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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP) complements the past and ongoing efforts of the Government of Rajasthan (GOR) to improve water supply and wastewater services to the residents of the state of Rajasthan. It comprises (i) a program, financed by a policy-based loan, to support policy reforms, including institutional development and governance improvement in the urban sector in the state, and (ii) a project, financed by a project loan, to invest in water distribution network and sewerage systems in the six project cities in the state.¹

2. Sri Ganganagar is one of the six project towns selected for implementation under RUSDP. Sri Ganganagar is district headquarters, situated in the northernmost part of Rajasthan State, close to the international border with Pakistan and located at about 470 km north of state capital, Jaipur and 425 km northwest of the national capital, Delhi.

3. Sri Ganganagar Town water supply and sewerage scheme is one of the subprojects under the investment component of RUSDP. Water supply at present in Sri Ganganagar is intermittent, unreliable, and suffers from huge losses and quality issues. Currently, a sewerage project is under implementation by Sri Ganganagar Urban Improvement Trust (UIT).

4. This subproject is based on Design Build & Operate model (DBO) and is currently under implementation. During the finalization of the Service Improvement Plan (SIP)², based on technical requirements, the location of Sewer Pumping Station (SwPS) has been changed, and the land of Consumer Relation Management Centre (CRMC), Master Control Centre (MCC) and Central Control Centre (CCC) building has been identified. An additional Raw Water Pumping Station (RWPS) is proposed near the raw water reservoir (RWR) in the public health engineering department (PHED) campus at Nathawali and Clear Water Pumping Station at 4E PHED campus has been dropped. Besides this, a few additional areas, which were missed out during the detailed project report stage under the sewerage component, were included in the sewerage network coverage. Thus, during SIP, the length of the sewer network has been increased from 410 to 422.85 km while the overall length of the water supply network has been reconfirmed to be 451.18 km in place of 455 km.³ The resettlement plan (RP) has been updated to include these changes. It is further confirmed that all other components remain unchanged. Details of changed components are as below:

5. After SIP, final components of the sub-projects include: **Water Supply:** (i) Construction of one water treatment plant (WTP) - 20 million liters/ per day (20 MLD); at public health engineering department (PHED) Campus Nathawali; (ii) Construction of Raw Water Reservoir (372 ML capacity) at PHED Campus Nathawali; (iii) Provision of Raw Water Storage at abandoned canal at Sadhuwali (309 ML capacity); (iv) Construction of five numbers of pump houses (PS) - 03 numbers Clear Water Pump house (Sugar Mills area, Sadbhawana Nagar, Nathawali) and 02 numbers Raw Water Pumping Station (Sadhuwali&Nathawali); (v) Construction of 4 numbers of Clear Water Reservoirs (CWRs) at Nathawali, Sugar Mill area, Sadbhawana Nagar and 4E Village; (vi) Clear Water pipe lines-37.18 km; (vii) Distribution pipe lines - 414 km; (viii) provision of bulk water meters; (ix) provision of house service connections with consumer meters- 54408; and (x) Rehabilitation of RWR, OHSRs, WTP, CWRs and raw water pumping station(RWPS). **Sewerage:** (i) laying new sewage collection networks (422.85 km out of which 47.5 km by trenchless method); (ii) construction of one sewerage pumping station (SwPS) of 5.22 MLD capacities; (iii) provision of sewer connections to houses; and (iv) CRMC- 4 nos, MCC-1 nos, and CCC-1 nos. The project scope also includes operation and maintenance (O&M) of the created assets for 10 years.

6. **Summary of Resettlement Impact:** The construction of water treatment plant (WTP), Raw Water Reservoir (372 ML capacity) at Nathawali, Clear Water Reservoir (CWR) at the main campus at 4E, Direct Pumping station at Sadbhawana Nagar and PHED headworks are being executed within the existing PHED Campus. Raw Water Storage works at the abandoned canal at Sadhuwali (309 ML capacity) is been undertaken in the available land which is under the possession of the Water Resource Department, GOR. CWR and pumping station at sugar mill area and CWR at Sadbhawana Nagar are under progress in the land which is under the possession of Rajasthan Sugar Mill and Urban Improvement Trust (UIT). The impact assessment was done initially, and it was confirmed that vacant lands for the aforesaid works were available.

7. Vacant land for construction of CCC, MCC, two CRMC buildings and raw water pumping station was identified within the existing PHED campus while vacant land under the possession of Municipal council (MC) has been identified for construction of remaining two CRMCs. The construction of one SwPS of 5.22 MLD capacity is also proposed on the government land. Due diligence/ field visits/ transect walk (that were conducted by a team including staff of PMDSC, department of urban local body, Project contractor and safeguard staff from PIU/PMDSC) also revealed that vacant land was identified in PHED campus, Green Park and Sukharia Park where CRMC/MCC/CCC/RWPS works have been undertaken.

8. The length of the pipe network of the town has changed during SIP, anticipating this possibility, while preparation of RP, people carrying on business activities (on both sides of the road) in the entire town were considered as the potential affected persons (AP) and socio-economic data was collected for the entire town. The new areas added in the sewerage work (12.85 km) are mostly residential areas, and there is no change in the number of people likely to be impacted. **As per due diligence, there is no addition to the**

APs list due to this change of scope. Accordingly, the cut-off date remains unchanged i.e., 09.03.2017.

9. The subproject would continue to have only temporary resettlement impacts due to laying of water supply and sewerage pipe networks. Pipes are being laid within road rights-of-way (RoW) and does not require land acquisition or cause permanent displacement, but cause temporary access disruptions and possible temporary losses in income during construction. The subproject is expected to cause only temporary loss of access/disruption to livelihood during civil works to vendors/traders located at both sides of the road (983 vendors/ transitory structure identified in social impact assessment (SIA)). These are majorly non-titled movable/transitory structures (pushcarts, etc.)⁴owners.

10. The vendors are likely to experience loss of access/disruption of livelihood for a maximum of 14 days, which is minimized further by scheduling civil works at night-time or non-market day and laying of pipeline in a phased manner. During the implementation, the actual number of APs is expected to be reduced through trenchless works, night works, working only on the one side of the road or shifting the temporary APs to the other side of the road and returning after construction is completed or working on another side of the road with no APs. The assistance will be provided to APs while shifting to another side of the road and back. Where shifting is not required, the contractor is ensuring access through measures prescribed in bidding documents. The area-wise implementation details are being provided in the semi-annual monitoring reports (SMR).

11. **Categorization:** Previously, this subproject was categorized as “B”⁵ for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. As per the due diligence conducted for the project, after SIP, no additional APs are identified, and the subproject category continues to remain “B”. This updated RP has been prepared as per the SIP and complies with the agreed resettlement framework (RF).

12. No adverse impacts are anticipated on Indigenous People (IP) under the subproject, and no Indigenous Peoples Plan is required to be prepared.

13. **Public Consultations and Disclosure:** The consultations are being conducted regularly, and consultations were also carried out during updating of RP. The social safeguard team is conducting preliminary consultations, through focus group discussions (FGD) and meetings with the APs as well as the general public. FGDs conducted with the APs were on policy-related issues, i.e., displacements and other issues like compensation and assistance, input to alternative design, are discussed. During consultation meetings, participants were of the view that this subproject is essential and very much needed. All participants are pleased and committed to supporting the implementation of the project.

14. Updated RP will be made available near the affected area and project implementation unit (PIU) and project management unit (PMU) offices. Updated RP will be disclosed on the ADB and the PMU websites. Leaflet prepared in the local language (Hindi) has been distributed to the affected persons in the month of March-April (2017) for understanding the sub-projects scope, R&R provision and grievance redressal mechanism (GRM) under the project. Cut-off-date (**09.03.2017**) for temporary impacts has been

communicated to all APs through survey agency and disclosed in the project affected area. There will be no change in the cut-off date as the survey data remains unchanged.

15. **Policy Framework and Entitlements:** The policy framework and entitlements for the program are based on national laws: the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, (RFCTLARR), 2013⁶, (ii) ADB SPS, 2009; and agreed RF.

16. **Compensation and Income Restoration:** The compensation will be provided in accordance with the entitlement matrix of the RF. As a policy, all APs are provided 30 days advance notice to ensure minimal disruption of livelihood. Compensation is completed prior to the start of civil works.

17. **Grievance Redress Mechanism.** GRM has been established under this sub-project. As per mechanism, grievances of APs will first be brought to the attention of the Contractor, Social Development Expert of CAPC, R&R Implementing officer, PMDSC (Safeguard Staff of PMDSC), and PIU. They can immediately resolve issues on-site in consultation with each other and will be required to do so within three days of receipt of a complaint/grievance. All grievances that cannot be redressed within three days at the field/ward level will be brought to the notice of the Social Project Officer (SPO) of PMU. PMU SPO will resolve the grievance within seven days of receipt of compliance/grievance in discussion with the PIU, CAPC/ Safeguard Staff, and the Contractor. All the grievances that are not addressed by PMU within seven days of receipt will be brought to the notice of the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC). The City Level Committee (CLC) has been established in every project town and is acting as GRC. The GRC will resolve the grievance within 15 days of receiving the complaint. An aggrieved person shall have access to the country's legal system at any stage, and accessing the country's legal system can run parallel to accessing the GRM and is not dependent on the negative outcome of the GRM. The PIU will keep records of all grievances received, including contact details of the complainant, date of the complaint received, nature of the grievance, agreed corrective actions and the date these were affected, and outcome. The PMU will bear all costs involved in resolving the complaints. The GRCs will continue to function throughout the project duration.

18. **Institutional Arrangements:** The Local Self Government Department (LSGD), GoR is the Executing Agency (EA) of the project, and responsible for overall strategic approvals, guidance, monitoring the execution of the project. The PMU of RUIDP, under the LSGD, is the Implementing Agency (IA) for the project. Six PIUs, one each in six project towns, have been set up for implementation. PMU provides support to PIUs in the implementation, management, and monitoring of the project. PMU and PIUs are assisted by PMDSC. The PMU is assisted by a PMDSC's Social Safeguards Specialist (SSS). In addition to this, at the town level, Safeguard Implementation Officer (SIO) is appointed (as per recent variation in PMDSC Contract on the recommendation of ADB) to support the Contractor's outreach team in RP implementation.

19. **RP Implementation and Monitoring:** PIU closely monitors the RP implementation with assistance from PMDSC. The monitoring process covers payment of compensation to APs, grievance redressal, information dissemination to APs on benefits options, implementation schedule, and livelihood. The PMU will bear all costs involved in resolving the complaints and living standards of affected persons in pre and post-project situations. The PIUs prepare the reports on resettlement implementation, which are further compiled by PMU with support from PMDSC's SSS on a semi-annual basis for onward submissions to ADB. Till December 2019, a payment of Rs 446084 - has been disbursed to 61 impacted

APs out of 983 potential APs. The area-wise implementation details are provided in the semi-annual monitoring reports.

20. **Resettlement Budget:** The resettlement cost estimated for this subproject is **INR 7569931**. PIU is issuing sanction order for payment of APs, and compensation is disbursed through electronic clearance service/National Electronic Fund Transfer (ECS/NEFT) directly into the bank account of APs through concerned Treasury (State Share). The APs are being compensated as per the minimum wage rate applicable at the time of disbursement date, and in case, the daily income of APs are less than minimum wages (as per GoR Minimum Wages Act) then APs will be paid minimum wages (unskilled labour) for 14 days as livelihood assistance. Further, an inflation of 7% (Flat) is given to APs (after a delay of 1 Year) to cover the time lag of the survey and final implementation.

RESETTLEMENT PLAN

A. Sub-project Description

1. Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Program (RUSDP), building on the previous two Asian Development Bank (ADB) funded projects: Rajasthan Urban Infrastructure Development Project (RUIDP) and Rajasthan Urban Sector Development Investment Program (RUSDIP) also referred as RUIDP I and II respectively, supports the Government of India (GOI) in their policy of balanced regional socio-economic development and poverty reduction through improvements in urban governance, management, and infrastructure and service provision in six selected cities⁷ in Rajasthan. The selected cities are particularly district headquarters with more than 100,000 population and the ones which were not benefitted under the previous two ADB funded urban sector projects. With the main focus on the improvement of water supply and sewerage services, proposed RUSDP will be implemented over six years beginning in 2014 through ADB's Sector Development Programme (SDP).

2. Sri Ganganagar is one of the six project towns selected for implementation of the ADB funded RUSDP. The main objective of the RUSDP is to improve water efficiency, security, and provide safe sewage collection. With the on-going investments in sewage treatment, this will have a significant impact on public health and the environment.

