediately resolve issues on-site in consultation with each other, and will be required to do so within 3 days of receipt of a complaint/grievance. All grievances that cannot be redressed within 3 days at field/ ward level will be brought to the notice of Social Project Officer (SPO) of PMU. PMU SPO will resolve the grievance within 7 days of receipt of compliance / grievance in discussion with the PIU, CAPC/ NGO and the Contractor. All the grievances that are not addressed by PMU within in 7 days of receipt will be brought to the notice of the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC). The City Level Committee (CLC), which will be established in every project town, will act as GRC. The GRC will resolve the grievance within 15 days of receiving the complaint. An aggrieved person shall have access to the country's legal system at any stage, and accessing the country's legal system can run parallel to accessing the GRM and is not dependent on the negative outcome of the GRM. The IPIU will keep records of all grievances received including: contact details of complainant, date of the complaint received, nature of grievance, agreed corrective actions and the date these were effected, and final outcome. All costs involved in resolving the complaints will be borne by the PMU. The GRCs will continue to function throughout the project duration.

13. **Institutional Arrangements:** The Local Self Government Department (LSGD), Government of Rajasthan (GoR) will be the Executing Agency (EA) of the Project and will be responsible for overall strategic approvals, guidance, monitoring the execution of the project. The current Project Management Unit of RUIDP, under the LSGD, will be the Implementing Agency (IA) for the project. IA will execute and monitor the RUSDP implementation. Six Project Implementation Units (PIUs), one each of in six project towns, shall be setup for implementation. PMU will support PIUs in implementation, management and monitoring of the project. PMU and PIUs will be assisted by Programme Management, Design and Supervision Consultants (PMDSC). At state-level an inter-ministerial Empowered Committee (EC) will be established to provide overall policy direction and City Level Committees (CLCs) will be established in each town to oversee the implementation at town level. The PMU will be assisted by a PMDSC social safeguards specialist (PMDSC SSS). For updating the resettlement plans, assist in the monitoring and supervision of ongoing subprojects and RP and IPP implementation, prepare resettlement plan and/or IPPs for new subprojects, where required, to comply with national law and/or ADB procedures; ensure all subprojects meet safeguard requirements as agreed in the loan covenant and in line with this resettlement framework. CAPC/NGO will be responsible for assisting in the RP implementation.

14. **RP Implementation and Monitoring:** All compensation is to be paid prior to start of civil works. RP implementation will be closely monitored by PIU with an effective basis for assessing resettlement progress and identifying potential difficulties and problems. The PIU, with assistance from PMDSC SSS, will prepare monthly and quarterly progress report in terms of physical and financial indicators. In addition, the monitoring process will also look into: the communication and reactions of affected persons; use of grievance procedures; information dissemination to affected persons on benefits; and options and implementation time table, livelihood and living standard of affected persons in pre and post-project situations. Report prepared by PIU will be compiled by the PMU on a semi-annual basis for its due submissions to ADB.

15. **Resettlement Budget:** The resettlement cost estimate for the Pali Water and Sewerage subproject includes resettlement assistance, as outlined in the entitlement matrix, support cost for RP implementation and contingency provision amounting to be 5% of the total cost. Funds for resettlement will be released in a timely manner. The total resettlement cost for the subproject is INR **5310495**. The resettlement cost items and estimates are outlined in RP (Ref Table 8 of RP). The CAPC / implementing NGO will be involved in facilitating the disbursement process, and will facilitate opening bank accounts for the affected persons who do not have bank accounts. Payment of the compensation will be ensured before the start of civil works.

B Tonk Water Supply and Sewerage project

1. **Sub-project Scope:** Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP) will complement the past and ongoing efforts of the government of Rajasthan (GOR) to improve water supply and wastewater services to the residents of the state of Rajasthan. It comprises (i) a program, financed by a policy-based loan, to support policy reforms, including institutional development and governance improvement in the urban sector in the state, and (ii) a project, financed by a project loan, to invest in water distribution network and sewerage systems in the six project cities in the state⁶.

2. Tonk, the project town, is situated at a Distance of 100 Kms from Jaipur on the Jaipur-Kota NH- No. 12. Tonk is a district headquarter and has a population of 1,65,294 persons as per census 2011. Tonk is surrounded by river Banas & Central Aravali region on the northern side with an average altitude of 300 M from Mean Sea Level. Tonk is an important industrial town for Leather, carpet, Namda and Bidi Works. Tonk is located at 26°.00' N latitude and 75°.47' East longitude. Tonk does not have any Connection by rail and Nearest Railway station is Niwai. Nearest Airport is Sanganer, Jaipur which is about 85 km. away from Tonk.