3. Water supply at present in Sri Ganganagar is intermittent, unreliable, and suffers from huge losses and water quality is also an issue. Presently, there is no sewerage system in the town. However, a sewerage project has been initiated under the Urban Infrastructure Development Scheme for Small and Medium Towns (UIDSSMT) Program and is being implemented by Sri Ganganagar Urban Improvement Trust (UIT). This program covers the construction of three STPs (of total capacity 10 + 15 + 10 = 35 MLD) along with laying of around 30 Km of sewer lines in the central part of the town. Due to a lack of sewerage system, most of the households depend on septic tanks for disposal of sewage. Effluent from septic tanks and sullage is let off into open drains, which ultimately discharge into streams and ponds.

4. This subproject is based on Design Build & Operate model (DBO) and is currently under implementation. During the finalization of Service Improvement Plan (SIP)⁸, based on the public consultations and technical requirement, location of Sewer Pumping Station (SwPS) has been changed, and the land of Consumer Relation Management Centre (CRMC), Master Control Centre (MCC) and Central Control Centre (CCC) buildings were identified. An additional Raw Water Pumping Station (RwPS) is proposed in the Public Health Engineering Department (PHED) campus, Nathawali near raw water reservoir (RWR) and Clear Water Pumping Station at 4E PHED campus has been dropped. During SIP, the length of the sewer network has been increased from 410 to 422.85 km while the overall length of the water supply network has been reconfirmed to be 451.18 km in place of 455 km. Accordingly, this resettlement plan (RP) is revised to indicate the final components of the project. All the revised locations have been carefully selected by the PIU/PMDSC and Contractor team and civil works are confined within the government land. Details of changed components areas below:-

5. During the SIP, missed out areas (within the municipal boundary) were included in the scope of the sewerage network to extend the coverage. The length of the sewer network has been increased from 410 to 422.85 km. The overall length of the water supply network has been re-confirmed (after detailed measurement survey) to be 451.18 km in place of 455 km.⁹ Since all the areas included in the sewerage components were residential areas, no additional affected persons (AP) were identified. Comparative detail of the previous and final length is provided in Table 2.

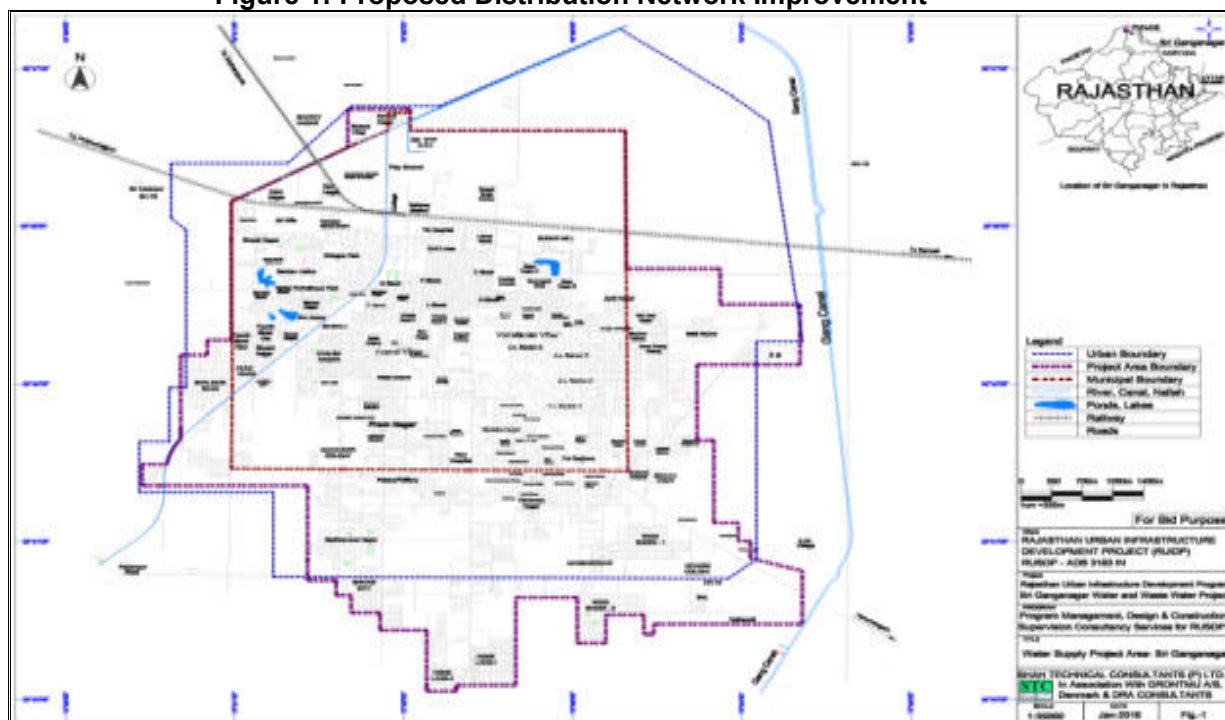

7. **Categorization.** This subproject was categorized as “B”¹⁰ for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. As per the due diligence conducted for the project, no additional APs are identified after SIP thus the subproject category continues to remain “B”. This updated RP has been prepared as per the SIP and agreed resettlement framework (RF).

8. No adverse impacts are anticipated on Indigenous People (IP) under the subproject, and is categorized as “C” for IP as per the SPS, 2009. No IP Plan is required to be prepared.

Figure 2: Proposed Sewer Network Coverage

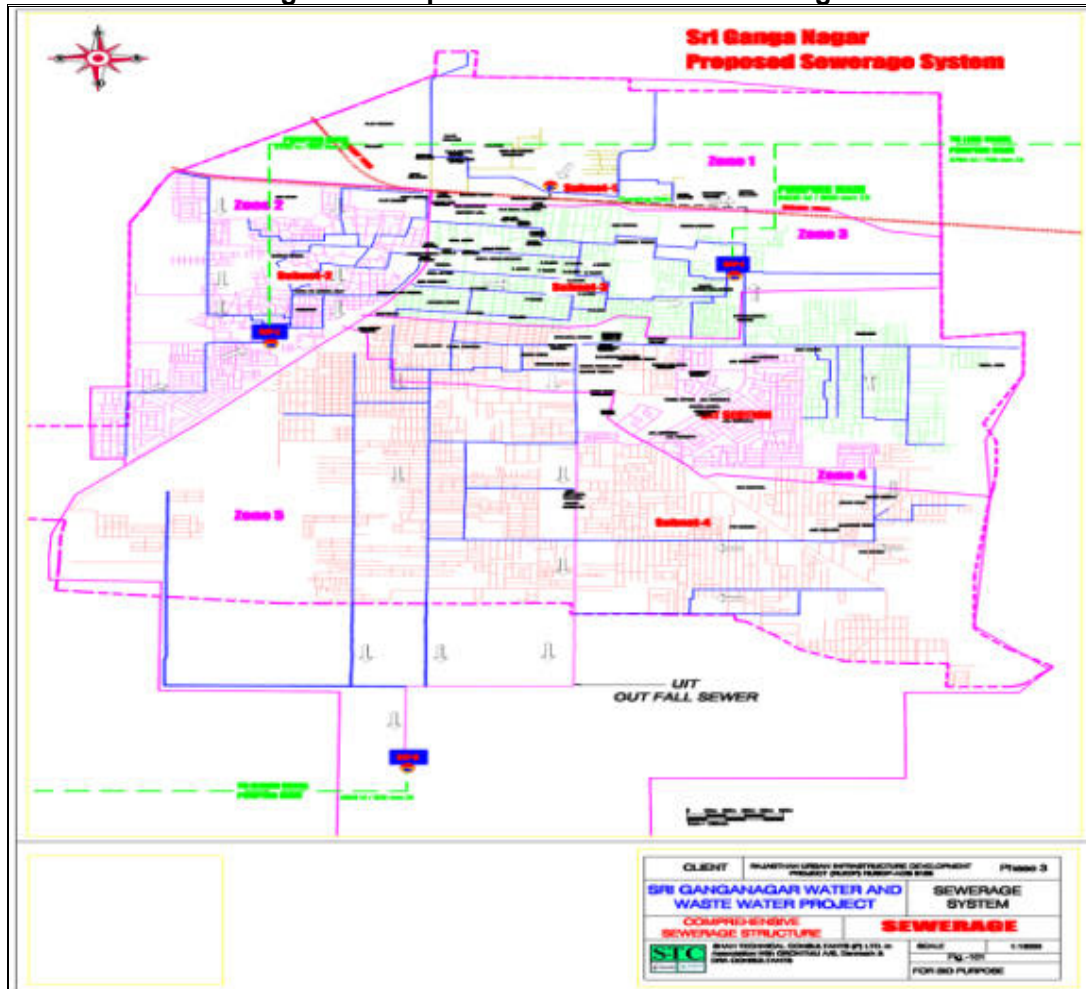
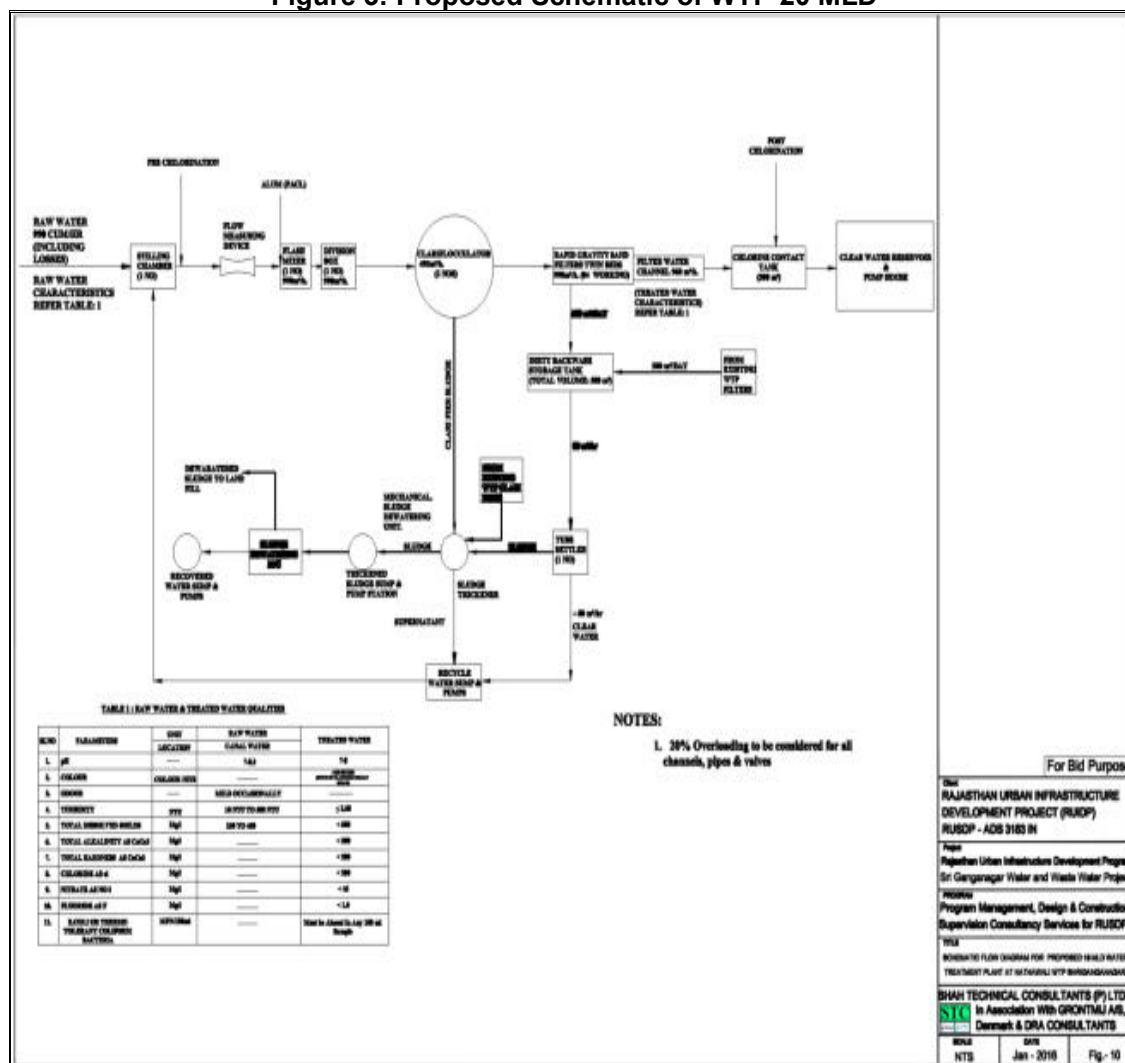


Figure 3: Proposed Schematic of WTP 20 MLD



B. Scope of Land Acquisition and Resettlement

9. The subproject does not require any acquisition of land. The construction of (i) new water treatment plant (WTP); (ii) Raw Water Reservoir (372 ML capacity) at Nathawali; (iii) CWRs at the Main Campus and at 4E; (iv) Direct Pumping station at Sadbhawna Nagar and PHED headworks; (v) CRMC (2 nos), CCC & MCC buildings; and (vi) Raw water pumping station at Nathawali will be undertaken within the existing PHED Campus. Raw Water Storage at the abandoned canal at Sadhuwali (309 ML capacity) will be constructed within the available land, which is under the possession of the Water Resource Department, Government of Rajasthan (GoR). CWR and pumping station at sugar mill area and CWR at Sadbhawna Nagar will be constructed on the vacant land, which is under the possession of Rajasthan Sugar mill and Urban Improvement Trust (UIT). Construction of the remaining two CRMC at Green Park and Sukharia Park will be constructed in vacant land, which is under the possession of Municipal Council (MC), while the construction of one SwPS of 5.22 MLD capacity, proposed near the railway track is also on government land. No land acquisition is required. **(Details are in Table 3 and NoCs are attached in Annexure1)**

10. Due diligence and necessary consultation with respect to the changed locations were undertaken by the Project Management Design and Supervision Consultant (PMDSC) team and it has been confirmed that no land acquisition is involved. Although, location of few proposed works has changed/finalized but construction is being done within existing premises of PHED, Sugar Mill and Municipal council (MC). During the SIP, the length of the pipe network of the town has also changed, anticipating this possibility, while preparation of RP, people carrying on business activities (on both sides of the road) in the entire town were already considered as potential affected persons (APs) and socio-economic data for entire town was collected and documented. Now since the new areas added in the sewerage work (12.85 Km) are residential areas there is no change in the number of people likely to be impacted. **As per due diligence, there is no addition in the DP list due to this change of scope.** The subproject is expected to cause only temporary loss of access/disruption to 983 non-titled movable /transitory structures (pushcarts etc.)¹¹ / vendors /traders located at both sides of the road (Ref **Annexure 2 and table 4 & 5 for further details**). During the implementation, it is expected, that the actual number of APs will be reduced through trenchless works, night works, etc. as prescribed in the contract. The area-wise implementation details are being reported in semi-annual monitoring reports.