3. This Resettlement Plan (RP) document is prepared for proposed Water Supply and Sewerage Subprojects in Tonk and is in line with the Resettlement Framework (RF) prepared for the implementation of social safeguards under RUSDP. Currently, water supply service in Tonk is unreliable coupled with quality issues and huge distribution losses. At present, there is no sewerage system and a majority of the population disposes sewage through septic tanks. Effluent from septic tanks and sullage, and sewage from houses without septic tanks is let off into open drains which ultimately collect in low-lying areas in the outskirts of the town.

5. Summary of Resettlement Impact Consistent with the subproject selection criteria, rehabilitation is prioritized over new construction to avoid / minimize involuntary resettlement impacts. Construction of 2 nos of new sewage treatment plant (STP) and Construction of Elevated Service Reservoirs (ESRs)-2 nos will be undertaken in government land which is under Tonk's Nagar Parishad possession and no new land acquisition is required (**See Annexure 2 to 10**), where as one nos of ESR(Sawaimadhopur Road) is under the possession of Water Resource Dept and NOC has

been taken from WRD (**See Annexure 11**). One nos of ESR(Ramdware) is under the jurisdiction of Forest Dept and NoC is awaited.

Pipes will be laid within road rights-of-way (RoW), and will not require land acquisition or cause permanent displacement, but will cause temporary access disruptions and possible temporary losses in income during construction. It has been noted during site inspections that laying of pipeline may cause temporary loss of access/disruption to livelihood during civil works to 1006 vendors/traders located at both sides of road. These are majorly non-titled movable /transitory structure (push carts etc.)⁷ owners. As per information from design engineers, maximum number of days the vendors will experience loss of access/disruption of livelihood is 14 days which can be further minimized by scheduling civil works at night time or non-market day and lying of pipeline in phases. Temporarily affected persons (APs) will be assisted in moving to the other side of the road and returning their structures after construction is completed. Where moving is not required, access will be ensured by the contractor through measures prescribed in bidding documents. List of Aps will be bifurcated /separated after freezing of alignment/finalization of Service Improvement Plan (SIP) by the contractor.

7. To further minimize construction impacts, work will be executed during the early hours of the day in order to avoid inconveniences to the public as well as traders and vendors. All safety norms would strictly be adhered to depending on the magnitude of work and the sensitivity of the location. The Project Implementation Unit (PIU) will also ensure that all the necessary rules related to safety and security of the public and residents are followed by the contractor. The actual dates of construction schedule with respect to rush hour, festival time, and special business days have been discussed with vendors, squatters, market committee members, and residents, and intimated to the contractor for planning construction activities. After laying of pipes the lane/road will be restored to its original condition (including bitumen, cement concrete (CC) and CC interlocking tiles as applicable). Orientation program with Project Contractor and PIU was held on 15.12.2015 and safety issues were deliberated in detail (**See Annexure 18**).

8. **Categorization.** This subproject has been categorized as “B”⁸ for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. This resettlement plan (RP) is developed as per Detail Project Report (DPR)⁹ and as per agreed Resettlement Framework (RF).

9. **Public Consultations and Disclosure:** Consultations were carried out during RP preparation and will continue throughout the subproject cycle. The social safeguard team carried out preliminary consultations, through focus group discussions (FGDs) and meetings with the affected persons (APs) as well as the general public from August 2015 to January, 2016. FGDs were conducted with the DPs where in policy related issues, i.e., displacements and other issues like compensation and assistance, input to alternative design were discussed. During consultation meetings, participants were of the view that this subproject is important and very much needed. All