11. Under this project, vendors are likely to experience loss of access and disruption of livelihood for a maximum of 14 days which is planned to be further minimized by scheduling civil works at night time or non-market day and by laying of pipeline in a phased manner. It is also proposed to assist the shifting of temporary APs to the other side of the road. The assistance will be provided to APs while shifting to another side of the road and also in returning back. Where shifting is not required, the contractor will be ensuring access through measures prescribed in bidding documents. The summary of resettlement impacts is provided in table 4. In case, the contractor fails to ensure access, PIU will compensate in accordance with the agreed entitlement matrix (EM).

12. Trenchless work¹² and night works are being taken up in high-density areas/ streets with all safety provisions. Extensive consultations are being made with the residents and shop owners and they are being informed about the upcoming works. It is also informed during consultation that, if there will be any temporary/permanent livelihood impacts due to trenchless or night works, APs will be compensated as per the agreed EM. Consents of shopkeepers received are enclosed in **Annexure 3**. The consultations will continue with the residents and shop owners throughout the project implementation.

13. To further minimize construction impacts, work is also being executed during the early hours of the day to avoid inconveniences to the public as well as traders and vendors. All safety norms are strictly being adhered to depending on the magnitude of work and the sensitivity of the location. The Project Implementation Unit (PIU) ensures that the contractor follows all the necessary rules related to the safety and security of the public and residents. The actual dates of construction schedule with respect to rush hour, festival time, and special business days have been discussed with vendors, squatters, market committee members, residents, and intimated to the contractor for planning construction activities accordingly. After laying of pipes, the lane/road is being restored to its original condition (including bitumen, cement concrete (CC), and CC interlocking tiles as applicable). Summary of sub-project components and possible IR impact are shown in **table 6**.

14. As indicated in the draft RP, it is pertinent to inform that this project is a performance-based contract, and even though the detailed project report (DPR) was prepared by consultants (PMDSC), the final design/alignment confirmation/SIP has been prepared by the Contractor. Since SIA (census and socio-economic survey {100%}) of the entire town has already conducted, there is no change in the categorization of the subproject and continues to remain “B” for Involuntary Resettlement (IR) impact as per the ADB’s Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009.

15. **Impact on Common Property Resources:** Extent of impacts on Common Property Resources (CPRs) has also been assessed. As of now, there is no impact envisaged on any CPRs. However, there are some sensitive receptors close to the sub-project alignment (**Table7**). The contractor has been instructed to take due care during implementation.

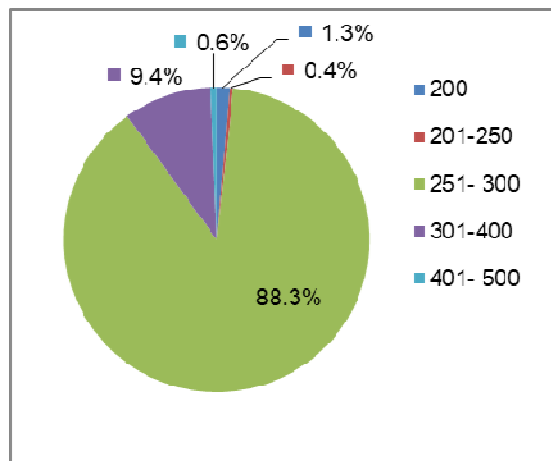
C. Socio-economic Information and Profile

16. The following sections present the socio-economic profile of the households likely to be affected by the proposed works. To estimate the temporary impacts, a series of transect walks were conducted; this was followed by a 100 percent census and a socio-economic survey conducted in the areas where the works are to be taken up (**Sample format is attached in Annexure 4**). The baseline information collected through the survey provides the socio-economic conditions of affected households. A wide range of data including social category, type of losses, type of occupation, sources of income, choice of resettlement, etc. has been collected by conducting the census and a socio-economic survey among likely project affected households. (**Summary of the socio-economic profile is attached in Annexure 2**).

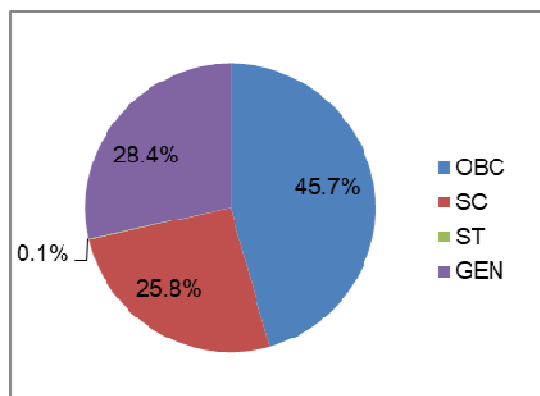
17. The database provides a broad understanding of the social and economic conditions of project-affected persons (APs) and the likely impacts that people would experience due to proposed works. A selected set of socio-economic information is discussed in the following sections to establish the profile of the project affected persons. The database generated through household socio-economic survey would be used by the monitoring and evaluation consultant for evaluation of the resettlement plan objectives.

18. Respondents were asked to provide monthly income against the business. For analysis, the income groups to which the households belong are provided below.

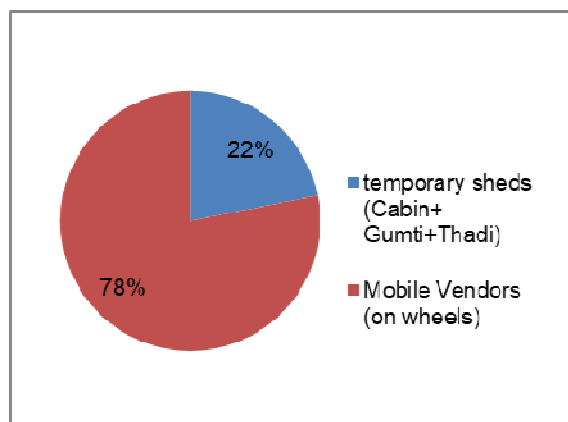
19. **Income:** No households with a monthly income of less than or equal to Rs. 2500/- per month was identified. 1.3 % of the households likely to be affected have an income of Rs. 200 per day. 0.4% of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs. 201-250 per day. 88.3 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.251-300 per day. 9.4 % of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs.301- 400 per day. 0.6% of the households likely to be affected belong to the income category between Rs. 400 - 500 per day. The average earning of these people is approximately Rs. 309/- per day, and the average household income works out to be Rs. 9270/- per month.



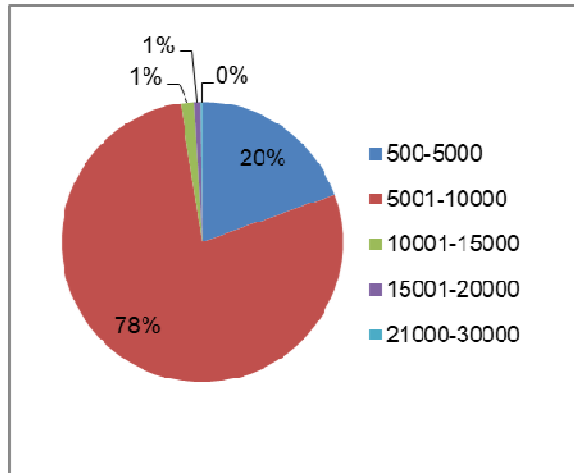
20. **Cast:** Households likely to be affected as per social category have been presented in **Annexure 2**. General Caste comprises 28.4%, Other Backward Castes (OBC) comprises 45.7%, Scheduled caste comprises 25.8% and Scheduled Tribe comprises 0.1% of the total households likely to be affected. It may be noted that OBC constitutes the majority in the overall social profile in the Sri Ganganagar, closely followed by the general castes.



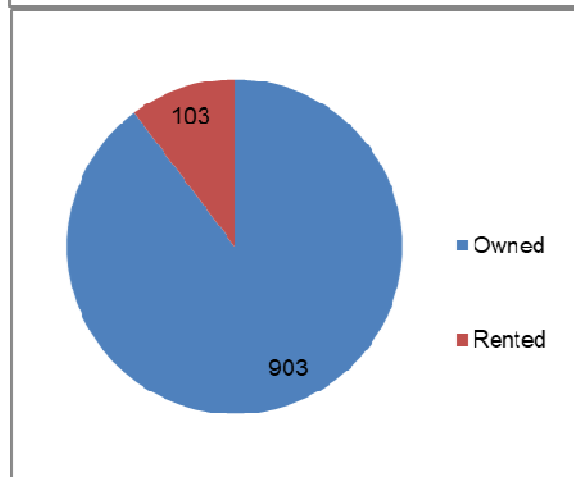
21. Around 78% have movable structures and the remaining 22% have constructed temporary sheds (e.g. cabin/ kiosk).



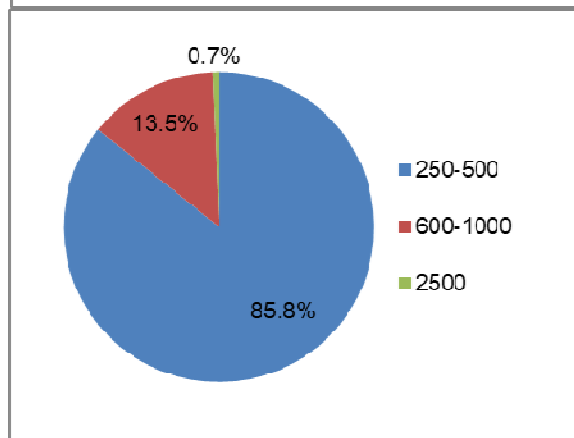
22. An average cost of their business unit/structure was estimated at Rs.9869 with the minimum at Rs. 500 and maximum at Rs. 30000.



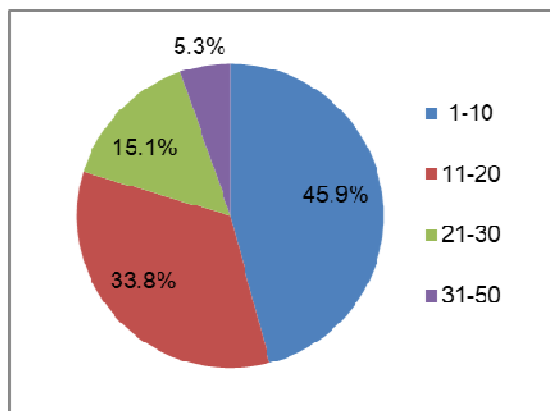
23. 85% of APs (835/983) have their own structure, while 15% (148/983) are paying rent for structures.



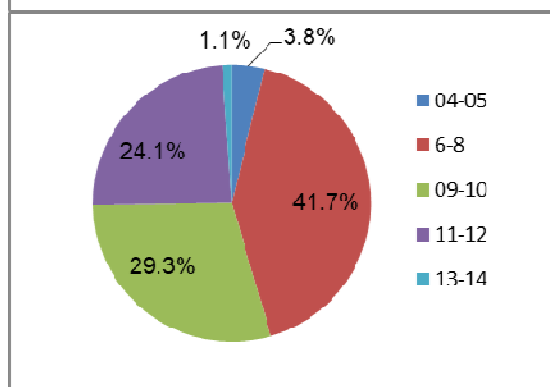
24. Out of the total of 148 APs, 85.8% of APs are paying Rs250-500/month as rent, 13.5% are paying Rs. 600-1000/month as rent and the remaining 0.7% are paying Rs. 2500/month as rent for these structures.



25. **Working in Towns in Years:** 45.9% APs are living/working in town since last 1 to 10 years, 33.8% APs are living/working in town since last 11 to 20 years, and 15.1% APs are living in town/working since last 21 to 30 years, while 5.2% APs are living/working in town since last 31 to 50 years.



26. **Working hours (Hrs/day) at Single Place:** 3.8% APs have indicated that they work at fixed location for 4 to 5 hrs/day, 41.7% APs have indicated that they work at fixed location for 6 to 8 Hrs/day, 29.3% APs have indicated that they work at fixed location for 9-10hrs/day, 24.1% APs have indicated working at fixed location for 11-12hrs/day, while 1.1% APs have indicated working at fixed location for 13-14hrs/day.



D. Information Disclosure, Consultation and Participation

27. The updated RP was prepared after consultation with stakeholders. The key stakeholders consulted during various stages of RP preparation/updating include (i) all APs, including vulnerable households; (ii) program beneficiaries; (iii) elected representatives, community leaders, and representatives of community-based organizations; (iv) local NGOs; (v) local government and relevant government agency representatives; and (vi) Program staff, PMU, PIU, and consultants. Meetings and individual interviews were held involving stakeholders particularly, potentially temporarily affected persons; and transect walk, survey, and interviews were conducted from Jan-March, 2017 to October 2019 to determine the potential impacts of the subproject. The issues like awareness and extent of the project and development components, benefits of the project, traffic disruptions, and impacts on livelihood. It was informed to APs surveyed that appropriate measures will be undertaken during construction to minimize impacts. (Including scheduling of activities and reducing construction activities during the rush hour). It was also informed that, if despite mitigation measures, there would be any temporary impacts on livelihood; these would be compensated in accordance with the agreed EM.

28. During the subproject implementation, the construction schedule is informed to all residents (including APs) prior to the commencement of pipe laying through signboards. The signboards are in local language and include details of (including but not limited to) -(i) section to be affected, (ii) start and end dates, (iii) information on traffic rerouting if any, and (iv) Contact information for questions/grievances.

29. Information dissemination and disclosure is a continuous process from the beginning of the project. Information dissemination is carried out through printed leaflets/ information booklets prepared in the local language. The disclosure leaflets were already circulated to the APs and stakeholders (Hindi script) in Feb -March 2017(See Annexure 5&6). During the implementation phase, project information leaflets are circulated not only to APs but also to people (residents, businessmen, and others) within the immediate project influence area in advance so that people could be aware about the project work and its benefit and also R&R provision under these project.

30. The leaflet/ information booklet contained the following information:

- Description of the project and its objectives;

- Summary of impacts (including land acquisition, and impacts on common property resources, etc.);
- Resettlement & Rehabilitation provisions of the project and specific benefits available to vulnerable APs;
- Ways and means of involving local communities;
- Grievance redress mechanism, and suggestion and complaint handling mechanism.

31. For the temporary impacts, the last date of socio-economic surveys was considered as the cut-off date. Cut-off-date for temporary impacts was communicated to APs through survey agency and Safeguard Staff of PMDSC on dated **09.03.2017(See Annexure 7&8)** and also by putting up printed information in the project affected area at common advertisement place. Similarly, the list of APs was published at common places with contact details of PIU officials. The list was displayed in the area wise and at a time for the entire city. The objective of the cut-off-date was to avoid APs moving from the other areas and the duplication. **Cut-off-date for temporary impacts remains as 09.03.2017**

32. The approved RP will be disclosed on the ADB and RUSDIP website and information dissemination, through subproject specific leaflets and public announcements, and consultation will continue throughout program implementation.

E. Grievance Redress Mechanism

33. The grievance redress mechanism (GRM) has been well established under this sub-project. The GRM will receive, evaluate, and facilitate the resolution of AP's concerns, complaints, and grievances about the social and environmental performance at the level of the project. The GRM aims to provide a time-bound and transparent mechanism to voice and resolve social and environmental concerns linked to the project.

34. The contractor and on-site supervision personnel from PIU and PMDSC will be the first point of contact for the quick resolution of grievances. Contact phone numbers and names of the concerned PIU Nodal Officer, contractors, will be posted at all construction sites at visible locations.

- (i) **1st level grievance.** The contractors, PIU supervision personnel, PIU Nodal Officer, and Safeguard implementing Staff/CAPC can immediately resolve issues on-site in consultation with each other and will be required to do so within three days of receipt of a complaint/grievance.
- (ii) **2nd level grievance.** All grievances that cannot be redressed within three days at the field/ward level will be brought to the notice of the Social Project Officer (SPO) of PMU. PMU SPO will resolve the grievance within seven days of receipt of compliance/ grievance in discussion with the PIU, CAPC / Safeguard Implementation Staff and the Contractor.
- (iii) **3rd level grievance.** All the grievances that are not addressed by PMU within seven days of receipt will be brought to the notice of the Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC). The City Level Committee (CLC), established in every project city, will act as GRC¹³. GRC will meet twice a month and determine the merit of each grievance brought to the committee. The PIU Nodal Officer will be responsible for seeing through the process of redressal of each grievance. The GRC will resolve the grievance within fifteen days of receiving the complaint.

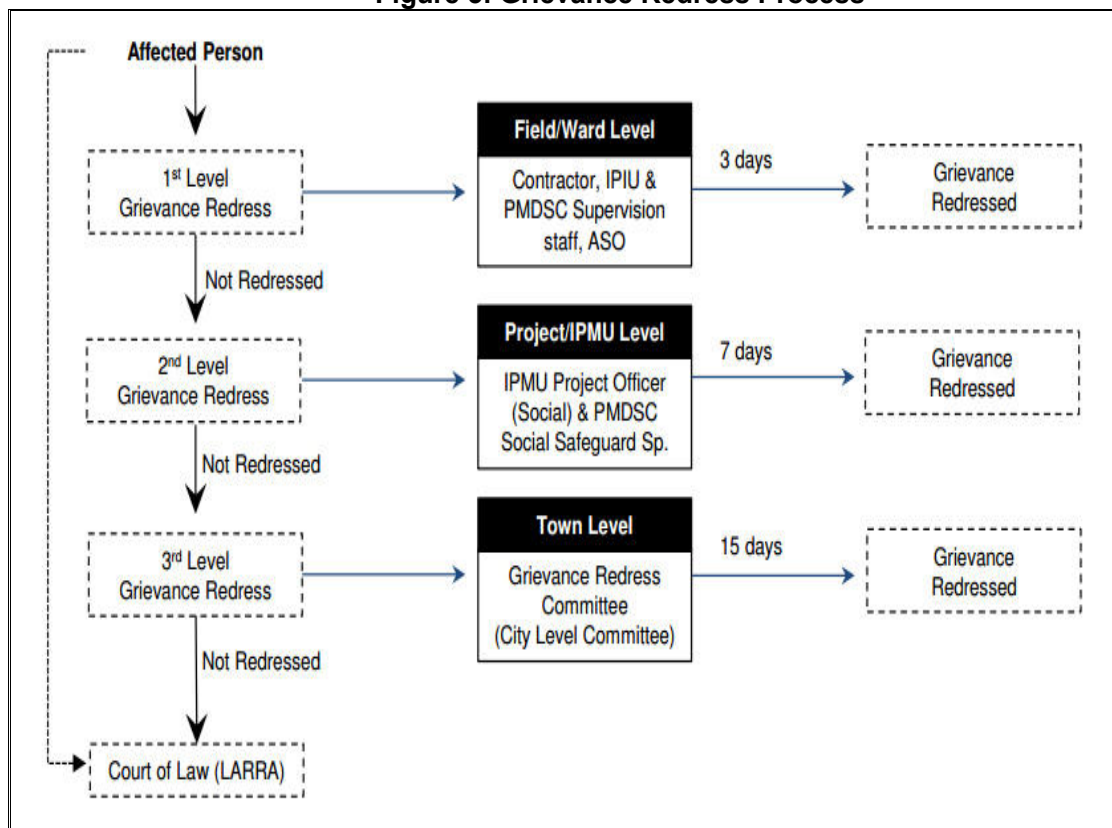
35. The project GRM notwithstanding, an aggrieved person shall have access to the country's legal system at any stage, and accessing the country's legal system can run parallel to accessing the GRM and is not dependent on the negative outcome of the GRM. Alternatively, if the grievance is related to land acquisition, resettlement & rehabilitation¹⁴, the APs can approach the Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Authority (LARRA).

36. If the established GRM is not in a position to resolve the issue, the affected person also can use the ADB's Accountability Mechanism through directly contacting (in writing) the Complaint Receiving Officer (CRO) at ADB headquarters or the ADB India Resident Mission (INRM). The complaint can be submitted in any of the official languages of ADB's DMCs. The ADB Accountability Mechanism information will be included in the PID to be distributed to the affected communities, as part of the project GRM.

37. Records will be kept for all grievances received, including contact details of the complainant, date of the complaint received, nature of grievance, agreed corrective actions and the final outcome. The concerned PIU will bear all costs involved in resolving the complaints (meetings, consultations, communication, and reporting/information dissemination) at the city level while the PMU will meet expenses related to escalated grievances.

F. Legal Framework

38. The policy framework and entitlements for the RUSDP are based on:

- (i) The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation, and Resettlement Act (RFCTLARR), 2013.
- (ii) ADB's Safeguard Policy Statement (SPS), 2009. The salient features of Government and ADB policies are summarized below. The resettlement principles and procedures to be followed for social safeguards under RUSDP are detailed out in the RF document.

39. Core involuntary resettlement principles for the RUSDP to be followed for each subproject are:

- (i) Land acquisition and other involuntary resettlement impacts will be avoided or minimized exploring all viable alternative sub-project designs;
- (ii) Where unavoidable, time-bound resettlement plans (RPs) will be prepared and APs will be assisted in improving or at least regaining their pre-program standard of living;
- (iii) Full information and close consultations with APs including consultation with APs on compensation, disclosure of resettlement information to APs, and participation of APs in planning and implementing sub-projects will be ensured;

- (iv) Vulnerable groups will be provided special assistance¹⁵
- (v) Payment of compensation to APs including non-titled persons (e.g., informal dwellers/squatters, and encroachers) for acquired assets at replacement rates;
- (vi) Payment of compensation and resettlement assistance prior to the contractor taking the physical acquisition of the land and prior to the commencement of any construction activities;
- (vii) Provision of income restoration and rehabilitation; and
- (viii) Establishment of appropriate grievance redress mechanisms.

40. APs are entitled to a combination of compensation measures and resettlement assistance, depending on the nature of ownership rights of lost assets and scope of the impact, including the social and economic vulnerability of the APs.

G. Entitlements, Assistance, and Benefits

41. All APs who are identified in the subproject areas on the cut-off date are entitled to compensation for their affected assets, and rehabilitation measures (as outlined in the entitlement matrix below) are sufficient to assist them to improve or at least maintain their pre-project living standards, income-earning capacity, and production levels. Compensation eligibility is limited by a cut-off date as set for this project on the day of the completion of the census survey which is **09.03.2017**. APs who settle in the affected areas after the cut-off date are not eligible for compensation and assistance. APs are being provided 30 days advance notice to ensure no or minimal disruption in their livelihood. If required, they are also assisted in shifting for continuing their economic activity. For example, they are supported in shifting to the other side of the road where there is no construction. Ensuring there is no income or access loss during sub-project construction is the obligation of contractors and PIU. In case the contractor fails to ensure access, PIU will compensate in accordance with the agreed EM.

42. The PIU and the Safeguard Implementation Staff of PMDSC provide the identity cards (ID) to each of the APs. The entitlement matrix for the subproject based on the above policies is in Table 10.

43. The construction period is minimized and ranges from seven days to fourteen days per section of work. Though the construction period is different for water supply and sewerage works, the livelihood losses are estimated/ provided for fourteen days considering road restoration (which forces movable vendors to operate from a different place) works. It is suggested that water supply and sewerage works should be carried out at parallel to minimize impacts on stretches where both the works are proposed.