The Commissioner, MC, Pali submitted proposal to district collector for transfer of land in the name of Pali M.C. for the construction of SR at Mandia at Jodhpur Road.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. **Sub-project Scope.** Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP) will complement the past and ongoing efforts of the government of Rajasthan (GOR) to improve water supply and waste water services to the residents of the state of Rajasthan. It comprises (i) a program, financed by a policy-based loan, to support policy reforms, including institutional development and governance improvement in the urban sector in the state, and (ii) a project, financed by a project loan, to invest in water distribution network and sewerage systems in the six project cities in the state³³.
2. Sri Ganganagar is headquarter of Sri Ganganagar District, and is situated in the northern most part of Rajasthan State, close to international border with Pakistan. It is located at about 470 km north of State Capital, Jaipur and 425 km northwest of the National Capital, Delhi. Sri Ganganagar is one of the six project towns selected for implementation of the ADB funded Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP).
3. Water supply at present in Sri Ganganagar is intermittent, unreliable and suffers with huge losses and quality issues. There is no sewerage system in the town. Currently, sewerage project is under implementation by Sri Ganganagar Urban Improvement Trust (UIT) with technical support of the RUIDP. Due to lack of sewerage system, most of the households depend on septic tanks for disposal of sewage. Effluent from septic tanks and sullage is let off into open drains which ultimately discharge into streams and ponds. This subproject is formulated to address gaps in water and sewerage infrastructure in a holistic and integrated manner. The main objective of the RUSDP is to improve water efficiency, security, and provide safe sewage collection, and with the on-going investments in sewage treatment, this will have an important effect on public health and environment.
4. The sub-projects includes: **Water Supply:** (i) Construction of one WTP (20 MLD); (ii) Construction of Raw Water Reservoir (372 ML capacity) at Nathawali (iii) Provision of Raw Water Storage at abandoned canal at Sadhuwali (309 ML capacity) (iv) Construction of five nos of pump houses (v) Construction of 4 nos. of Clear Water Reservoirs (vi) Clear Water pipe lines-36 KM (vii) Distribution pipe lines- 419 KM (viii) provision of bulk water meters (ix) provision of house service connections with consumer meters. **Sewerage:** (i) laying new sewage collection networks (410 KM out of which 47.5 KM by trenchless method); (ii) construction of one SPS of 5.22MLD capacity; and (iii) provision of sewer connections to houses. Project scope also includes O&M of the created assets for 10 years.
5. This Resettlement Plan (RP) document is prepared for proposed Water Supply and Sewerage Subprojects in Sri Ganganagar and is in line with the Resettlement Framework (RF) prepared for the implementation of social safeguards under RUSDP.
6. Summary of Resettlement Impact Consistent with the subproject selection criteria, rehabilitation is prioritized over new construction to avoid / minimize involuntary resettlement impacts. Construction of 1 nos of new Water treatment plant (WTP), Provision of Raw Water Storage at abandoned canal at Sadhuwali (309 ML capacity), Construction of Raw Water Reservoir (372 ML capacity) at Nathawali, Construction of five nos of pump houses, Construction of 4 nos. of Clear Water

Pipes will be laid within road rights-of-way (RoW), and will not require land acquisition or cause permanent displacement, but will cause temporary access disruptions and possible temporary losses in income during construction. It has been confirmed through transect walks and SIA (followed by 100% Socio-Economic Survey) that laying of pipeline may cause temporary loss of access/disruption to livelihood during civil works to 983 vendors/traders located at both sides of road. These are majorly non-titled movable /transitory structure (push carts etc.)³⁴ owners. As per information from design engineers, maximum number of days the vendors will experience loss of access/disruption of livelihood is 14 days which can be further minimized by scheduling civil works at night time or non-market day and lying of pipeline in phases. Temporarily affected persons (APs) will be assisted in moving to the other side of the road and returning their structures after construction is completed. Where moving is not required, access will be ensured by the contractor through measures prescribed in bidding documents.

8. To further minimize construction impacts, work will be executed during the early hours of the day in order to avoid inconveniences to the public as well as traders and vendors. All safety norms would strictly be adhered to depending on the magnitude of work and the sensitivity of the location. The Project Implementation Unit (PIU) will also ensure that all the necessary rules related to safety and security of the public and residents are followed by the contractor. The actual dates of construction schedule with respect to rush hour, festival time, and special business days have been discussed with vendors, squatters, market committee members, and residents, and intimated to the contractor for planning construction activities. After laying of pipes the lane/road will be restored to its original condition (including bitumen, cement concrete (CC) and CC interlocking tiles as applicable). Orientation program with Project Contractor and PIU was held on 02.02.2017 and safeguard issues were deliberated in detail. (See Annexure 9).

9. It is pertinent to inform that this project is Design Build and Operation (DBO) contract and even though the DPRs are being prepared by consultants (PMDSC), the final design/alignment/confirmation has to be provided/ prepared by Contractor. Taking a note of above SIA and census and socio economic survey (100%) of the entire town was conducted and now even if some minor changes are made by the contractor in final DPR there will be no change in categorization of RP as these minor changes (in case the impacts are further minimized by scheduling civil works at night time or non-market day and lying of pipeline in phases etc.) may at it maximum result in reduction of DPs. Letter has been issued to Contractor through Employers Representative (ER), on dated 21.04.2017 for freezing of alignment of DP Areas. (See annexure 3)

10. **Categorization.** This subproject has been categorized as “B”³⁵ for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. This resettlement plan (RP) is developed as per Detail Project Report (DPR)³⁶ and as per agreed Resettlement Framework (RF).