44. If construction activities result in unavoidable livelihood disruption, compensation for lost income or a transitional allowance for the period of disruption, whichever is greater is provided. Under this project, 14 days of impact period during construction for both water supply and sewerage subprojects have been fixed¹⁶. If in any case, the impact is for more than 14 days, compensation will be disbursed for the entire period of disturbances. Vulnerable APs are given priority in project construction employment and provided with additional special assistance for income restoration support. Compensation and assistance to APs are being done before possession of land/assets and prior to the start of work in a particular area. Since most affected households have moveable stalls, ID cards are

distributed thirteen days before compensation. In summary, temporarily APs are provided with:

- (i) Thirty days advance notice regarding construction activities, including duration and type of disruption.
- (ii) Contractor to ensure there is no income/access loss consistent with the initial environmental examination. This includes: leaving spaces for access between mounds of soil, providing walkways and metal sheets to maintain access across trenches for people and vehicles where required, increased workforce to finish work in areas with impacts on access, timing of works to reduce disruption during business hours, phased construction schedule and working one segment at a time and one side of the road at a time.
- (iii) Assistance to mobile vendors/hawkers to temporarily shift for continued economic activity. For example, assistance to shift to the other side of the road where there is no construction.
- (iv) For construction activities involving unavoidable livelihood disruption, compensation for lost income, or a transitional allowance for the period of disruption, whichever is greater.

H. Resettlement Budget and Financing Plan

45. The resettlement cost estimate for the Sri Ganganagar water and sewerage subproject includes resettlement assistance, as outlined in the entitlement matrix and contingency provision amounting to be 5% of the total cost. The funds for resettlement are released in a timely manner. The total resettlement cost for the subproject is **INR 7569931**. The resettlement cost items and estimates are outlined in **Table 11**. The Town, Safeguard Implementation Staff is involved in facilitating the disbursement process and also in facilitating opening bank accounts for the affected persons who do not have bank accounts. PIU is issuing sanction order for payment of APs and making electronic clearance service/National Electronic Fund Transfer (ECS/NEFT) transaction from the bank through concerned Treasury from state share.

I. Institutional Arrangements and Implementation Schedule

46. The Local Self Government Department (LSGD) is the executing agency (EA) for overall technical supervision and execution of all subprojects funded under the Program. The Implementing Agency is the PMU of the ongoing RUIDP and is responsible for coordinating the construction of subprojects and ensuring across the towns. PIU has been established at Sri Ganganagar. The inter-ministerial Empowered Committee provides LSGD with central policy guidance and coordination, and CLC has been established in Sri Ganganagar to oversee the implementation at the city level. The PMU is assisted by PMDSC who manages the Program and assures the technical quality of the design and construction, managing the tendering of contractors and supervising construction.

47. SPO at PMU is responsible for (i) addressing the social safeguards issues; (ii) implementing the RP; (iii) liaising with district administration for land acquisition and RP implementation; (iv) addressing any problems and/or delays in the land acquisition process including GRM management and monitor the overall complaint resolution status; (v) monitoring physical and financial progress on land acquisition activities; (vi) monitoring the implementation of RPs; (vii) providing guidance to PIUs as and when necessary; and (viii) endorsing and submitting periodic semi-annual social safeguard monitoring reports.

48. An SSS of PMDSC will assist the PMU. The SSS, PMDSC will (i) update the existing RPs based on the detailed design; (ii) assist in the monitoring and supervision of ongoing subprojects and RP implementation; (iii) prepare RP for new subprojects, where required to comply with national law and ADB policies; (iv) ensure all subprojects meet safeguard requirements as agreed in the loan covenant and in line with the RF; and (v) review and

finalize all reports in consultation with the SPO, PMU (RP updating and preparation, preparation of semi-annual social safeguard monitoring report for PMU submission to ADB, and support GRM implementation). In addition, SSS will assist the PMU in procurement needs and other project implementation aspects and shall play a central role in ensuring capacity building on resettlement management of the PMU and line departments through capacity development support and training. The implementation of role and responsibility are presented in Table 12. The implementation arrangement of environment and resettlement safeguards is provided in **Figure 6**.

49. At each PIU, a Nodal officer of the rank of Assistant Engineer (AE) is designated as Assistant Safeguards officer (ASO). ASO assists SPO, PMU in the implementation of the social safeguards at the PIU level. The PIUs are responsible for the implementation of the RP. PIUs are responsible for undertaking the internal monitoring and supervision and record observations throughout the project period to ensure that the safeguards and mitigation measures are provided as intended. ASO is responsible for following activities (i) implementing and monitoring the safeguards compliance activities, public relations activities, gender mainstreaming activities, and community participation activities; (ii) coordinating with district administration and NGO for land acquisition and R&R aspects and addressing any problems and/or delays; (iii) monitoring the physical and financial progress on land acquisition and R&R activities including record keeping of the grievance and redress issues as reported by CAPC/Safeguard Implementation Staff/Contractor and prepare and submit monthly report on safeguards to be consolidated by PIU Assistant Safeguards officer (ASO); and (iv) organizing monthly meetings with the contractor, outreach team and safeguard implementation staff of PMDSC to review the progress on R&R. A tentative implementation schedule is given in Table 13.

50. In addition to safeguards staff at PMU, PIU, and PMDSC, the EA has appointed a Safeguard Staff in PMDSC and Social Development Expert cum Gender Expert (SDGE) in CAPC to support the implementation of RP in Sri Ganganagar. Key activities of the implementing Safeguard Staff of PMDSC in relation to resettlement planning and implementation will include: (i) conducting detailed survey of physically and economically affected persons based on detailed design, and identifying poor, female-headed, and vulnerable households affected by land acquisition and resettlement; (ii) preparing the list of the potentially affected persons and issue identification cards; (iii) facilitating the process of disbursement of compensation to the affected persons, coordinating with the revenue department and informing the affected persons of the compensation disbursement process and timeline; (iv) assisting affected persons in opening bank accounts, explaining the implications, rules, and obligations of a joint account and how he or she can access the resources he or she is entitled to; (v) assist the EA in ensuring a smooth transition (during the partial or full relocation of the affected persons), helping them to take salvaged materials and shift whenever required. In close consultation with the affected persons, the implementing Safeguard Staff shall inform the PMU about the shifting dates agreed upon in writing and the arrangements they desire with respect to their entitlements; (vi) organizing training programs for income restoration; (vii) conducting meaningful, ongoing consultation and ensuring disclosure of RPs in an accessible manner to the affected persons; (viii) assisting PIUs in GRM; (ix) assisting PIUs in keeping detailed records of progress and establishing monitoring and reporting systems of resettlement; (x) acting as the information source for community interaction with the project, and liaising between community, PMDSC contractors, and project management and implementing units during the execution of the works; and (xi) providing advice and other support to PIUs as required.

J. Monitoring and Reporting

51. Monitoring and evaluation are important activities of any infrastructure development project involving involuntary resettlement. It helps in making suitable changes if required during the implementation of resettlement related activities and helps to resolve problems. Monitoring is periodical checking of planned activities and provides midway inputs, facilitates changes, if necessary, and provides feedback to Project Authority for better management of project activities.

52. RP implementation is closely monitored to provide the PMU with an effective basis for assessing resettlement progress and identifying potential difficulties and problems. As per ADB guidelines, for category B projects only internal monitoring is required. Internal monitoring for Sri Ganganagar is undertaken by the PIU (through the PMDSC SSS) with assistance from the PMU SPO. Monthly progress reports are prepared and submitted to the PMU. PMU consolidates the reports and submits semi-annually to ADB for approval.

53. Till December 2019, a payment of Rs 446084- has been disbursed to 61 APs out of 983 potential APs and impact on 49 APs was avoided. 8 APs were reported as missing and 2 APs have voluntarily refused to receive the compensation.

K. Present Status of Work and Due diligence of Present Work

54. During the preparatory stage (before initiation of civil works) of the Project, the land acquisition and involuntary resettlement issues were examined in line with ADB SPS 2009, and RP was prepared and submitted to ADB. DBO Contractor, safeguard personnel of PIU and field engineer of PMDSC during the implementation period jointly conducted the detailed design and detailed measurement surveys (DMS) where the involuntary resettlement impacts were reconfirmed and accordingly RP was updated.

55. For due diligence, the entire scope of work was broadly classified into two categories (i) Permanent civil structure sites (ii) Network and road length.

i) Due Diligence - Permanent civil structure/ sites

56. The construction of water treatment plant (WTP), Raw Water Reservoir at Nathawali, Construction CWR at the main campus and 4E, Direct Pumping station at Sadbhawna Nagar, and PHED headworks are being executed within the existing PHED Campus. Raw Water Storage works at the abandoned canal at Sadhuwali (309 ML capacity) has been undertaken within the available land, which is under the possession of the water resource department. CWR and pumping station at sugar mill area and CWR at Sadbhawna Nagar are under progress in the land which is under the possession of Rajasthan Sugar mill and Urban Improvement Trust (UIT). The impact assessment was done initially, and it is confirmed that vacant lands for the aforesaid works were available.

57. During the implementation of the subproject, the location of Sewer Pumping Station (SwPS) has been changed, and the land of Consumer Relation Management Centre (CRMC), Master Control Centre (MCC), and Central Control Centre (CCC) buildings were identified. An additional Raw Water Pumping Station (RWPS) is proposed near the raw water reservoir (RWR) within the public health engineering department (PHED) campus, at Nathawali and Clear Water Pumping Station at 4E PHED campus has been dropped. The civil work has started (except at SwPS), and as a corrective measure, the field-based due diligence was carried with the objective to identify resettlement (permanent or temporary) impacts on titled/non-titled households (if any) caused during the execution.

58. A due diligence visit was undertaken to all permanent sites to (i) assess whether the sub-project causes any resettlement impacts (temporary/permanent, partial/full) impacts on structures and livelihoods non-titled affected persons (APs) (ii) To collect evidence (documents, photographs,) to understand/ identify resettlement impacts if any and (iii) To organize public consultation along the project sites to discuss the resettlement impacts.

59. The DDR confirms that vacant land for construction of CCC, MCC, CRMC (2 nos) buildings and Raw water pumping station at Nathawali was identified in the existing PHED campus and land for two CRMCS was selected on the available land in Green Park and Sukharia Park which is under the possession of Municipal council (MC), while construction of one SwPS of 5.22 MLD capacity is proposed near railway track which is a government land.

60. Due diligence/ field visits (conducted by a team including staff of PMDSC, department of urban local body, Project contractor and safeguard staff from PIU/PMDSC) revealed that the vacant land was available in PHED campus and Green Park and Sukharia Park, where CRMC/MCC/CCC/RWPS works has been undertaken.

62. Necessary consultation, concerning the change of location, was undertaken by the PMDSC team to discuss the resettlement impacts (refer Annexure 12 for further details). RUSDP confirms that all the selected lands were vacant govt land, and the construction of subprojects does not cause any resettlement impacts.

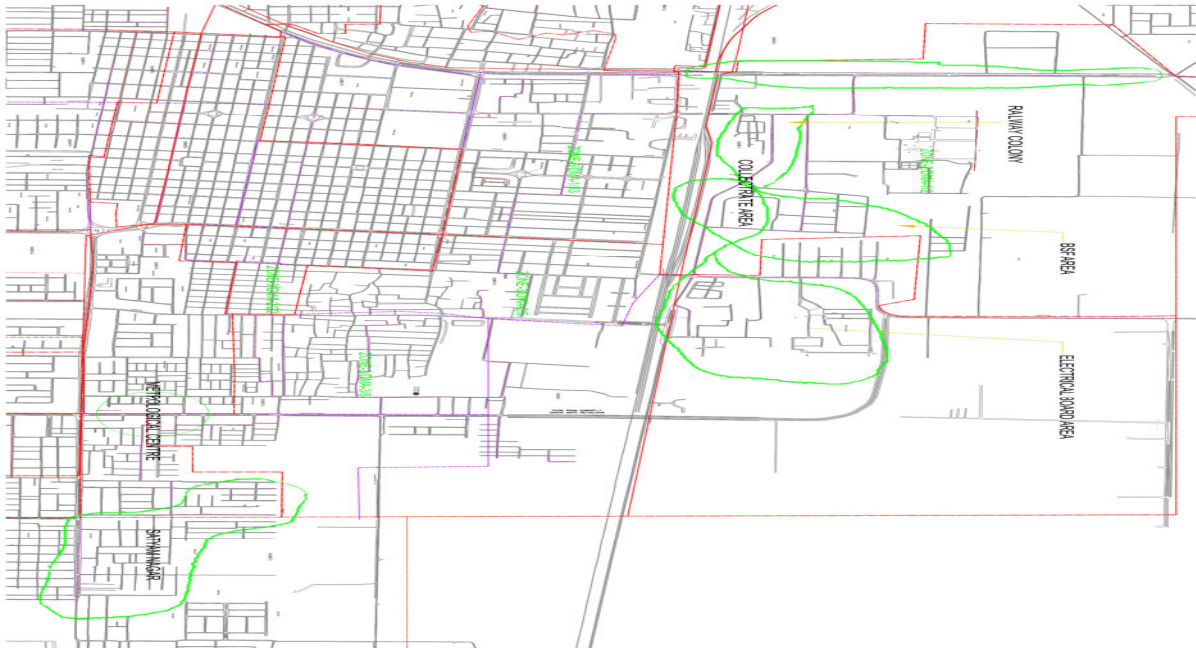

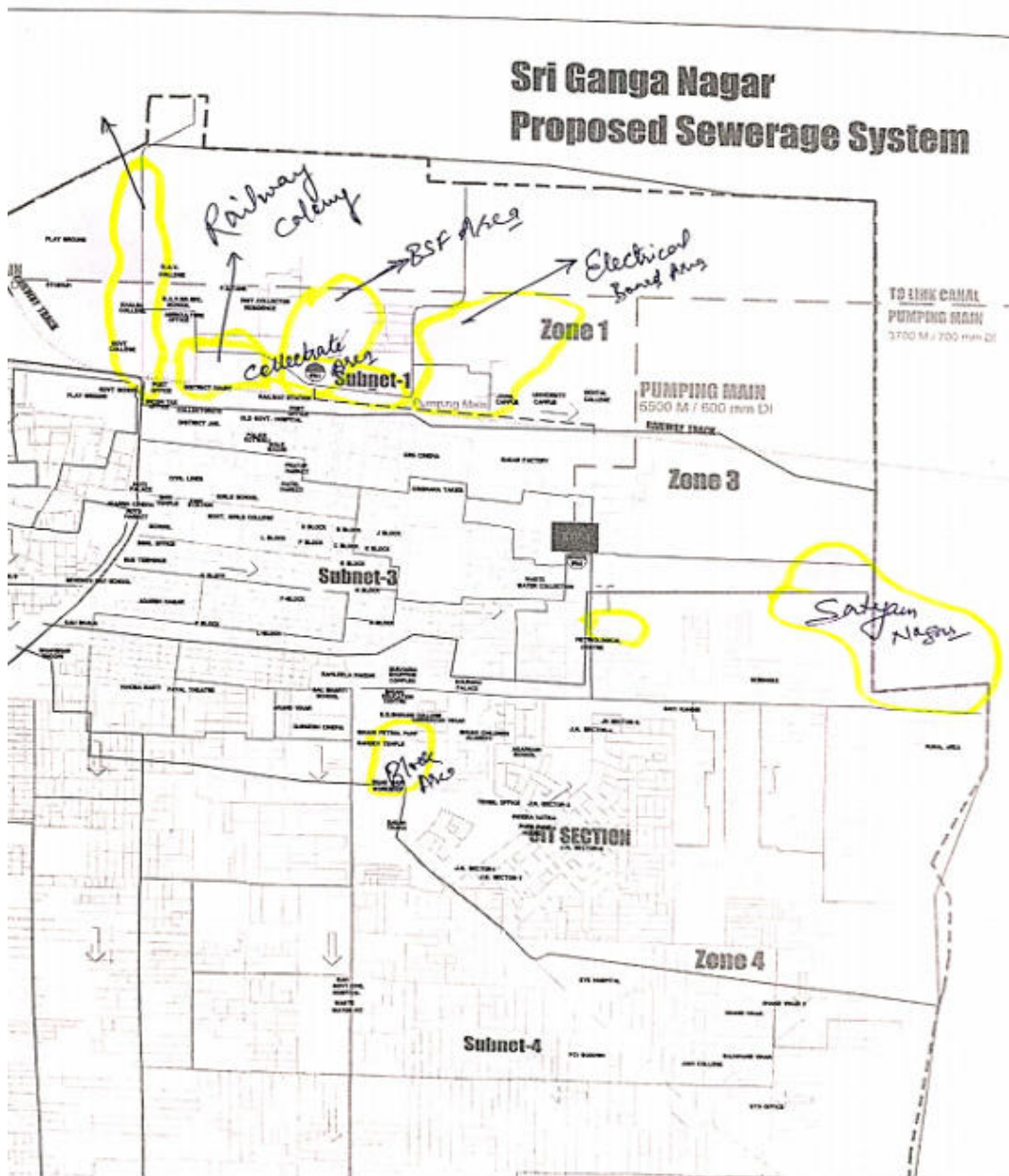
63. During SIP, new areas that were earlier missed out were included (within the municipal boundary) in sewerage network to provide the basic utilities to maximum

households. The comparative of the previous and final length is provided in the table below:-

64. A transect walk of the included subproject roads with public consultations, along with photography was carried out with respective officials and supervision consultants. The following methodological techniques have been adopted for preparing revised DDR (i) Field-based assessment, (ii) Public consultations and (iii) evidence-based photo along the subproject roads.

65. The DDR confirms that mainly residential areas have been included in the sewerage scope and the network has been designed according to available road width. Since the design has been optimized, the existing RoW is sufficient for laying of network pipes. As such, there is no impact on structures, trees or livelihood belonging to titled or non-titled persons. The distance of proprietary land and structure was found to be sufficient and the photographs depicting the availability of ROW are enclosed for reference -

Conclusion:

66. Due diligence/ field visits revealed that the vacant land is available in PHED campus, Green Park and Sukharia Park, where CRMC/MCC/CCC/RWPS works are undertaken/ being undertaken. Similarly new land of SwPS near the railway track near the sugar mill area is also vacant land, which is under the possession of the Municipal Council. It is confirmed that no land is acquired under the project, and all the locations identified did not cause any resettlement (temporary/permanent) impact.

67. Few areas have been included for laying sewerage networks (within the municipal boundary) to provide the basic utilities to maximum households. These areas are residential; no vendors /squatters were identified along the ROW during visits. As minor changes were anticipated in the scope of the subproject at the time of preparing the RP (2017 version), the people carrying on business activities on both sides of the road were considered as potential APs, and the social impact assessment (SIA) and census and socio-economic survey (100%) was carried in all the areas. These minor changes do not cause an impact on additional affected persons (APs). **The cut-off date remains unchanged, i.e. 09.03.2017.** No changes made in the coverage area of the water supply network but the length has been reconfirmed (after detailed measurement) to be 451.18 Km in place of 455 Km.

68. **The category of the subproject remains “B”** as there is no land acquisition under the project, and the subproject would continue to have only temporary resettlement impacts due to laying of water supply and sewerage pipe networks. No impact is envisaged on CPRs.

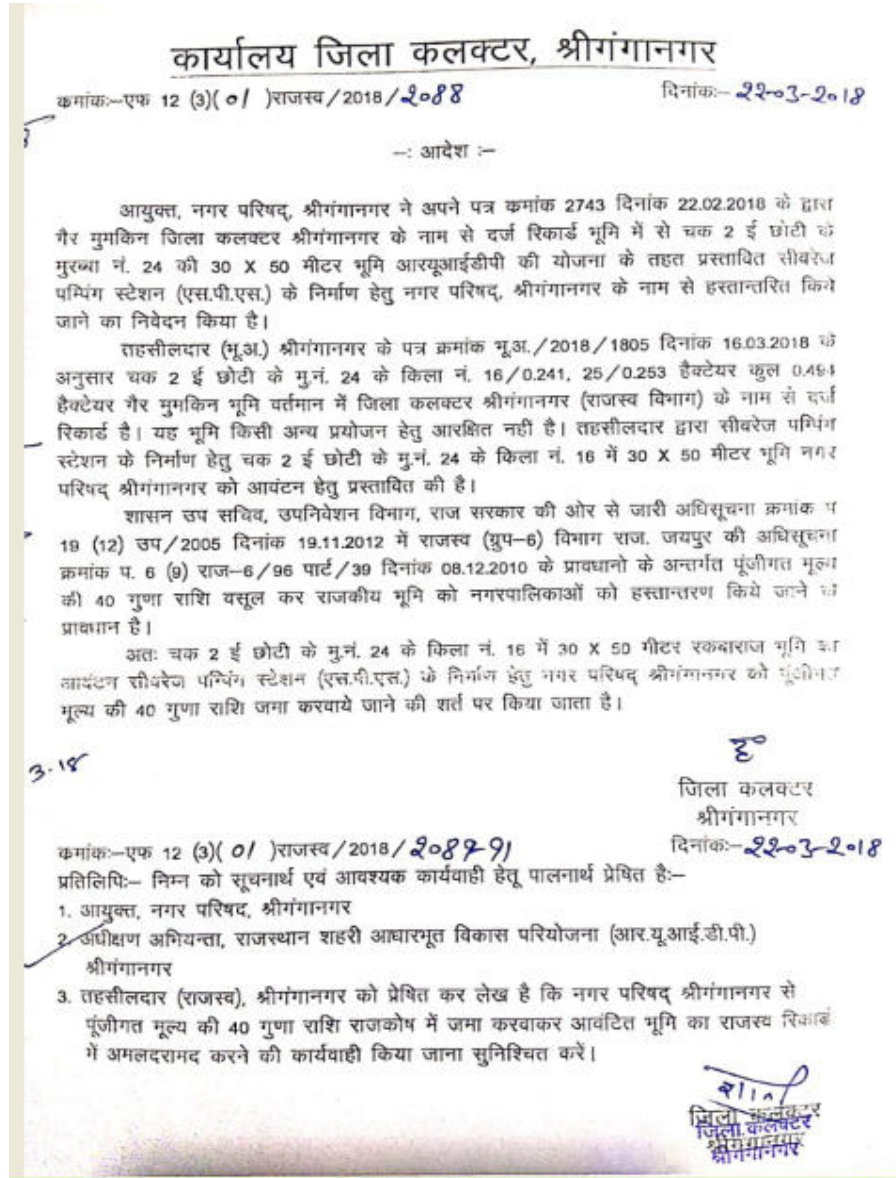

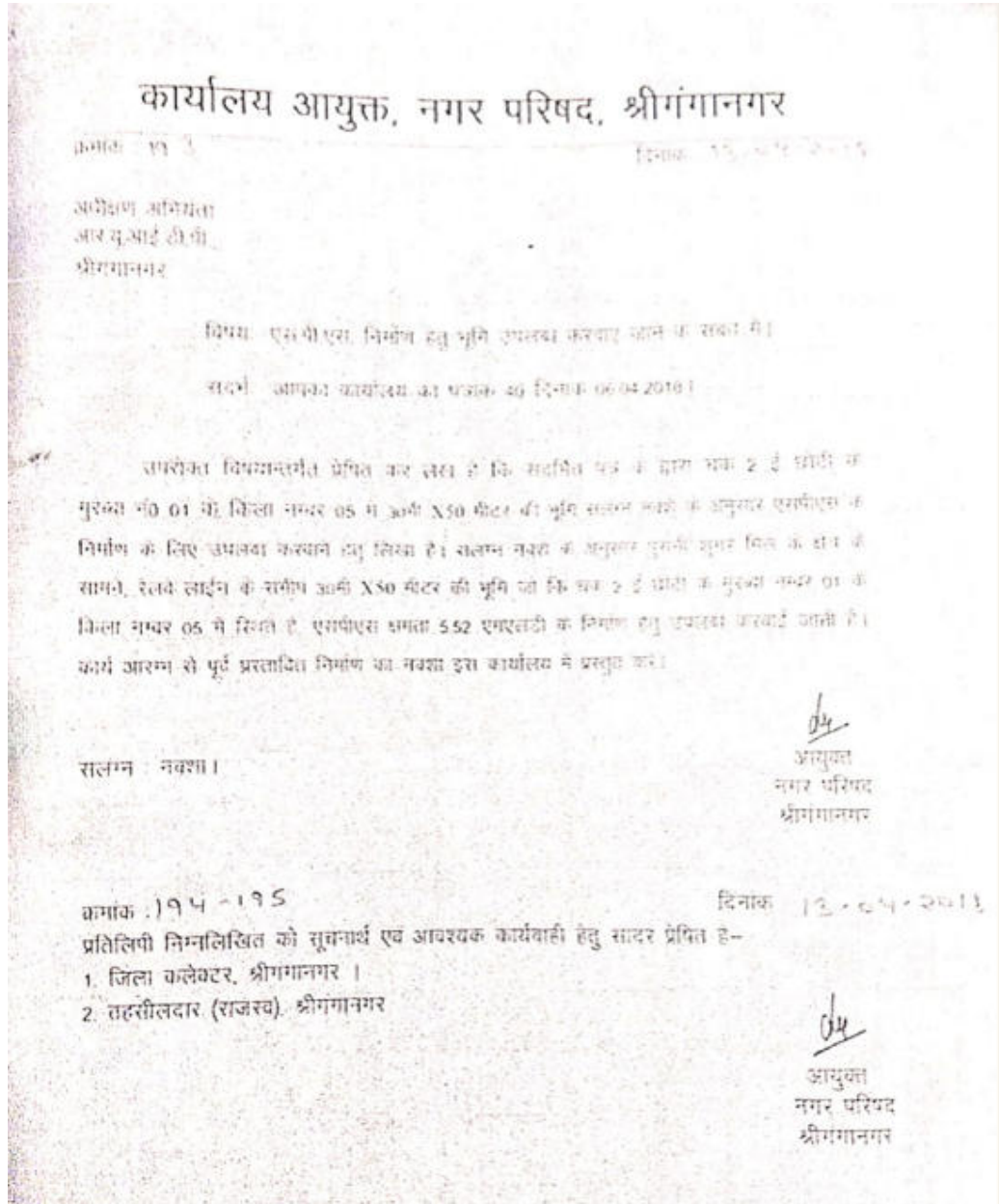

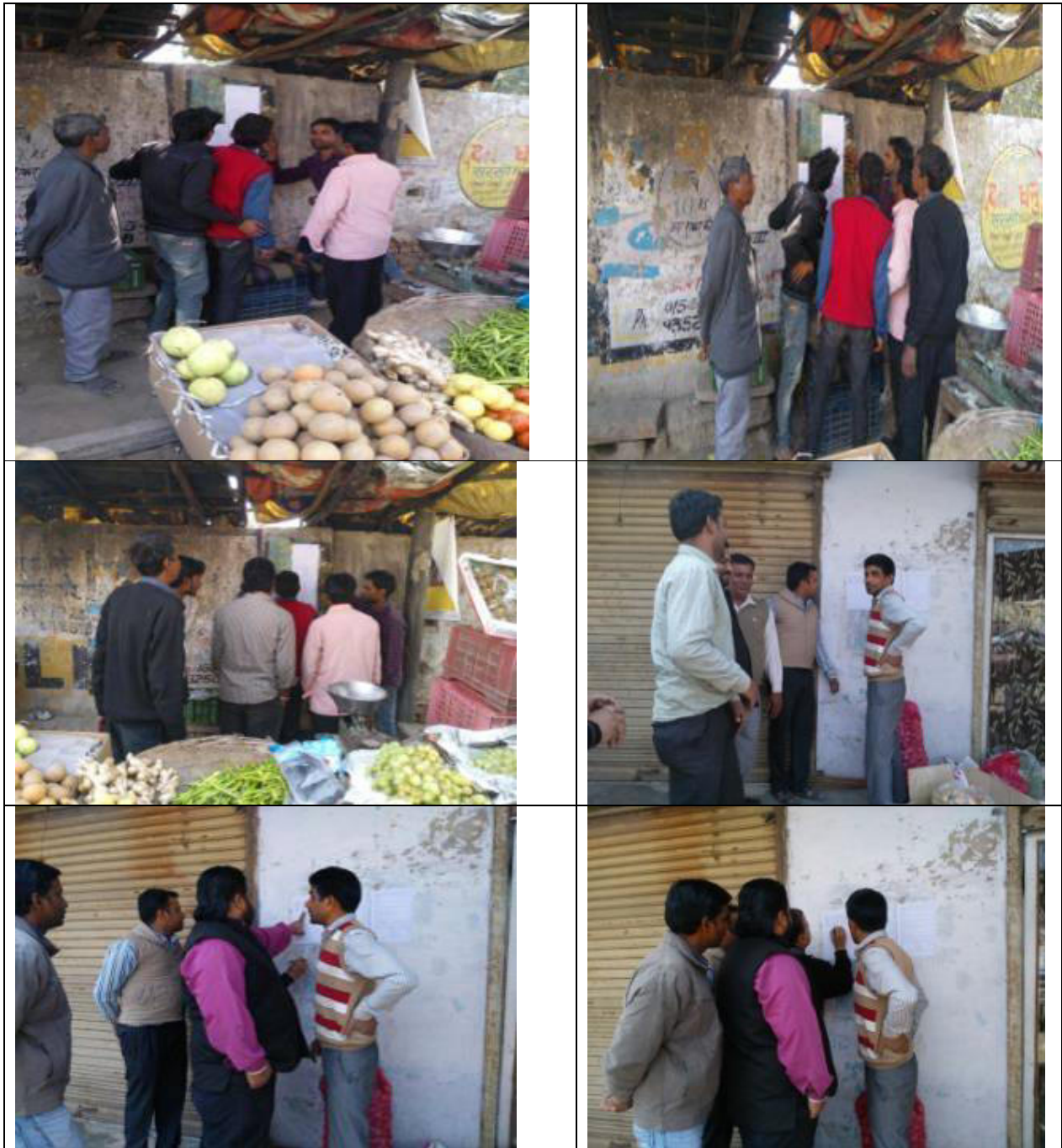

Annexure 10 (B) Proceedings of City Level Stakeholder Consultation Meeting at Sri Ganganagar on April 25, 2014

This stakeholder consultation meeting was organized on April 25, 2014, at Sri Ganganagar District collector's meeting hall. The meeting was organized by the Sri Ganganagar Nagar Parishad (SGNP) with the support of RUIDP PMU and the ADB PPTA Team. District Collector Ganganagar chaired the meeting. The SGNP Chairman (elected head of PNP), and Commission (administration head of SGNP) participated in the meeting. In all 26 persons, representing various agencies, attended the meeting (List of persons attended the meeting is enclosed herewith).

The objective of the meeting was to appraise the stakeholders about the proposed Rajasthan urban Infrastructure Development Project III (RUIDP III). The subprojects proposed for Ganganagar in water supply and sewerage sector, and the likely environmental and social issues, and the proposed mitigation measures were discussed during the meeting.

A detailed presentation on overall RUIDP III, and subprojects and components proposed in Ganganagar was made to the stakeholders. Executive summary of Initial Environmental Examination (IEE) conducted for the Ganganagar subproject, Environmental Management Plan, proposed Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM), draft Entitlement Matrix of the Resettlement Framework was displayed at the meeting and were made available to the interested persons.

The comments, suggestions of the stakeholders are presented below:

- All the stakeholders were supportive of the project and indicated their willingness to participate in the project to make it successful.
- Stakeholders were of the view that these subprojects provide benefits to all the people by improving water supply and sewerage.
- Stakeholder suggested that the treated sewage from all the STPs be transported to a single location, and an artificial water body with parks and play grounds should be developed.
- Stakeholders concerned about poor natural drainage and inadequate drain capacities.

Minutes of consultation meeting held with stake holders on 08th August 2015 for need assessment and identification of works to be executed under RUIDP Phase III in Sriganganagar town.

A consultation meeting for need assessment and identification of works to be executed under RUIDP Phase III was held under the chairmanship of District Collector, Sriganganagar in compliance with instruction of Project Director, RUIDP as per letter no. 10194 dated 04.08.2015. List of Stakeholders and Officials and peoples representatives attended the meeting is enclosed as annexure.

Additional project director RUIDP appraised the key aspects of RUIDP project (RUIDP Phase III), RUIDP officials briefed the members on key aspects of the Project i.e

- (i) coverage of Water Supply and Wastewater sectors
- (ii) Single contract for wastewater and water supply
- (iii) DMA based execution and SCADA based monitoring
- (iv) NRW(Non Revenue Water) reduction strategy
- (v) Use of Recycled treated wastewater.

All the stakeholders were requested to suggest the priority of works to be included in water and wastewater sector for the town. It was requested that ownership of created assets should lie with Municipal Council. Therefore, all possible support will be required for finalizing of works of priority so that a realistic / necessity oriented Detailed Project Report is prepared by RUIDP Consultants (named as PMDSC) by October -15 and tenders may be invited accordingly.

District Collector appreciated the concern shown by RUIDP team and agreed that for successful implementation of time bound projects it is necessary that all the stakeholders should take active participation and requested all the stakeholders to support the project and get involved from the starting so that DPR becomes realistic. The discussions were held on Water & Waste water sector works as below:-

Water Supply Sector

The UIT and Municipal Council suggested that Water Supply sector should be taken in totality. It was brought to the notice by SE, PHED that the major source of water supply to the town of Gang canal and only 7 days storage of water is available at old headwork (PHED campus). There is need to increase the water storage at this old Headwork for at least 21 days. It was suggested by PHED that land is available near Sadhuwali outlet of Gang canal, which can be used as Raw Water Storage Tank, so that sufficient water is available during canal closure by Gang canal for maintenance. Therefore, it was suggested by PHED that raw water storage capacity should be improved under RUIDP project.

It was also desired by PHED that the new colonies approved by UIT and 16 villages which are outside the municipal limit are presently in periphery of urban limit and water supply is being maintained under Urban Water Supply System therefore these 16 villages and UIT approved colonies should be included under upcoming RUIDP Phase III project. The issue was discussed in detail with the UIT officials. District Collector Sriganaganagar directed to Secretary UIT to look into the matter and take a decision on case to case basis in consultation with Municipal authorities. PHED officials were directed to determine the bulk demand of these newly developed colonies / adjoining villages so that a decision could be taken on this issue by the Administration jointly.

PHED officials also suggested for inclusion of rehabilitation of existing water treatment plant and pumping stations with mechanical and electrical equipment and replacement of old AC & PVC rising pipelines and distribution pipelines so that existing water supply system could be strengthened to facilitate the entire distribution system and reduction of NRW.

UIT expressed the desire for coverage of whole town. In case new OHSRs will be required to be constructed, the land for OHSRs/ Campus shall be made available by UIT.

It was also highlighted that there would be increase in water demand due to increasing industrial use and adequate provision for the same should be ensured.

Sewerage Sector

It was informed by UIT officials that the work of construction of 3 STPs (at 3 different locations/zones) along with laying of 67 Km network in Zone 4 is in progress under UIDSSMT. There is provision of 10 Year O&M for all the 3 STPs. Sewer line work under zone 4 is at the final stage. Out of 3 STPs (35 MLD capacity), 02 STPs (10 MLD at Suratgarh Road, 15 MLD near Sugar Mill ponding are under construction. One STP at Idgah Ponding (10 MLD) is yet to start. 2 STPs out of 3 STPs may likely to be put to trial run and commissioning by November-15. Chairman, Municipal Council, Sriganganagar and Secretary, UIT suggested for coverage of remaining area of the city in the RUIDP project. Since there is already a 10 Year O&M for all the 3 STPs therefore it is important to dovetail the existing Sewer works and O&M of STPs. It was also informed that DI pipeline for effluent disposal has already been laid under UIDSSMT. Recycled treated wastewater use should be included in DPR up to the best possible extent. This water may be reused for agriculture around the disposal point and for industrial purpose as per requirement. This work may be carried out by PMDSC in consultation with UIT/Municipal Council.

Hon'ble MLA Ms Kamini Jindal raised the issue of present public inconvenience during execution of laying of sewer line by UIT, which is basically due to not taking up the required road restoration timely and urged that the upcoming project should take all necessary steps so that these issues are minimized and better public participation is ensured. Due care should be taken at the DPR stage for utility shifting.

It was agreed by UIT that the connection activity for Zone 4 & part of Zone 5 are to be taken up on priority so that the image of existing Sewerage project is uplifted which will facilitate the proposed project.

After discussions, following directions were issued by the District Collector:

- 1) UIT and PHED officials were directed to take up the ownership of the project and ensure regular inputs at this initial stage to facilitate the preparation of realistic DPR based on field conditions. Secretary UIT, and SE, RUIDP shall be nodal officials and will ensure that required inputs are provided at each stage from all the stakeholders.
- 2) It was directed that coordination meetings should be organized regularly (fortnightly) with RUIDP under chairmanship of District

Collector (preferably on Monday). SE, RUIDP, Sriganganagar & EE, UIT will ensure coordination needed from local administration and will appraise to the District Collector time to time.

- 3) Field inputs from MLA, Chairman Nagar Parishad, Chairman UIT will be taken on regular basis by RUIDP Consultants and officials.
- 4) To deliver the benefit of Sewerage System, Chairman Municipal Council will ensure support from ward members especially for sewerage connection activity.

MINUTES OF MEETING	
A meeting to discuss the draft Initial Environmental Examination (IEE) and Resettlement Plan (including the environmental management plan, anticipated environment and social impacts, mitigation of impacts, Grievance Redress Mechanism, ADB Framework, R&R Entitlement Matrix etc) with the expert of specific areas from PMDSC was held under the Chairmanship of the Superintending Engineer, PIU, Sri Ganganagar on 2nd Feb 2017. Later a visit to contractor's office was made and a presentation on Social Safeguard and Environment, Health and Safety was made to participants. The orientation meeting and presentation was attended by the participants as per the list enclosed at Annexure "A" and topics discussed and deliberated in the meeting are as below:-	
1) The project was broadly discussed in term of the work schedule, locations of the major units like Sewage Pumping Station and Water Treatment Plant, land status, alignment of Water lines and Sewer Lines to get the overall view in terms of the key specific areas such as social safeguard, environment, health and safety. 2) The procedures to be adopted for implementation of ADB policy pertaining to these specific areas were briefed by the experts. 3) It was emphasized that, the implementation of the project shall be performed in such a manner that there should be no inconvenience to the public, residential and commercial establishment. 4) Environment Management Plan (EMP) and Social Mitigation Plan (SMP) was discussed in detailed and briefing upon various activities (including but not limited to) following was provided:- a. Mitigation measures for environmental impact during implementation b. An environmental monitoring program and the responsible entities for mitigation, monitoring and reporting c. Public consultation and information disclosure d. Grievance redress mechanism 5) The emphasis was made on measures such as appropriate scheduling of works (non-monsoon season, low traffic hours, non peak business hours, etc.) and minimizing inconvenience by adopting best construction methods and smart engineering. 6) Noise, Sound, Air and vibration levels parameters (with reference to permissible limits) during works were discussed. Requirement of minimum access to residence and commercial establishment were discussed. It was agreed upon by the contractor that equipment and machinery as per permissible sound level will be provided and proper access to the permanent shops for their business activities will be provided. In addition to it, scheduling of work near sensitive receptors like temple, hospitals, school etc will be done to mitigate the impacts. 7) Discussions were also made on the Applicable Laws with respect to Safety and Health of the labours and it was informed by the contractor that due care for the health and safety will be taken and regular medical check-up (camps) will be organized for the staff and workers mobilized in field. It was also informed by the contractor that, along with First Aid Facilities, emergency vehicle shall be available at the site for any miss happening. Further provisions for gender based facilities (like toilet, bathing etc) will also be ensured at labour camps and work sites. Workers will be provided with clean fuel for cooking purposes. 8) Methodology and stipulation for updating of IEE and RP was also discussed with the contractor's team.	

- 9) Importance of information dissemination and roles and responsibilities of CAPC team & Contractor's outreach team was also discussed in detail.

In continuation to above, a joint site visit to the areas where the work of 3 DMA (near UIT office, model town) is proposed was conducted with the participants; the mitigation strategy was discussed on site with the officials of PIU and contractor's representative. The orientation program ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.

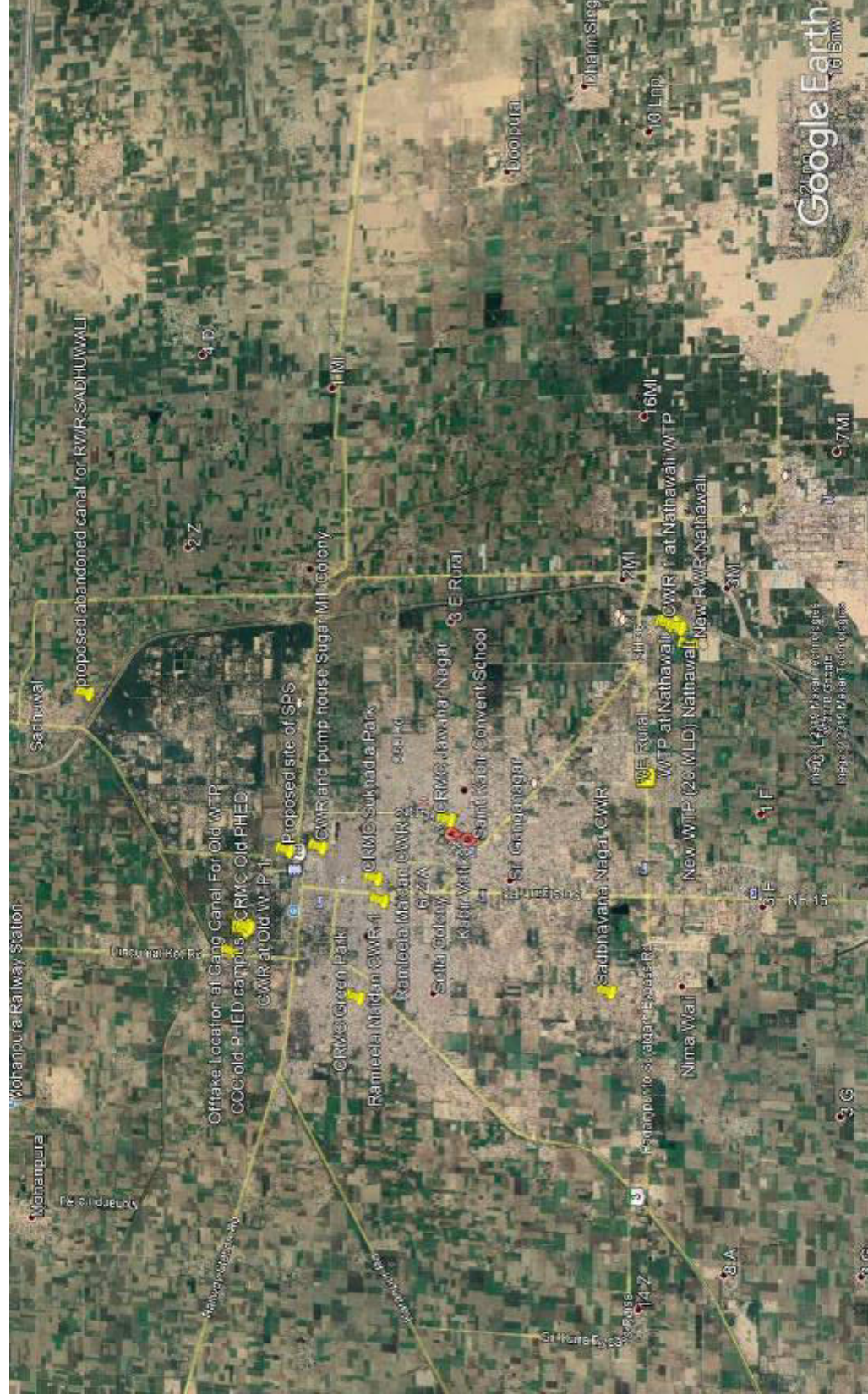

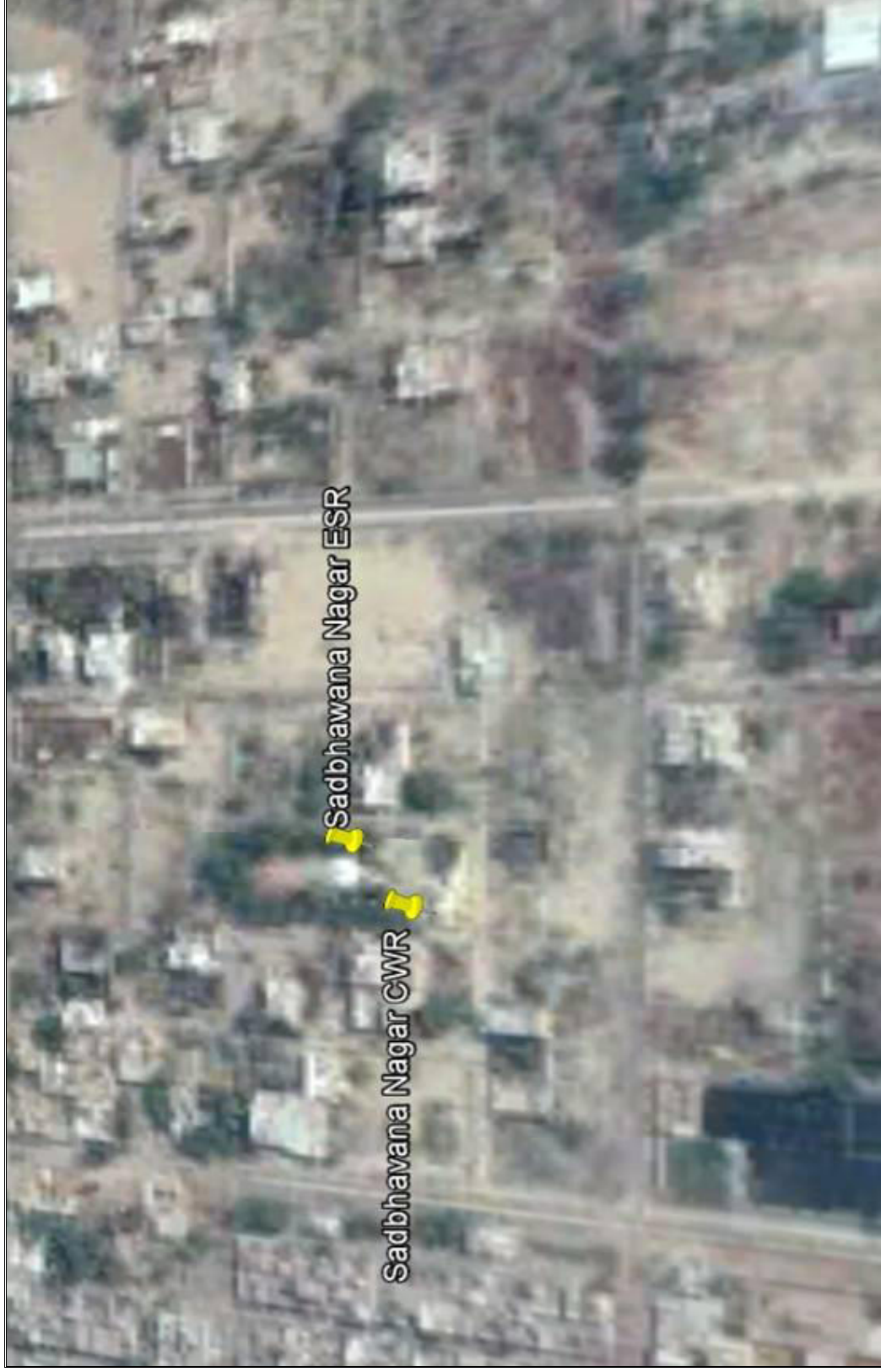

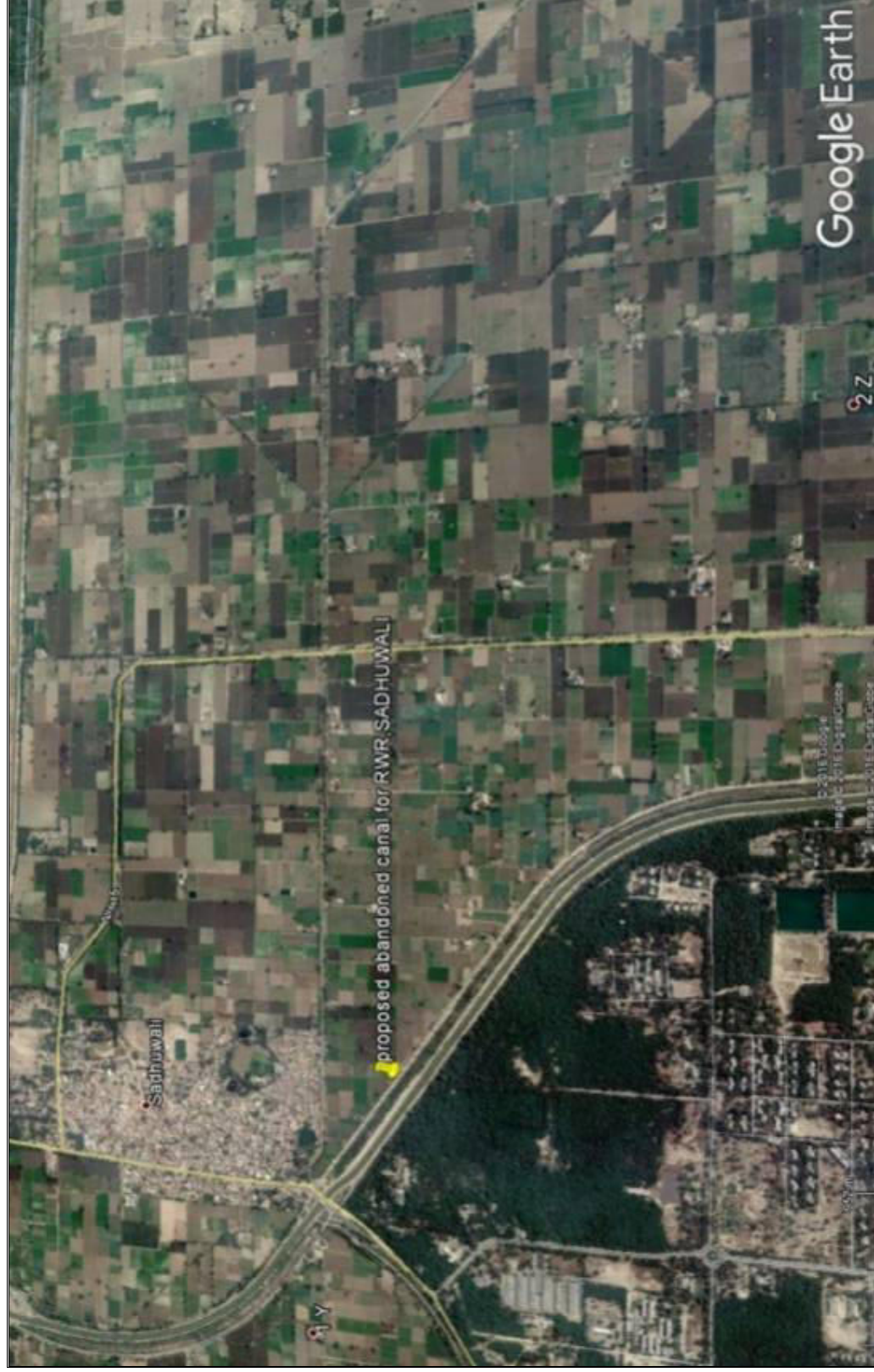
